- Marginal risk for excessive rainfall (level 1 of 4) leading to isolated flash flood potential across the Gulf Coast on Thursday and SE LA Friday.
- Minor river flooding will continue in EAR, SETX, W LA through the week.



5-Day Precipitation Forecast & River Flood Status


Note: Even though the image displays 5 days of forecasted rainfall, river forecasts only include 1-2 days of rainfall








Wintry mix across NTX, SE OK, AR, N LA leading to hazardous travel conditions.




Continued wintry mix/hazardous travel conditions across NTX, SE OK, AR, N LA.

Marginal risk for excessive rainfall (level 1 of 4) leading to isolated flash flood potential for SE LA.








