
Severe Storm Potential This Weekend

Key Messages

- Storm coverage will be limited today.
- Hail and wind will be the main threats, but storms may be capable of producing tornadoes.
- Localized flooding is a concern Sunday afternoon into Monday morning. There is a 5-15% chance of flash flooding in the central to eastern Panhandles.
- Have ways to monitor changing weather conditions through the holiday weekend!


Chances for severe storms continue through the weekend, especially across the southeast Texas Panhandle. All hazards could be in play, with hail and wind being the primary threats. We will also keep an eye on the heavy rain and flooding potential for areas that receive multiple rounds Sun into Mon.

Storms are expected to develop late this afternoon near the I-27 corridor and track east through the late evening. Primary hazards with storms will be damaging wind gusts to 70 mph and large golf ball size hail. Although unlikely, an isolated tornado cannot be ruled out.

Severe storms will be possible again on Saturday afternoon into the overnight hours. Large hail, damaging winds, and a low tornado risk are all expected.






