



Wind Speeds



After low chances for showers and thunderstorms this morning behind a cold front, chances will ramp up through the afternoon with numerous storms (some severe) expected over the southern South Plains and southern Rolling Plains. Highs will only reach into the upper 60s and low 70s under mostly cloudy skies and breezy northeast winds.


Thunderstorms will increase in coverage today and tonight with a threat for severe weather mainly west of I-35. Very heavy rainfall may result in some flash flooding overnight across parts of North and Central Texas.



A Red Flag Warning has been issued for southern New Mexico. A Red Flag Warning means conditions are favorable for rapid fire spread. These conditions are expected Sunday around noon lasting through the early evening hours. Outdoor burning is NOT recommended!

Severe Thunderstorm Threat Late This Afternoon & Tonight Weather Forecast Office Austin/San Antonio


Greatest risk within the yellow and orange areas Issued May 4, 2024 4:17 AM CT

Today's Severe Weather Outlook











Timing:

After 3 PM CDT

What to Expect:

Storms are expected to develop along and ahead of a southward moving cold front and ahead of a dryline in far west Texas around mid afternoon. These storms will likely become severe very quickly with very large hail and tornadoes the most significant hazards. Through the evening, these storms will grow upscale into a large cluster that is expected to move east/southeast across the area and into Central Texas overnight.

Severe storm chances continue today, with large hail the main threat. However, a few strong tornadoes and damaging winds will also be possible. The potential for locally heavy rainfall will also be increasing.





Fire Danger Forecast




