There is a marginal risk of severe storms Thursday afternoon and early evening across south central Oklahoma and parts of north Texas with the potential of quarter size hail and strong winds.




A storm system moving across the region on Thursday afternoon into Thursday evening will pose a severe thunderstorms and heavy rainfall threat.




There are increasing chances for all modes of severe weather on Thursday afternoon into Thursday night.




Here is our latest thinking regarding today's thunderstorm time line. A few storms may be severe, particularly this afternoon east of the I-35 corridor.






