
Seven-Day Graphical Tropical Weather Outlook





Wind Speeds









Sunny and Hot Today

Isolated storms forecast across the northern South and Rolling Plains

Compared to yesterday, coverage of rain and thunderstorms may not be as widespread... but all of the Panhandles have a 10-20% chance to see a shower or thunderstorm. Like the past two days, wind gusts up to 55 mph are possible along with lightning. This activity may begin as early as 4 PM, but most likely between 5 PM to 11 PM.

Temperatures will not be as hot as yesterday thanks to the winds turning to the southeast by this afternoon. Isolated thunderstorms are forecast to affect portions of the extreme southern Texas Panhandle, and the northern South and Rolling Plains, late this afternoon and early evening. The severe weather threat is low.

Isolated to widely scattered showers and thunderstorms may develop across portions of Central TX this afternoon and evening.




Gusty downburst winds and frequent lightning will be possible with the stronger storms.



Though not as hot as yesterday another warm and humid day is expected across North and Central Texas today with highs ranging from the mid 80s in the northeast to the mid 90s in the west. Isolated to widely scattered showers and thunderstorms may develop across Central Texas this afternoon and evening. The strongest storms will be capable of producing gusty downburst winds and frequent lightning. The main window storms will be between 4 PM and 9 PM.




Low chances of showers and storms

Issued Sep 15, 2024 2:30 AM CDT



Partly cloudy skies with above average high temperatures mainly in the 90s can be expected today. Areas of rain and isolated showers will continue over the Rio Grande and Winter Garden this morning. Isolated to widely scattered showers and thunderstorms are expected across portions the eastern Hill Country, the I-35 corridor mainly north of San Antonio, to near the Coastal Plains this afternoon into evening. In addition to cloud to ground lightning, a few storms could contain strong wind gusts in excess of 40 mph.

Hazardous Weather



Afternoon thunderstorms expected for portions of the area on Sunday. Much of the t-storm focus will be over the area mountains and west of the Rio Grande Valley. Locations like El Paso and Las Cruces have an isolated chance for storms. Otherwise, light winds and above normal temperatures.





Keetch-Byram Drought Index


