STATEWIDE CURRENT SITUATION:

On July 6, Governor Abbott announced that President Donald J. Trump approved federal disaster assistance as part of a Major Disaster Declaration, following deadly and destructive flooding that impacted Texas this past week

The Governor directed the Texas Division of Emergency Management (TDEM) to formally request that FEMA officials join state and local partners in conducting joint preliminary damage assessments in Kerr County.

Officials continue to review disaster damage information self-reported by Texans through TDEM's Individual State of Texas Assessment Tool (iSTAT) damage survey. When it is safe to do so, impacted Texans are encouraged to submit information about damage to homes or businesses by visiting damage.tdem.texas.gov.

On July 5, Governor Greg Abbott held a press conference with the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS) Secretary Kristi Noem to provide an update on the ongoing response to severe flooding impacting the Texas Hill Country. The Governor also expanded the number of counties included in his disaster declaration and requested a federal disaster declaration. Governor Abbott expanded the number of counties included in his disaster declaration and requested a federal disaster declaration.

On July 4, Governor Abbott provided an update during a press conference at the Hill Country Youth Event Center on Texas' response to severe flooding impacting Kerr County and surrounding communities.

On July 3, TDEM [increased](#) the readiness level of the Texas State Emergency Operations Center (SOC) to Level II (Escalated Response) and activated additional state emergency response resources as portions of West and Central Texas prepared for continued heavy rainfall and flash flooding threats heading into the holiday weekend.

On July 2, TDEM [activated](#) state emergency response resources in anticipation of increased threats of flooding in parts of West and Central Texas heading into the holiday weekend.

OPERATIONAL PRIORITIES:

1. Protect life and property.
2. Support rapid & effective response.
3. Collect and disseminate accurate incident information to improve decision-making.
4. Accurately track incident costs associated with assigned resources for cost recovery.

Region 6 (Includes DDs 17, 18, and 24)

DD 18 – New Braunfels (Includes Atascosa, Bandera, Bexar, Comal, Frio, Gillespie, Guadalupe, Karnes, Kendall, Kerr, McMullen, Medina, and Wilson Counties):

Comal County:

In Comal County evacuations were conducted along river road, below the Canyon Lake Dam. Heavy rains forced evacuations along the lower-lying homes of the Guadalupe River, but residents have been allowed to return home.

Guadalupe County:

In Guadalupe County, eight inches of rain fell early in the morning on July 5th. The rain caused flooding along the roadways and eight vehicles were flooded requiring water rescues.

Kendall County:

[Individual State of Texas Assessment Tool \(iSTAT\) surveys have been completed in Kendall County.](#)

Kerr County:

A family reunification center is located at Trinity Baptist Church on 800 Jackson Road in Kerrville. The American Red Cross has a shelter located at Calvary Baptist Church on 113 Methodist Encampment Road in Kerrville and a medical is located at Kerrville First United Methodist Church on 321 Thompson Drive in Kerrville.

40 Incident Support Task Force (ISTF) personnel are conducting damage assessments in Kerr County. The Volunteer Reception Center has been established and is located at Salvation Army Shelter on 855 Hays Street in Kerrville.

Region 8 (Includes DDs 11, 12, 13, and 23)

DD 11 – Waco (Includes Bosque, Falls, Freestone, Hill, Limestone, and McLennan Counties):

On July 6, DDEOC 11 activated to Level III.

DD 12 – Austin (Includes Bastrop, Blanco, Burnet, Caldwell, Fayette, Hays, Lee, Llano, Travis, and Williamson Counties):

On July 5, DDEOC 12 activated to Level III.

Near historic rainfall impacted Travis, Burnet, and Williamson Counties during the night and first responders conducted dozens of water rescues.

Burnet County:

Crews from Travis County extended their response into Burnet County, where they coordinated with local responders, Texas Parks and Wildlife Department, Texas Task Force, and Texas Department of Public Safety boats to rescue dozens of people in Burnet, Marble Falls, and other areas of the county.

Texas Task Force 2 (TTF2) is assisting with an area wide search in Burnet County on July 7th.

