
Confidence in storm coverage and intensity has increased for the southeast Panhandle this afternoon and evening, where all hazards of severe weather will be in play (primarily damaging winds and hail). Storms are expected to develop across the south and central Panhandles in the afternoon, spreading north and eastward through the evening.



Hot and humid conditions are expected Sunday with isolated storms mainly in far North Texas and East TX. Heat index values may be above 100° during the afternoon. Tonight, thunderstorms will move in from the northwest, posing a threat for mainly damaging winds and large hail. Make sure you have multiple ways of receiving severe weather alerts, especially at night!








Severe storms will be possible Sunday afternoon into the overnight hours across parts of Oklahoma and western north Texas. Large hail and damaging winds are the main hazards.





Fire Danger Forecast





Keetch-Byram Drought Index


