



Copious amounts of moisture remain across the panhandles today that will allow rain showers and thunderstorms to produce heavy rainfall. The chances for heavy rainfall are highest in the western panhandles today with low chances for the central and eastern panhandles. Previous rainfall will allow already soaked areas to flood easier.







Keetch-Byram Drought Index



Report of 346 (+1) fires and 85,060 (no change) acres have been burned this year. There are 70 (no change) counties with burn bans. The Keetch–Byram Drought Index list contains 35 (+3) counties with an average over 400.
