FEMA Region 6 Weather Threat Briefing

Wednesday, April 30, 2025

Disclaimer: The purpose of this briefing is to provide a <u>Regional</u> weather threat assessment and is meant as a general overview. County/Parish decision makers should consult their local NWS forecast offices for the latest detailed, local weather information.

- <u>Severe Weather</u>: Today, slight to enhanced risk (levels 2-3 of 5) over SE OK, W AR, N TX, NW LA. A few tornadoes and large hail in the Enhanced risk area this afternoon as the main threat. Tomorrow, slight risk (level 2 of 5) for SE AR, S/E TX, N LA. Friday, marginal (level 1 of 5) risk for S OK, C TX.
- <u>Flash Flooding</u>: Today, slight to moderate risk (levels 2-3 of 4) over E OK, AR, N/NETX, NW LA. Tomorrow, marginal risk (level I of 4) E AR, N LA, SETX. Friday, slight risk (level 2 of 4) for S/C TX. Marginal risk (level I of 4) for heavy rain continues across the Southern Plains Saturday and Sunday.
- <u>Fire Weather</u>: Today, elevated risk (level 1 of 3) over S NM and far W TX. Elevated (level 1 of 3) fire weather concerns for SW NM Friday through Sunday.
- River Flooding: Moderate to isolated Major flooding across OK and NTX through Friday/Saturday.
 Through May 7th, isolated major flooding in SE LA.



Note: Numerical levels (e.g. level 1 of 4) will not be assigned to riverine flooding due to the varying levels of impacts across flood categories.

- In Wichita Falls, extensive flooding occurs in Harrell and Lucy Parks. Flooding occurs in homes north of Third Street, in Tanglewood Hollow, and in Scotland Park through Saturday.
- Isolated Major Flooding in SE LA through May 7th. Baton Rouge and the main LSU campus are protected by levees at this forecast level.
- Moderate to major river flooding across OK/NTX through Friday will impact croplands and secondary roads.



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






Flood Watch for OK/TX and NW AR through Thursday morning.

Severe thunderstorm watch across OK,TX through 8 AM CT today.





Tomorrow's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities









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