Travis County:

Rainfall started in Travis County with water rescues reported early in the morning hours. Emergency Services Districts (ESDs) and Austin units managed the rescues. The city of Austin requested boat squads at approximately 3:00 AM due to neighborhoods being impacted by fast moving water. Travis County aviation assets worked directly with the SOC to dispatch local and state aircraft to assist TX-TF throughout the day.

Travis County requested a wide area search team to assist with recovery in a neighborhood where fatalities were reported. A Texas Task Force 2 (TX-TF 2) Type 3 team located in Llano was moved to Travis County to meet this need.

Williamson County:

Flooding in Williamson County started in the Leander area, moved to Liberty Hill and to surrounding cities and communities. An apartment complex was evacuated along the San Gabriel River near downtown Georgetown due to rising waters. Numerous roads are closed in Williamson County due to damage from flooding and water on the roadways, with one railroad bridge destroyed. Several RV parks have been evacuated ahead of rising waters, and some evacuations were conducted with boats.

Texas Intrastate Fire Mutual Aid System (TIFMAS), Emergency Medical Task Force (EMTF), and Texas Division of Emergency Management will begin conducting Individual State of Texas Assessment Tool/ Public State of Texas Assessment Tool (iSTAT/pSTAT) surveys in Williamson County.

DD 13 – Bryan (Includes Brazos, Burleson, Grimes, Leon, Madison, Robertson, and Washington Counties):
On July 6, DDEOC 13 returned to Level IV.

DD 23 – Killeen (Includes Bell, Coryell, Hamilton, Lampasas, Milam, Mills, and San Saba Counties):
On July 4, DDEOC 23 activated to Level III.

Hamilton County:
Hamilton County Sheriff requested assistance from the Oklahoma Task Force Boat Squad for a missing female on the Leon River.

San Saba County:
San Saba County continues to experience flooding due to the previous heavy rainfall. The San Saba Civic Center shelter has been closed.

RESPONDING STATE AGENCIES/ORGANIZATIONS REPORTS

Texas Division of Emergency Management (TDEM):

Communications Coordination Group (CCG):

The Communications Coordination Group (CCG) and its partners are actively monitoring the situation and preparing resources for potential response. Public, private, and volunteer sectors are assessing and adjusting their resources as needed. The Commission on State Emergency Communications (CSEC) has contacted 9-1-1 centers in affected areas, confirming no current issues with 9-1-1 systems and coordinating requests for dispatch personnel.

Cellular providers are taking proactive measures: AT&T FirstNet has deployed a Cell on Wheels (COW) to San Saba and Kerrville, while Sprint-T-Mobile has two COWs on standby, and Verizon has SATCOLTs staged in Plano. Cellular providers have also offered cellphones, charging stations, and accessories for reunification centers and have implemented refueling/backup power operations. While some cell tower repairs are underway, overlapping coverage prevents major outage issues.

The Texas Department of Public Safety's Office of the Statewide Interoperable Communications (SWIC) is identifying available COMLs (Communications Unit Leaders) for potential support. Amateur Radio services have activated local nets,

providing backup emergency communication and localized reports. Federal partners are monitoring and ready to assist upon request. Finally, the Texas Telecommunicator Emergency Response Taskforce (TXTERT) is monitoring the situation and rostering personnel to support dispatch centers if required.

Incident Support Task Force (ISTF):

ISTF members have been deployed to TDEM Region 5. ISTF Regional Volunteer Agency Liaison (VAL) team is supporting community response and identifying key recovery needs, such as food access, debris removal, and muck-outs. There have been 1,300 requests for Volunteer Organizations Active in Disasters (VOAD) cleanup assistance have been submitted through iSTAT.

On July 5, five ISTF members deployed to the Kerrville area. ISTF has members rostered and pending a second wave deployment.

Mass Care:

Shelters and reunifications centers have started being set up today. There will not be an official count of shelter activities until tomorrow morning. VOADs are reaching out to support feeding and are on standby for supplies and clean up. Feeding Operations continue to scale with anticipated needs. There are currently 10 feeding sites, fixed and mobile, that has served a total of 8,850 meals as of July 4.

There are three feeding sites, fixed and mobile, that have served a total of 1650 meals, 19 shelter sites are open with a population of 235, and 12 buses being utilized for transporting rescues.

Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service (AgriLife):

AgriLife Disaster Assessment and Recovery (DAR) Unit is monitoring the flooding in Tom Green, Kerr, Bandera, Coke, Comal, Concho, Gillespie, Kendall, Kimble, Llano, Mason, McCulloch, Menard, Reeves, and San Saba Counties. AgriLife DAR Agents have disseminated weather information and have been in contact with officials in the affected counties. AgriLife has a SOC Liaison at the SOC. A DAR Area Chief has reported to the Incident Management Team (IMT) for assistance and another DAR Area Chief is assisting Red Cross in the city of San Saba. DAR PIO has been sharing weather safety information via social media channels and is working with other state agency partners with message delivery.

The Gillespie County AgriLife office is being used by Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD) for staging. AgriLife currently has two DAR agents assisting a Type 3 Vet Team in Kerr County. Evacuees from the Tom Green County flood that were at the AgriLife Extension & Research facility have been relocated to a nearby church.

[Texas A&M AgriLife Extension has sent 20 DAR Agents and County Extension Agents to support damage assessment efforts in Kerr County.](#)

Texas A&M Engineering Extension Service Public Works Response Team (PWRT):

On July 5, PWRT was requested to send a team to Kerrville. The PWRT team arrived at the Kerrville IMT with plans to assist at the Surface Water Treatment Plant tomorrow.

PWRT members have arrived in Kerrville. This assessment of the Surface Water Treatment Plant found the raw water intake is out, chemical storage and equipment is destroyed, the disinfection process is out of service, and the security fence is destroyed. An additional PWRT team deployed to Kerrville on July 6 to begin lift assist operations.

Texas A&M Engineering Extension Service Texas Task Force 1 (TEEX/TX-TF1):

TEEX activated seven Texas A&M Task Force 1 Type 3 Swiftwater/Flood Rescue Teams consisting of six personnel and two inflatable rescue boats each. A Water Group Supervisor (WGS) Package with two personnel coordinates the TX-TF1 SAR response to assist with any search and rescue incidents related to the forecasted potential severe weather and flooding forecasted within the State. Five of the teams and the WGS were prepositioned on July 3.

On July 5, TX-TF1 began operations in Burnet and Western Travis Counties. TX-TF1 and TX-TF2 have continued operations in Regions 6 and 8, conducting search and rescue operations and evacuations. TX-TF1 Water Squads and Water Group Supervisors have also pivoted resources to Comal and Guadalupe Counties due to heavy rainfall in the area. TX-TF1 & TX-TF2 have conducted a total of 312 evacuations, 43 rescues, and 40 calls of assistance from other first responders.

On July 6, Urban Search and Rescue (USAR), Oklahoma Task Force 1 & 2 (OK-TF1 & OK-TF2) and Louisiana Task Force 1 (LA-TF1) arrived at the SOC. Swift Water Rescue Boat Squads from Florida and Virginia, and a Canine Mission Ready Package from Tennessee are enroute. TX-TF1, TX-TF2, and TX-TF3 have continued to be engaged in mission assignments throughout Texas. Water Squad Dallas, Washington County, OK-TF1, and OK-TF2 repositioned to TDEM Region 2. As of July 6, there were 132 evacuations, 54 rescues, and 40 calls for assistance from first responder agencies.

Texas A&M Forest Service (TAMFS):

TAMFS has activated four All-Hazard Strike Team, seven Saw Teams and two mobile command posts. There are two Liaison Officers (LNO's) at SOC, one LNO and one Staging Area Manager (STAM) with the Incident Management Team (IMT). TAMFS has sent six personnel to assist with logistics and coordination in Disaster District Emergency Operations (DDEOC) 10. The TAMFS Taskforce from Alice is transporting a Bearcat from Laredo to Kerrville. Two Saw Teams are engaged in Kerrville and five are

enroute. An additional seven Saw Teams have been rostered and will arrive in Kerrville on July 6.

Department of Information Resources (DIR):

DIR is monitoring the situation using cybersecurity tooling and threat intelligence feeds. No cyber threats related to this weather event have been identified. The Texas.gov homepage banner has been updated to include flood recovery resources and a link to the Kerr County Flood Relief Fund.

