FEMA Region 6 Weather Threat Briefing

Tuesday, March 25, 2025

Disclaimer: The purpose of this briefing is to provide a <u>Regional</u> weather threat assessment and is meant as a general overview. County/Parish decision makers should consult their local NWS forecast offices for the latest detailed, local weather information.

- Marginal risk (level 1 of 5) of severe storms over NTX this afternoon and evening and over SOK overnight into early Wednesday morning. Marginal risk over SW/STX on Thursday.
- Slight risk (level 2 of 5) of severe storms over E OK, AR, N LA and NETX on Sunday.
- Marginal risk (level 1 of 4) of excessive rainfall over STX on Wednesday with a slight risk (level 2 of 4) of heavy rainfall over SE/STX on Thursday and SETX, SW LA on Friday.
- Increased wildfire threat over NM Wednesday and Thursday due to potential of dry thunderstorms.
- Elevated (level I of 3) fire weather threat over NM, WTX on Friday and NM, WTX, TX Panhandle on Saturday.
- Isolated minor river flooding in SETX continues to recede.



Note: Even though the image displays 5 days of forecasted rainfall, river forecasts only include 1-2 days of rainfall




Isolated minor river flooding in across SETX continues

Today's Weather




Today's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities















Marginal risk (level 1 of 4) of excessive rainfall over STX.

Increased wildfire threat over NM due to potential of dry thunderstorms.




Tomorrow's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities


Slight risk (level 2 of 4) for excessive rainfall over SE/STX




Slight risk (level 2 of 4) of heavy rainfall over SETX and SW LA



Monday's Weather




