- Severe Storms: Slight to enhanced risk (levels 2-3 of 5) for portions of TX, OK, and AR today and Slight risk Monday in W/NTX. Marginal risk (level 1 of 5) Tuesday in W/C/SE/ETX, SAR, LA.
- Flash Flooding: Moderate risk (level 3 of 4) today over E OK, NW AR. Slight risk (level 2 of 4) across portions of OK, TX, AR, N LA from today through Monday. Marginal risk (level 1 of 4) across portions of TX, SAR, and LA through at least Thursday.
- Heat index values between 105-110 degrees in STX through Monday.
- Elevated (level 1 of 3) fire weather conditions across NM and Far WTX today.
- Minor river flooding in AR, ETX, and LA continues this week. Minor with isolated moderate flooding forecast today through Tuesday in E OK.Additional rainfall may cause additional minor to moderate river flooding.





Minor river flooding in AR, ETX, and LA continues through next week. **Croplands and secondary roads will** be flooded.


Minor with isolated moderate river flooding forecast to start today in E **OK and last through Tuesday. Impacts** to secondary roads and agriculture.

Additional rainfall over the next several days may cause additional minor to moderate river flooding in AR, NETX, LA.

> Note: Numerical levels (e.g. level 1 of 4) will not be assigned to riverine flooding due to the varying levels of impacts across flood categories.

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Slight to Moderate risk (levels 2-3 of 4) for flash flooding across OK, N/W AR, E-Panhandle/N TX.



Today's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities






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Severe Thunderstorm Watch in N OK, NW AR through 7 AM CDT.

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

Tomorrow's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities



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






