- Slight to Enhanced risk (levels 2-3 of 5) for severe storms in E OK, NETX, AR, NW LA today. Medium tornado chances this afternoon in NAR. Marginal risk (level 1 of 5) for severe storms in C OK, SW-N TX Tuesday.
- Slight (level 2 of 4) risk of Flash Flooding for E OK, NW AR, NTX today; Marginal (level 1 of 4) risk on Tuesday for C OK, N-S C TX. Heavy rain chances continue Wed-Fri for the lower MS valley, OK/TX.
- Monitoring for elevated (level 1 of 3) fire weather concerns across NE NM and the OK/TX Panhandle tomorrow afternoon. Elevated (level 1 of 3) fire weather concerns resume Wed-Thu for S NM, W TX.
- Moderate to isolated major river flooding over AR through the next 7 days with isolated major flooding in SE LA by Thursday, April 24. Moderate river flooding in E OK through Tuesday.



Note: Even though the image displays 5 days of forecasted rainfall, river forecasts only include 1-2 days of rainfall



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


Today's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities

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

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



Tomorrow's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities













Porecast Rainfall




