STATEWIDE CURRENT SITUATION:

On July 16, Governor Greg Abbott <u>updated</u> his disaster declaration following recent catastrophic flooding across Texas to include Hamilton, Lampasas, Maverick, Sutton, and Uvalde counties, bringing the total to 26 counties. Additional counties may be added at a later date.

On July 15, Governor Abbott <u>directed</u> the Texas Division of Emergency Management (TDEM) to <u>request</u> that Coke, Concho, and Williamson counties be added to President Donald J. Trump's Major Disaster Declaration.

On July 15, Governor Abbott <u>announced</u> that the Texas Health and Human Services Commission (HHSC) is awarding over \$1.9 million in grant funding to hospitals in Kerrville and Llano impacted by recent catastrophic floods.

On July 14, Governor Abbott <u>received</u> a briefing and held a press conference at Donald Lewis Hisle Elementary School on Texas' continued response to severe flooding impacting Central Texas. Prior to the briefing and press conference, the Governor toured damage at Sandy Creek Bridge and met with local first responders to thank them for their service.

On July 14, Governor Abbott also announced that the federal government has <u>updated</u> President Trump's Major Disaster Declaration following recent catastrophic flooding across Texas to include Burnet, Llano, Mason, McCulloch, and Tom Green counties for the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Public Assistance program.

On July 12, Governor Abbott announced that he <u>directed</u> the TDEM to request that five additional counties — Burnet, Llano, Mason, McCulloch, and Tom Green — be added to President Trump's Major Disaster Declaration following the recent catastrophic flooding that impacted communities across Texas.

On July 11, Governor Abbott and First Lady Abbott joined President Trump and First Lady Trump during a visit to Kerr County to meet with Texas families and first responders regarding the recent severe flooding and heavy rainfall that devastated communities across Texas.

On July 11, Governor Abbott announced that the federal government has <u>updated</u> the Presidential Disaster Declaration following recent flooding in Texas to include Burnet, Kerr, San Saba, Tom Green, Travis, and Williamson counties now eligible for the FEMA Individual Assistance program. Kendall, Kerr, Kimble, Menard, and San Saba counties were also approved for FEMA's Public Assistance program.

On July 10, Governor Abbott directed TDEM to <u>request</u> additional counties be added to President Trump's Major Disaster Declaration for recent catastrophic flooding that began impacting the state last week. Five counties – Burnet, San Saba, Tom Green, <u>Travis</u>, and Williamson – are <u>requested</u> to be eligible for FEMA Individual Assistance programs, and four counties – Kendall, Kimble, Menard, and San Saba – are <u>requested</u> to be eligible for FEMA's Public Assistance Program.

OPERATIONAL PRIORITIES:

- Protect life and property.
- Support rapid & effective response.
- Collect and disseminate accurate incident information to improve decision-making.
- Accurately track incident costs associated with assigned resources for cost recovery.

Region 6 (Includes DDs 17, 18, and 24)

DD 18 – New Braunfels (Includes Atascosa, Bandera, Bexar, Comal, Frio, Gillespie, Guadalupe, Karnes, Kendall, Kerr, McMullen, Medina, and Wilson Counties):

On July 6, DDEOC activated to Level III.

As of July 7, TEEX PWRT teams are working on lift station issues from Kerrville to Comfort. Damage assessments are ongoing and multiple state agency Critical Incident Stress Management (CISM) Teams are on site.

Kerr County:

A family reunification center is located at Trinity Baptist Church on 800 Jackson Road in Kerr Co. The American Red Cross has a shelter located at Calvary Baptist Church on 113 Methodist Encampment Road in Kerr Co. and a medical is located at Kerr Co. First United Methodist Church on 321 Thompson Drive in Kerr Co.

Region 7 (Includes DDs 8, 9, and 10)

DD 10 – (Includes Coke, Concho, Irion, Edwards, Crockett, Kimble, Mason, McCulloch, Menard, Reagan, Schleicher, Sterling, Sutton, and Tom Green Counties):

On July 4, DDEOC 10 activated to Level III.

Region 8 (Includes DDs 11, 12, 13, and 23)

DD 12 – Austin (Includes Bastrop, Blanco, Burnet, Caldwell, Fayette, Hays, Lee, Llano, Travis, and Williamson Counties):

On July 5, DDEOC 12 activated to Level III.

