# FEMA Region 6 Weather Threat Briefing

Tuesday, May 27, 2025

**Disclaimer:** The purpose of this briefing is to provide a <u>Regional</u> weather threat assessment and is meant as a general overview. County/Parish decision makers should consult their local NWS forecast offices for the latest detailed, local weather information.

- <u>Severe Storms:</u> Slight risk (level 2 of 5) today in SE NM, SW TX, E LA; and E NM, Far W TX tomorrow. Marginal risk (level 1 of 5) for severe storms in E NM, W/SE TX, S LA Friday.
- Flash Flooding: Slight risk (level 2 of 4) across SWTX, E LA today. Heavy rainfall continues across the Southern Plains, and LA through Thursday.
- Fire Weather: Dry T-Storm potential in W/C NM tomorrow afternoon.
- Minor river flooding in AR, ETX, and LA continues this week. Minor with isolated moderate flooding forecast today through Wednesday in E OK. Additional rainfall may cause additional minor to moderate river flooding.








#### 5-Day Precipitation Forecast & River Flood Status

Note: Even though the image displays 5 days of forecasted rainfall, river forecasts only include 1-2 days of rainfall





Minor with isolated moderate river is expected in SE OK through tomorrow afternoon. Impacts to secondary roads and agriculture.


Additional rainfall over the next few days may cause additional minor to moderate river flooding in AR, NE TX, LA.





#### Tomorrow's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities






