## Freeze Warning | Cold Weather Advisory

In Effect Tonight into Early Monday Morning

A freeze warning is in effect for most of South Texas tonight into Tuesday morning. Several hours of below freezing temperatures are expected. In addition, a cold weather advisory is in effect for wind chill values below 25.

A Freeze Warning is in effect tonight into early tomorrow morning for portions of the Northern Ranchlands, where temperatures as low as 29 degrees are likely. A Cold Weather Advisory is in effect for portions of the Northern Ranchlands as well, as "feels like" temperatures will be in the low 20s.



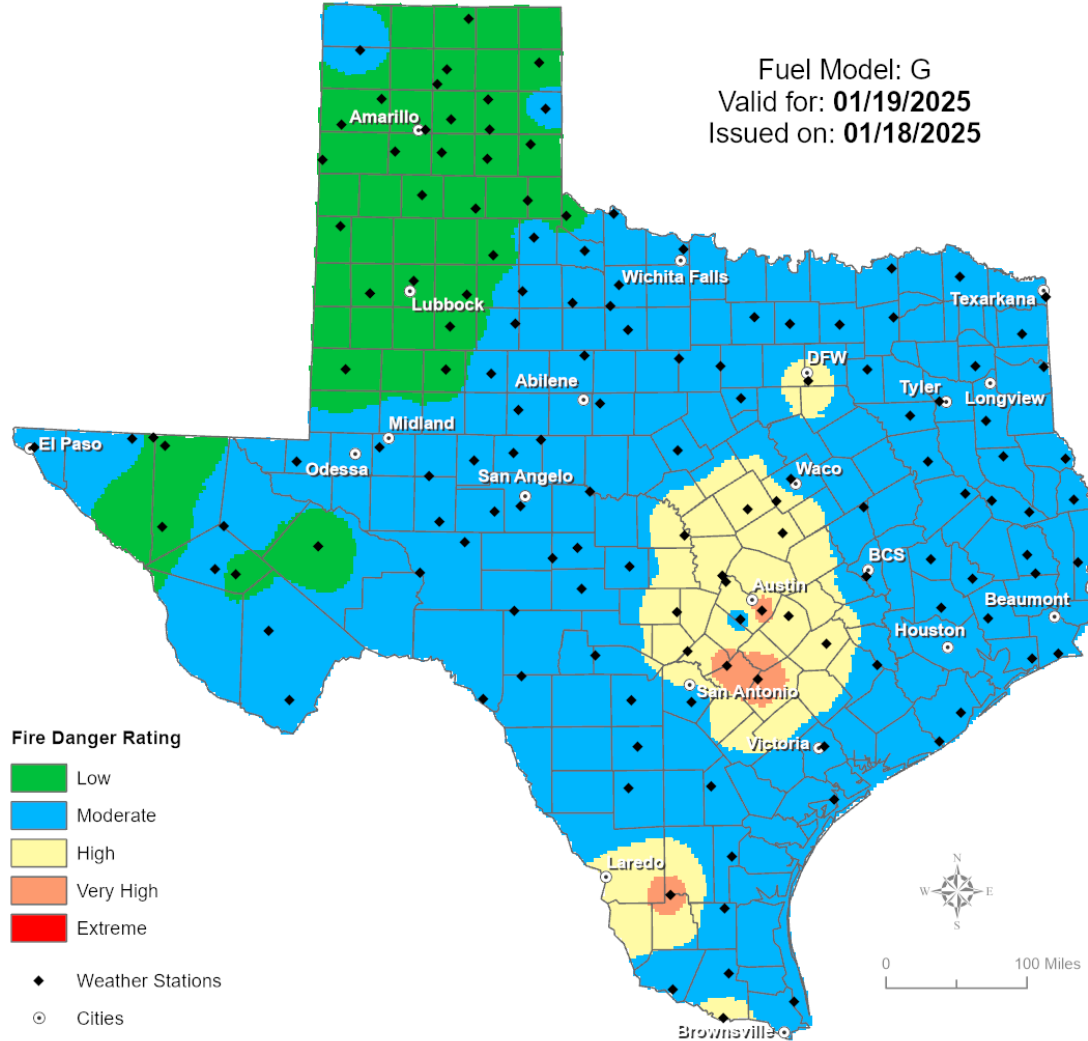

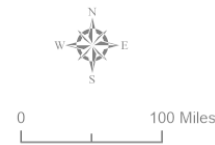

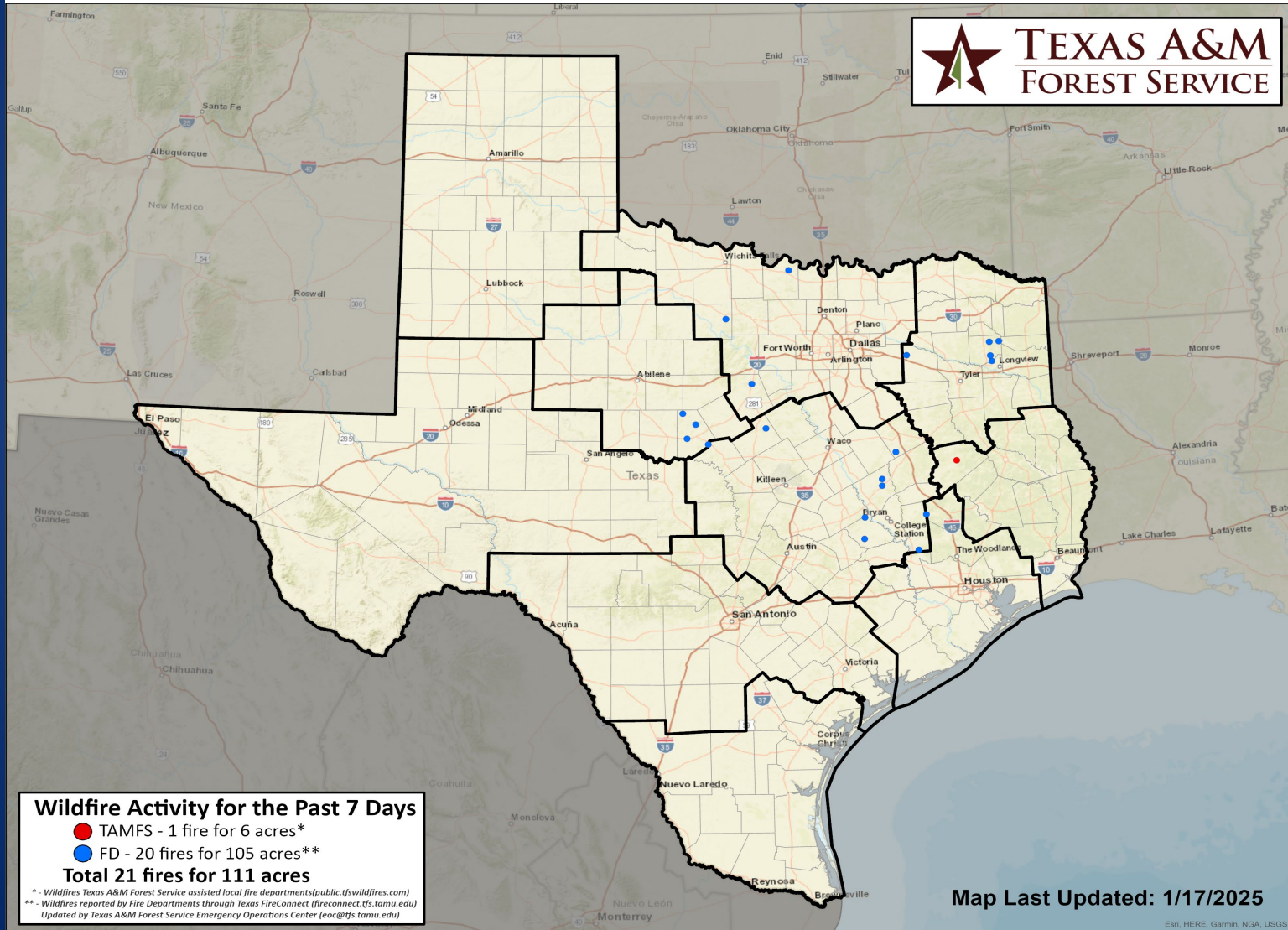