Public Utility Commission of Texas (PUC)

PUC has two Liaison Officers (LNO) assigned to the SOC and will support 24-hour operations if needed. [Power outages statewide peaked to 8,600 and are just under 5,000 on July 6. The power outages are concentrated in the Oncor, CenterPoint, and Kerrville service areas. Oncor's estimated time of restoration is July 6, at 7:00PM. Restoration may be delayed due to terrain conditions and the potential for extensive repairs.](#)

Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission (TABC):

[TABC is actively supporting the state's response to the severe weather event by supporting public safety and disaster recovery efforts. TABC continues to work closely with state and federal partners through the SOC to ensure TABC responds as needed.](#)

[TABC Special Response Team \(SRT\) responded to the Kerrville EOC to assist with public safety and disaster recovery operations. An Additional SRT remains on standby, and additional law enforcement personnel are available if more are needed.](#)

Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ):

TCEQ has staff available to respond to any air/water/waste related issues, drinking water/wastewater issues, and emergency response.

As of July 6, TCEQ is tracking [eight](#) drinking water systems that are on a Boil Water Notice (BWN) serving a population of [31,443](#).

Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS):

DPS has [over 230](#) personnel actively responding in support of the increased severe weather threat and flooding in Kerr County. Resources are deployed from the San Antonio District to include Troopers from the Texas Highway Patrol (THP), Criminal Investigation Division (CID) agents, Texas Rangers - Special Response Team, and Aviation assets from across the state. The THP Chief's office is providing SOC support. [DPS personnel are working with state, local, and federal partners to assist in the search and recovery efforts. Troopers, Special Agents, Texas Rangers - Special Operation Group \(SOG\), Aviation, and Tactical Marine Units are actively conducting search and rescue operations.](#)

As of July 4, THP, CID, DPS Aircraft, Public Information officer (PIO), and Texas Rangers from the Central Texas Region responded to the Kerr County area to assist with evacuation operations due to the flooding. Troopers are being assigned to provide traffic control, manage road closures, and work at the Disaster Mortuary (DMORT). Troopers are also providing security at a funeral home in Kerrville. DPS CID are assisting with processing and badging evacuees at a reunification center and two shelters located in Kerr County.

San Antonio Commercial Vehicle Enforcement (CVE) Troopers are conducting bus inspections at the Lancer Warehouse to ensure safety and readiness of buses for transportation operations.

Aviation assisted with rescues and hoist operations in impacted areas. An Aviation Captain was deployed to the SOC for Air/Ground Coordination along with other representatives who have air assets engaged in the response.

Infrastructure Operations Division (IOD) personnel with Victim and Employee Support Services (VESS) responded to Kerrville. [Texas Rangers and VESS are working with families to utilize rapid DNA testing to quickly identify victims.](#) Communications personnel responded to assist DPS field personnel, and the [Intelligence and Counterterrorism \(ICT\) is working to support communications in the impacted areas.](#) DPS IOD deployed their Vehicle and Technical Services Response Operations (VAT) on July 6.

DPS Tactical Marine Unit deployed five Zodiac boats and 18 boat crew personnel to Burnet County. Eight DPS Dive Team members have been placed on standby and are available to deploy upon request.

Texas Department of State Health Services (a):

A SOC Coordination Officer (SCO) and (LNO) have been sent to the SOC and the State Medical Operations Center (SMOC) has activated for 24-hour operations. DSHS initiated mortality surveillance operations and Public Health Region 8 is deploying one Mortuary Enhanced Remains Cooling System and Morgue trailer to support with fatality management. EMTF has activated multiple assets for this incident. The Texas Mass Fatality Operations Response Team (TMORT) has been activated and is supporting the jurisdiction with six personnel. An additional DSHS morgue trailer deployed to Kerrville on July 5.

Southwest Texas Regional Advisory Council (STRAC) deployed [one](#) Mortuary Enhanced Remains Cooling System [to support fatality management operations](#), and the San Antonio Regional Medical Operations Center has been activated to support operations.

