FEMA Region 6 Weather Threat Briefing

Friday, January 17, 2025

- Next round of arctic air pushes into FEMA 6 over the weekend into next week. Freezing temps reach the Gulf Coast and eventually south TX.
- Snowfall across N/E NM and the OK/TX Panhandles may produce travel impacts on Saturday and again on Monday. Monitoring for winter precipitation (snow/freezing rain) from South Central TX into LA late Monday into Tuesday
- Minor river flooding will continue this week in EAR, ETX, W LA.



5-Day Precipitation Forecast & River Flood Status


Note: Even though the image displays 5 days of forecasted rainfall, river forecasts only include 1-2 days of rainfall


Wind Advisory/high wind warning today for gusts of 45-50 MPH across E NM and W TX. Wind gusts in the warning area up to 65-75 mph.












"Day 8-14" Hazards Outlook




