- <u>Severe Weather</u>: Today, slight risk (level 2 of 5) across E/SE NM. Slight risk (level 2 of 5) in SW/W **TX Monday and over Cntrl/SETX on Tuesday.**
- Flash Flooding: Today, slight risk (level 2 of 4) across E NM. Slight risk (level 2 of 4) Monday in NW TX. Slight to moderate risk (levels 2-3 of 4) Tuesday over OK, TX, LA and AR. Slight risk (level 2 of 4) over SETX and S LA on Wednesday.
- Fire Weather: Elevated to critical (levels 1-2) of 3 over SW NM today and elevated (level 1 of 3) over WTX on Monday.
- <u>River Flooding</u>: Moderate to isolated major flooding across OK and NTX through Wednesday. Isolated major flooding in SE LA through Wednesday.



Moderate to major river flooding across S/E OK, NTX through mid-week will impact croplands and secondary roads.


Note: Numerical levels (e.g. level 1 of 4) will not be assigned to riverine flooding due to the varying levels of impacts across flood categories.




Today's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities














Tomorrow's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities









Porecast Rainfall




