- Record breaking heat likely with temperatures exceeding 100 degrees for sections of TX Tue-Sun, with Wednesday forecast to be the hottest day of the week.
- Elevated to critical (levels I-2 of 3) fire weather concerns in S/W NM today. Elevated to critical (levels I-2 of 3) fire weather conditions tomorrow afternoon for S NM, Far W TX; and again for **S NM**, Far W TX Wednesday & Thursday afternoons.
- Slight risk (level 2 of 5) for severe storms in NEAR Thursday and Friday.
- Marginal risk (level I of 4) of flash flooding in N/E AR this afternoon/evening. Heavy rain returns to **AR on Friday.**
- Minor/moderate river flooding in LA, AR and ETX will continue through the week. Isolated major flooding in S LA through early tomorrow morning.

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


Calcasieu River at White Oak Park in SW LA will experience major flooding through early tomorrow morning; homes will be flooded.

Minor to moderate river flooding across AR, N/NETX, and S LA will impact croplands and secondary roads.

Note: Numerical levels (e.g. level 1 of 4) will not be assigned to riverine flooding due to the varying levels of impacts across flood categories.

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




Today's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities







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
Red Flag Warning for S/W NM from 2-7 PM **CDT** today.

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
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Temperatures exceeding 100 degrees in C/SWTX.

Tomorrow's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities



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
Temperatures between 105-110 in SWTX. Record breaking heat.

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Temperatures between 105-110 in SWTX.



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





Forecast Rainfall




