Summary of the Upcoming Week

- **Excessive heat across OK, TX, AR and LA through Sunday and mainly over TX, S LA, SW OK, NM Monday and Tuesday.**
- **Marginal wildfire threat across NW TX through Saturday. Elevated threat for NW TX, SW OK Sunday into next week as temperatures rise.**
- **A few strong to severe storms across N OK, NW AR today; NE OK, AR Saturday and S AR, NE LA on Sunday.**
- **Hurricane Ernesto will stay in the Atlantic with no impacts to FEMA 6.**







Note: Even though the image displays 5 days of forecasted rainfall, river forecasts only include 1-2 days of rainfall






Tomorrow's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities





Purple	<p style="text-align: center;">Extreme</p> <p>Safety: Property Damage Unavoidable, Immediate Action to Save Life will be Needed Impact Potential: Typically Results in Long-Lived Widespread Major Disruption to Daily Life</p>	Severe: High Risk from SPC Flooding: Major flooding expected over a widespread area (including urban locations) Tropical: A Major Hurricane (Cat3 or greater) expected to move towards or near any coastline Fire: Large area of critical conditions for 2 or more days, Warnings for 3 or more days, Long term (months) of severe to extreme drought	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> A Category 4 hurricane is headed towards the SE LA; major storm surge, flooding and damaging winds anticipated to begin tomorrow Widespread severe storms expected, tornado outbreak probable with long-lived, very widespread and particularly intense storms


