- Record breaking heat likely with temperatures exceeding 100 degrees for sections of TX Tue-Sat, with Wednesday forecast to be the hottest day of the week. Heat concerns may extend through next weekend in S/SWTX.
- Elevated to critical (levels I-2 of 3) fire weather concerns in SW NM tomorrow. Elevated to critical (levels I-2 of 3) fire weather conditions on Tuesday afternoon for S NM, Far W TX; and again for S NM, Far W TX Wednesday afternoon.
- Marginal risk (level I of 4) of flash flooding in EAR this afternoon/evening, and again tomorrow.
- Minor/moderate river flooding in LA, AR and ETX will continue through next week. Isolated major flooding in **S LA** through Tuesday.

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


Calcasieu River at White Oak Park in SW LA will experience major flooding through early **Tuesday morning; homes will be** flooded.

Minor to moderate river flooding across AR, N/NETX, and S LA will impact croplands and secondary roads.

Note: Numerical levels (e.g. level 1 of 4) will not be assigned to riverine flooding due to the varying levels of impacts across flood categories.






Today's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities









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


Tomorrow's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities

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

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