Near historic rainfall impacted Travis, Burnet, and Williamson Counties during the night and first responders conducted dozens of water rescues.

Burnet County:

Crews from Travis County extended their response into Burnet County, where they coordinated with local responders, Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD), Texas Task Force (TX-TF), and Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS) boats to rescue dozens of people in Burnet, Marble Falls, and other areas of the county.

Travis County:

Rainfall started in Travis County with water rescues reported early in the morning hours. Emergency Services Districts (ESDs) and Austin units managed the rescues. The city of Austin requested boat squads due to neighborhoods being impacted by fast moving water. Travis County aviation assets worked directly with the State Operations Center (SOC) to dispatch local and state aircraft to assist TX-TF throughout the day.

Williamson County:

Texas Intrastate Fire Mutual Aid System (TIFMAS), Emergency Medical Task Force (EMTF), and Texas Division of Emergency Management will begin conducting Individual State of Texas Assessment Tool/Public State of Texas Assessment Tool (iSTAT/pSTAT) surveys in Williamson County.

DD 23 – Killeen (Includes Bell, Coryell, Hamilton, Lampasas, Milam, Mills, and San Saba Counties):

On July 13, DDEOC 23 activated to Level III.

Hamilton County:

Hamilton County Sheriff requested assistance from the Oklahoma Task Force Boat Squad for a missing female on the Leon River.

San Saba County:

On July 13, an evacuation order was issued in the City of San Saba for those living south of San Saba River, east of HWY 16 (High Street) and north of HWY 190 (Wallace

Street).

RESPONDING STATE AGENCIES/ORGANIZATIONS REPORTS

Texas Division of Emergency Management (TDEM): Communications Coordination Group (CCG):

As of July 16, there are twelve (12) mobile cellular platforms supporting operations in Burnet, Kerr and Williamson counties. Cellular providers are also providing Low Earth Orbit (LEO) satellite devices to support ongoing operations.

As of July 12, T-Mobile activated its T-Satellite service in the impacted area, which will allow text messaging via satellite if there is no cell service.

The Texas Department of Public Safety's Office of the Statewide Interoperable Communications (SWIC) has supplied a COML (Communications Unit Leaders), Communications Technician (COMT), and additional personnel for communications coordination support to the IMT. Amateur Radio services have activated local nets, providing backup emergency communication and localized reports. Six Amateur Radio operators are being embedded in search teams conducting operations in Kerr County. Federal partners are monitoring and ready to assist upon request. Finally, the Texas Telecommunicator Emergency Response Taskforce (TXTERT) has provided two call takers and two dispatchers to support the Kerrville Police Department.

Incident Support Task Force (ISTF):

On July 15, additional ISTF members deployed to the Kerrville area. ISTF members are also operational in Burnet, Travis, and Williamson counties. ISTF Regional Volunteer Agency Liaison (VAL) team is supporting community response and identifying key recovery needs, such as food access, debris removal, and muck-outs. There have been 1,300 requests for Volunteer Organizations Active in Disasters (VOAD) cleanup assistance have been submitted through iSTAT.

Mass Care is supporting Family Assistance and First Responder Assistance Centers in Kerrville and coordinating across Regions 6, 7, and 8.

Feeding:

As of July 16, there are seven fixed and mobile sites serving hot meals statewide to first responders and individuals impacted by the disaster.

Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service (AgriLife):

AgriLife is supporting Disaster Resource Centers (DRC) as they are being stood up in flood-stricken counties. Disaster Assessment and Recovery (DAR) Specialists and County Extension Agents (CEA) are manning DRCs in Kerr County beginning July 9, Tom Green County beginning July 14, with plans to expand to Williamson on July 17, then to Burnet and San Saba Counties.

One DAR Area Chief reported to the IMT on behalf of AgriLife Extension Service and ESF 11. DAR agents are assisting the Type 3 VET Team in Kerr County, supporting 33 Human Remains Detection (HRD) canines. A total of 107 canine exams for foot injuries, muscle soreness and fatigue have been performed. VET support is located at Comfort High School, Tivy High School in Kerrville, and Canyon Lake High School.

Preliminary coordination with TCEQ for logistics on carcass disposal has been started.

There are five DAR agents who are staged in Kerr County, with one DAR Director enroute, one DAR specialist is at the Disaster Reunification Center (DRC), and three DAR logistics personnel are positioned at the Lancer TDEM Warehouse in San Antonio. The AgriLife DAR PIO has been sharing weather safety information via social media channels and is working with other state agency partners on message delivery.

Texas A&M Engineering Extension Service Public Works Response Team (PWRT): As of July 15, the PWRT team in Kerrville is assisting with area water systems. The PWRT team in San Angelo continued 24-hour pumping operations through overnight rain. ESF-3 remains staffed at the SOC and the Kerrville Emergency Operations Center (EOC).

On July 13, PWRT Teams continued operations in Kerrville and San Angelo. In Kerrville, PWRT is conducting ongoing evaluations of public water systems, including water and wastewater systems, and lift stations. System damage is being assessed and identifying the resources for repairs. In San Angelo, pumping operations continue to reduce standing water levels, and outflow areas continue to recede. Despite recent rainfall, discharge remains steady. The weekend weather forecast is being monitored closely, and teams are prepared to disconnect discharge lines and relocate pumps to higher ground if needed.

On July 11, PWRT maintains a team in Kerrville available to assist with public works infrastructure. PWRT team in San Angelo began pumping operations to remove standing water from a subdivision.

Texas A&M Engineering Extension Service Texas Task Force 1 (TEEX/TX-TF1):

On July 16, the main threat of heavy rain has subsided, TDEM is releasing a few State Swiftwater Rescue (SWR) Squads from Regions 1, 2, 7, & 8; being repositioned to other areas in preparation for tropical disturbance as forecasted. The remainder of the resources including State, EMAC and DFA will continue to monitor the weather, maintain situational awareness, fulfill 204 and AHJ requests as well as maintain the physical and mental health of all responders.

More rain is expected across TDEM Regions 6, 7 and 8, all resources currently in the field searching, are closely monitoring the weather and the potential for rising rivers. A total of 1,037 personnel is assigned to Search and Rescue (SAR) in Texas, with 271 personnel from TX-TF1, TX-TF2, TX-TF3, and VET. An additional 75 canine units and 128 boats are being added to this incident and are working in Texas.

On July 13, TX-TF1 SWR squads prepared for flash flooding conditions overnight and early this morning. TX-TF1 repositioned SWR boat squads across the area of operations within TDEM Regions 6, 7, and 8. All resources maintain situational awareness of weather conditions and will halt SAR operations as needed due to responder safety. Resources will continue searching along the Guadalupe River and Big Sandy Creek for missing people, marking debris piles for removal, monitoring the

weather, and assisting with local requests.

On July 12, TX-TF1 adjusted its (SWR) deployments due to potential flash flooding. They dispatched two State SWRs and a Water Group Supervisor package to Lubbock, Childress, San Angelo, Abilene, Weatherford, and Midland. Concurrently, TDEM demobilized SWR Squads from Dallas, El Paso, and Fort Worth, returning them to their home stations, while activating one SWR Squad in Austin. All available resources continued search operations along the Guadalupe River and Big Sandy Creek.

Texas A&M Forest Service (TAMFS):

TAMFS has activated six All-Hazard Strike Teams, 14 Saw Teams, and three skid steers, and the mobile command post demobilized. There are three Liaison Officers (LNO) at the SOC, one LNO and one Staging Area Manager (STAM) with the Incident Management Team (IMT). One PIO was assigned to San Angelo. TAMFS has sent six personnel to assist with logistics and coordination in Disaster District Emergency Operations Center (DDEOC) 10.

On July 15, seven TIFMAS Strike Teams were relocated from Kerrville to Region 8.

Department of Information Resources (DIR):

DIR is monitoring the situation using cybersecurity tooling and threat intelligence feeds. No cyber threats related to this weather event have been identified. The Texas.gov homepage banner has been updated to include flood recovery resources and a link to the Kerr County Flood Relief Fund.

Public Utility Commission of Texas (PUC):

As of July 12, the PUC reported no significant power outages. One LNO remains assigned to the SOC and will support 24-hour operations if needed.

Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission (TABC):

Fourteen of TABC's Special Response Team (SRT) members are working alongside Texas DPS and TPWD in checkpoint, and search and recovery operations. Twenty SRT members remain on standby and are ready to respond if needed. Additional law enforcement personnel are available if more are needed if all SRT resources are used.

Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ):

As of July 16, TCEQ is tracking one drinking water system under a boil water notice serving 6,958 people and has authorized 12 temporary debris management sites.

