An extreme cold warning is in effect for the northern Coastal Plain and Brush country, minimum wind chills of 10-15 degrees can be expected in the warning. A cold weather advisory is in effect for the remainder of South Texas with minimum wind chills of 15-25 degrees expected.

Cold weather will continue today, and many locations will remain below freezing throughout the day. High temperatures will be in the upper 20s to mid 30s, but portions of Central Texas will climb into the mid 30s. Temperatures will plummet again tonight, with overnight lows in the teens to mid 20s. Wind chills will be between 5 and 15 degrees. A Cold Weather Advisory will be in effect from 9 pm tonight to 10 am Friday. Protect the 4 Ps!



Key Messages

- **Extreme Cold Warning** is in effect until noon today.
- Winds will decrease today with NE winds of 5-10 mph.
- Wind chill values may return to below zero tonight.



Impacts

- Extended exposure to these conditions could cause frostbite and/or hypothermia.
- Prolonged period of cold temperatures may lead to frozen/burst pipes.

Despite diminishing wind speeds this morning, wind chill values remain as low as -10 to -15 degrees this morning. As temperatures warm, these values will increase to above zero today. The Extreme Cold Warning remains in effect until noon today and a few areas may see sub-zero wind chills again tonight.








Keetch-Byram Drought Index

Keetch-Byram Drought Index