[Public Health Region 8 has assigned personnel to support DDEOC 18 and have activated one Mortuary Enhanced Remains Cooling System and one Morgue Trailer in](#)

support of fatality management operations. Public Health Region 7 has assigned personnel to support DDEOC 12 in Williamson County

The Capital Area of Texas Regional Advisory Council (CATRAC), Regional Medical Operations Center (RMOC), has been activated for operations. RMOC has communicated with hospitals, nursing homes, and ALS facilities within the impact area. The SouthEast Texas Regional Advisory Council (SETRAC) will deploy two morgue trailers to Kerrville.

Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT):

As of July 6, TxDOT has 36 locations on state-maintained roads impacted by floodwater, nine are closed due to highwater, and 21 are closed due to damage.

TxDOT crews have been monitoring roads, clearing debris, cleaning drainage areas, and providing traffic control. State Highway (SH) 29 in Burnet County has reopened, and temporary main-lane closures were in place the last several days to provide egress to firefighting equipment. TxDOT crews and emergency staff are rostered and are on standby to respond. TxDOT has 24/7 staffing in the SOC.

Texas Health and Human Services Commission (HHSC):

Texas HHSC sent staff to the SOC and personnel will remain for the duration of the incident. The Longterm Care Regulation section reports no impacted facilities. The Kerrville State Hospital reports no major impacts. Ice, water, and freight vendors are on standby to respond as needed. [Disaster Behavior Health units at the local level were deployed on July 6.](#)

A long-term care (LTC) facility in Burnet County was evacuated. Other LTC facilities have reported impacts from the severe weather but are able to shelter in place. A residential childcare facility in Liberty Hill was evacuated, and the children were moved into a stable environment. Two intermediate care facilities in Seguin have been relocated to hotels.

Texas Military Department (TMD):

TMD has activated [eight](#) Ground Transportation Platoons (GTP), 3.5 Rotary Wing Medium MRPs, a SOC Support Team, Air Operations Center Representatives, a Rotary Wing Heavy MRP, a Tactical Air Control Party (TACP), two Shelter Teams, Remote Piloted Aircraft, [two Ground Transportation Company Headquarters, one Battalion Mission Command, an Air Operations Center MRP](#), and two Electronic Tracking Network (ETN) Teams have been activated. TMD has activated [238](#) personnel, [44](#) vehicles, and nine aircraft. [TMD personnel will be assisting with iSTAT and pSTAT damage assessments. Additionally, TMD has activated Chaplains and Behavioral Specialist to support Service Members working the rescue and recovery operations. TMD has made 520 rescues as of July 6.](#)

Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD):

TPWD has Texas Game Wardens and State Park Police Officers prepared to respond and support operations. TPWD has the following resources available: two liaisons at the SOC, two helicopters in Austin, State Game Wardens and State Park Police Officers, Search and Rescue (SAR) Boat Teams, All-Terrain Vehicles, K9 Teams, and Peer Support Team. As of [July 7](#), TPWD has performed [30](#) rescues, 414 evacuations, and rescued six pets.

American Red Cross (ARC):

The ARC has shelters open in Kerr, San Saba, Tom Green, and Williamson Counties. Kerr County: The First United Methodist Church (Shelter with Medical Support), 321 Thompson Drive, Kerrville, TX, and Calvary Temple Church 3000 Loop 534, Kerrville, TX. Tom Green County: The Clarion Hotel (No Pets Authorized), 441 Rio Concho Dr., Bldg. A San Angelo, TX 76903, and the Red Roof Inn (Pet Shelter), 4205 S. Bryant Blvd, San Angelo, TX 76903. [The Burnet Community Center, Cross Tracks Church, and Mill Pond Park shelters have been closed.](#) The ARC has distributed 480 bottles of water, 200 Comfort Kits, 226 cots, and 270 blankets.

The Salvation Army (TSA):

The TSA is supporting feeding operations in Kerrville (Calvary Temple - now moved to Hunt), Ingram (City West Church), and Hunt (Crider's). In San Angelo, Hargraves Auto provided meals to first responders and survivors. TSA has provided 3,640 meals and 22,530 drinks.

Southern Baptists of Texas Disaster Relief (SBTC):

[SBTC has a Quick Response Feeding Unit \(QRU\) operational at the First Baptist Church in Kerrville. On July 6, an IMT, QRU, Chaplains, showers, laundry units, and mud out units arrived in San Saba. SBTC has provided 210 volunteer hours, 70 ministry contacts, and 290 meals.](#)
