FEMA Region 6 Weather Threat Briefing

Saturday, May 24, 2025

Disclaimer: The purpose of this briefing is to provide a <u>Regional</u> weather threat assessment and is meant as a general overview. County/Parish decision makers should consult their local NWS forecast offices for the latest detailed, local weather information.

- Severe Storms: Slight risk (level 2 of 5) for portions of TX, OK, and AR today through Monday.
- Flash Flooding: Moderate risk (level 3 of 4) Sunday over NE OK, NW AR. Slight risk (level 2 of 4) across portions of OK, TX, AR, N LA from today through Monday. Marginal risk (level 1 of 4) across portions of TX, AR, and LA continues through at least midweek.
- Heat index values between 105-110 degrees in STX through Monday.
- Elevated (level I of 3) fire weather conditions across NM and Far WTX this weekend.
- Minor river flooding in AR, ETX, and LA continues into next week. Additional rainfall over the next several days may cause additional minor to moderate river flooding.





Minor river flooding in AR, ETX, and LA continues through next week. Croplands and secondary roads will be flooded.


Additional rainfall over the next several days may cause additional minor to moderate river flooding in E OK, AR, NETX, LA.





Tomorrow's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities








