Increased moisture is forecast across the area late today, bringing showers and thunderstorms with potential to produce heavy rainfall clear into the overnight hours. Due to the rainfall over the past two months, the Panhandle region is low chance to see flooding. Make sure to stay informed with the latest forecasts, and if traveling, ensure you have multiple ways to receive warnings.



This afternoon and evening another round of severe thunderstorms is expected. The primary concern at this time is the potential for heavy rainfall. However, isolated thunderstorms could produce wind gusts up to 70 mph and hail up to 1 inch in diameter.





There is a marginal risk for severe storms this evening and overnight for much of the Caprock and the far southern Texas Panhandle. Storms could produce wind gusts to 60 mph, heavy rain and small hail.



Strong to severe thunderstorms are possible across western into northern Oklahoma this afternoon into this evening. Damaging wind gusts will be the main severe weather hazard.




