HAZARDOUS TRAVEL DUE TO SNOW COVERED ROADWAYS







Relative humidity will drop to 15 to 25 percent with west/southwest winds 10 to 15 mph. Occasional gusts will peak around 25 mph.



What to Expect

Strong winds, low humidity, and dry fuels will continue for much of next week, producing multiple days of near critical to critical fire weather conditions.

Wednesday & Friday look to be the most dangerous days, with at least moderate chances of humidity values below 20% combining with winds gusting over 40 mph.

Actions to take...

- Clear brush away from your home
- Don't drive on dry grass
- Avoid outdoor burning
- Don't throw cigarette butts out the window
- Make sure chains are not dragging from your car




