A cold front will bring a chance of storms across the east and an elevated fire threat across the west this afternoon. Storm chances will be limited to areas generally along and east of I-35 and along/south of I-30, where a few severe storms with large hail and damaging winds will be possible through the evening. The tornado threat is low, but an isolated tornado can't be ruled out. There is still some uncertainty in how far west storms will develop. Ensure you monitor the weather, especially if you have any outdoor plans.



An Enhanced Risk for severe thunderstorms is in place today and tonight for all of Southwest Arkansas, and portions of Northeast Texas and North Louisiana. A brief severe threat will exist this morning mainly across portions of East Texas and Western Louisiana, with the primary severe threat expected over much of the region late this afternoon through tonight. Large hail, damaging winds, and isolated tornadoes are all possible.



IF Storms Develop, they could become Strong to Severe

Key Messages

- There is *conditional* severe weather potential for today:
 - ◆ Storms will struggle to develop, but if they do then they could become strong to severe.
- Main timeframe for severe weather will be in the afternoon through the evening.
- **Slight Risk (level 2 of 5)** for portions of Houston/Trinity Counties.
- **Marginal Risk (level 1 of 5)** for locations generally north of Conroe.


Potential Impacts




