STATEWIDE CURRENT SITUATION: On March 31, Governor Abbott <u>directed</u> the Texas Division of Emergency Management (TDEM) to request that Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) officials join state and local partners in conducting joint preliminary damage assessments in South Texas communities impacted by recent flooding. These assessments will help determine whether Texas meets the federal threshold for disaster assistance.

On March 29, Governor Greg Abbott <u>issued</u> a disaster declaration for four South Texas counties impacted by rainfall and flooding that continues to affect homes, businesses, and the agricultural industry throughout the region. The counties included in the Governor's declaration are Cameron, Hidalgo, Starr, and Willacy. Additional counties may be added as conditions warrant.

On March 26, Governor Greg Abbott directed the Texas Division of Emergency Management (TDEM) to <u>activate state emergency response</u> resources ahead of increased threats of severe weather and flash flooding in large areas of the state through the weekend.

OPERATIONAL PRIORITIES:

- 1. Protect life and property.
- 2. Support rapid & effective response.
- 3. Collect and disseminate accurate incident information to improve decision-making.
- 4. Accurately track incident costs associated with assigned resources for cost recovery.

RESPONDING STATE AGENCIES/ORGANIZATIONS REPORTS

Texas Emergency Medical Task Force (EMTF): As of April 17, SWX PKG Teams have had 328 encounters, treated 270 individuals, and have had 196 transports.

Volunteer Organizations Active in Disasters (VOAD):

American Red Cross (ARC): The American Red Cross continues to have resources on standby to respond to humanitarian needs arising from expected severe weather and other disasters in Texas. Food and Disaster Emergency Services (DES) distribution operations are ongoing in Cameron, Pharr, and Hidalgo Counties. Additionally, the ARC has initiated client casework and is distributing Immediate Assistance to those affected. The ARC is currently operating two shelters in Bowie and Cameron Counties, providing shelter for six individuals.

Texans On Mission (TXM): In response to extensive rains and flooding in the Rio Grande Valley, TXM deployed to First Baptist Church in Weslaco. The Mennonite Disaster Relief team began assistance efforts in Cameron County on April 11. Additionally, First Baptist Church Weslaco organized a volunteer team. To date, 449 work orders have been processed, with 236 still pending. TXM has conducted 127 Assessments, completed 9 Tear Out, provided 166 Volunteer Showers, and processed 111 Loads of Laundry for volunteers.
