# FEMA Region 6 Weather Threat Briefing

Wednesday, May 21, 2025

**Disclaimer:** The purpose of this briefing is to provide a <u>Regional</u> weather threat assessment and is meant as a general overview. County/Parish decision makers should consult their local NWS forecast offices for the latest detailed, local weather information.

- <u>Severe Storms:</u> Slight risk (level 2 of 5) over NE OK, NAR today. Marginal risk (level 1 of 5) S/C OK, SW AR, and NTX tomorrow, and N/E OK, NW AR Friday.
- Flash Flooding: Marginal risk (level 1 of 4) across STX today. Marginal to slight risks (levels 1-2 of 4) for flash flooding across NE OK, NAR Friday and Saturday. Slight risk (level 2 of 4) for flash flooding across E OK, AR, NETX, NW LA Sunday. Monitoring for heavy rainfall C/ETX, N LA on Memorial Day.
- Major heat continues across SW Texas today, with heat index values of 105-110 degrees. Heat index values between 105-110 degrees return Saturday-Monday in STX.
- Elevated (level I of 3) fire weather concerns for W NM on Friday afternoon.
- Isolated moderate river flooding in far E OK through early tomorrow morning. Minor river flooding in AR, ETX, and LA through the week.





Minor river flooding across AR, ETX, and LA will impact croplands and secondary roads.


Isolated moderate river flooding across E OK through early tomorrow morning. Croplands and secondary roads will be flooded.



Marginal risk (level 1 of 5) for severe storms in S/C OK, SW AR, NTX.




#### Tomorrow's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities


Marginal risk (level 1 of 4) for flash flooding in NE OK, NW AR.





Purple	Extreme Safety: Property Damage Unavoidable, Immediate Action to Save Life will be Needed Impact Potential: Typically Results in Long-Lived Widespread Major Disruption to Daily Life	Severe: High Risk from SPC Flooding: Major flooding expected over a widespread area (including urban locations) Tropical: A Major Hurricane (Cat3 or greater) expected to move towards or near any coastline Fire: Large area of critical conditions for 2 or more days, Warnings for 3 or more days, Long term (months) of severe to extreme drought	<ul> <li>A Category 4 hurricane is headed towards the SE LA; major storm surge, flooding and damaging winds anticipated to begin tomorrow</li> <li>Widespread severe storms expected, tornado outbreak probable with long- lived, very widespread and particularly intense storms</li> </ul>