As of July 14, TCEQ has staff available to respond to any air, water, and waste-related issues. TCEQ is providing local governments with technical assistance and guidance on debris management. TCEQ has authorized 11 temporary debris management sites with two located in Kerr County.

Texas Department of Agriculture (TDA):

TDA is staffing shifts at the SOC to monitor unmet needs in the agricultural community. The free, confidential Agri-Stress Helpline offers 24/7 support via call or text for those experiencing stress or loss. Staffed by trained professionals, it serves the agriculture, forestry, and fishing sectors, providing support and referrals to local mental health resources. So far, it has helped over 285 Texans in 114 counties. Call or text 1-833-897-2474 for assistance.

TDA's Hay Hotline is open for those wishing to donate hay. Donors can register at https://texasagriculture.gov/Home/Production-Agriculture/Hay-Hotline and will be contacted if requests are received.

TDA's STAR (State of Texas Agriculture Relief) Fund is accepting applications from those who suffered agricultural losses due to the recent weather event. Funds may be used for rebuilding fences, restoring operations, and other disaster-related costs. Applicants in counties included in the Texas Governor's disaster declaration have 90 days from the proclamation date to apply. The deadline is November 4, 2025, at 11:59 p.m. Apply at https://texasagriculture.gov/Home/Production-Agriculture/Disaster-Assistance/STAR-Fund/Severe-Weather.

Through the Emergency Food Assistance Program (TEFAP), TDA food bank contractors distribute USDA-donated food to emergency feeding organizations. Texans can access this food via on-site meals or take-home packages.

Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS):

As of July 16, Tactical Marine Unit (TMU) is deploying four Zodiac boats and four personnel to assist TX-TF1 with search efforts. TMU has resources remaining in Travis County to assist TX-TF2 with search efforts on Cow Creek. Texas Highway Patrol (THP) is assisting Kerr County Sheriff's Office and Kerrville Police Department with their units by responding in conjunction with their personnel to calls for service, reducing the number of local units needed for a response. THP is providing security at impacted locations, securing deployed assets in San Antonio, and at incident access locations.

Over 300 DPS personnel are actively working in coordination with local, state, and federal partners in search and recovery efforts, assisting at evacuation shelters, reunification centers, and providing security.

On July 14, Aircraft Operations Division currently has one helicopter with hoist capabilities positioned in Kerrville, and a second hoist-equipped helicopter enroute from Alpine to Kerrville. TMU is co-located with TX-TF2 and has one boat team remaining in Travis County on flood standby and another boat team deployed to Lampasas. An additional TMU deployed a dive team to Kerrville in support of the ongoing operations. The San Antonio District, THP, Highway Patrol Safety Operations (HSOC), and Emerging Technology Patrol Unit personnel were deployed to Kerrville to provide support with interoperability mapping with a patrol unit location tool.

On July 12, DPS Aircraft Operations Division moved their helicopter and fixed-wing aircraft assets to San Antonio and unmanned aircraft are directly operating out of Kerr County.

The Criminal Investigation Division (CID) are teamed with SOG conducting recovery efforts. CID personnel are at the morgue assisting Rangers in identification efforts. CID Special Agents are also providing security for local and county officials, and at public meetings.

The Texas Rangers Division is assisting with the collection of DNA samples for transport by AOD to the University of North Texas - Denton for victim identification. Rangers are providing death notifications for identified victims.

The Aircraft Operations Division (AOD) are conducting aerial reconnaissance missions for damage assessments in the area as well as providing flights for officials. Fixed wing aircraft are transporting DNA samples to the University of North Texas - Denton for victim identification.

The Infrastructure Operations Division (IOD) deployed the Sam Houston Command Trailer to the Kerr County EOC. They are supporting local Kerr Co. PD and Kerr County SO with Communication personnel. A 106' radio tower was deployed to Center Point as a repeater to be used amongst search personnel and to communicate with the command trailer.

Information Technology (IT) is providing on-site tech support and integrations for critical Frontline systems: TXMAP, TAK, and aircraft video systems.

Intelligence and Counterterrorism (ICT) Division Analysts are collecting, analyzing, and sanitizing information on missing and deceased individuals. They are also assisting with mapping operational routes for DPS assets to enter the impacted area. ICT Communication operators are augmenting emergency call intake from Kerr Co. PD and Kerr County SO.

Victim Employee Support Services (VESS) assisted with death notifications and continue working with the affected families by providing psychological support. They have conducted several debriefings with emergency personnel in the operational area, and more are planned in the coming days.

Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS):

As of July 16, AMBUS (MPV 801) was replaced by MPV 6-04 for three active AMBUS in Kerrville. Since July 10, 604 vaccines have been provided to first responders. On July 14, Public Health Region (PHR) 8 has assigned personnel and assets Grimes Funeral Home along with the Texas Funeral Directors Association who continues to support operations with three personnel.

On July 13, DSHS continues its mortality surveillance operations. Southwest Texas Regional Advisory Council (STRAC) has deployed two Mortuary Enhanced Remains Cooling Systems to Kerrville. STRAC has deployed two additional morgue trailers to support fatality management operations in Boerne and Kerrville.

Coastal Bend Regional Advisory Council (CBRAC) has deployed two morgue trailers to Kerr County, one is in Ingram, and one in Kerrville. DSHS Public Health Region (PHR) 8 has deployed one morgue trailer and one Mortuary Enhanced Remains Cooling Systems (MERC) in Kerrville. The Texas Mass Fatality Response Team (TMORT) remains activated and has three members supporting fatality operations at Grimes Funeral Home.

DSHS is supporting a first responder vaccine clinic at the RELLIS Staging Area (RSA) with Hepatitis A and Tetanus, Diphtheria, Pertussis (TDAP) vaccine, and will expand to the staging site at Canyon Lake High School. DSHS will also coordinate with PHR 8 and the Unified Command to conduct mobile vaccination clinics for first responders. The total first responders vaccinated is 282 Tdap and 303 Hep A. DSHS is coordinating with PHR 8, TDEM, and Peterson Health to support community vaccination clinics providing Hepatitis A and TDAP vaccines to the community. EMTF assisted the evacuation of a nursing home in San Saba. Capital Area Trauma Regional Advisory Council (CATRAC) Regional Medical Operations Center (RMOC) remobilized to coordinate on the evacuation and provide medical support in Round Mountain.

Texas Emergency Medical Task Force (EMTF):

On July 12, EMTF deployed two additional Ambulance Strike Teams to assist with responder rehabilitation for night operations. The total patient contacts are 3,716 encounters, 94 treated, 62 transported.

Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT):

As of July 16, TxDOT has 26 locations on state-maintained roads impacted by flooding, 8 locations are closed from flooding and 9 from damage.

Texas Health and Human Services Commission (HHSC):

On July 15, the nursing home in San Saba that evacuated on July 13 was repopulated.

On July 10, HHSC disaster behavioral health staff embedded at Unified Command continue to coordinate and support the First Responder Assistance Center (FRAC) and Family Assistance Center (FAC). The Central Texas Flooding Emotional Support Line went live at 8:00 AM. Texans statewide can call 833-812-2480 to connect with support. FEMA granted funding for HHSC to operate the Other Needs Assistance (ONA) program. One HHSC staff member remains in place at the DRC in Kerrville.

Texas Military Department (TMD):

As of July 17, TMD has deployed 291 personnel, 66 vehicles, and nine aircraft in support of our state partners. EMAC coordination includes 26 personnel, and four

aircraft supporting 25-0026 02JUL Severe Weather Incident. TMD has seven UH-60s staged in San Antonio, Marble Falls, and Kerrville and two CH-47 in Fredericksburg. There are eight Ground Transportation Platoons (GTPs) staged across Dallas/Fort Worth as well as in Bexar, Kerr, Lampasas, and Williamson Counties, one Tactical Air Control Party (TAC-P) in Kerr County, an Air Operations Center and SOC Support Team in Austin. There is a General Support Unit (GSU) assisting the Salvation Army Donation Center in Kerrville and two Damage Assessment Teams in Austin.

The State of Arkansas has provided four UH-60 Helicopter and 24 personnel staged in Austin. The State of North Dakota has provided eight pilots for the MQ-9 Drone. The two State of Arizona Air National Guard Ground Control Station Maintenance (MQ-9) personnel have been released.

TMD has flown recon missions and provided flights for 280 first responders. EMAC Aircraft provided flights for 31 first responders, five CANINEs, delivered 100 meals to Leander, and conducted eight damage assessments.

Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD):

On July 15, Texas Game Warden Strike Teams demobilized in Kerrville and are returning to their assigned duty stations. Local Wardens will respond as needed.

On July 13, Game Wardens responded to assist with the severe flooding in Sonora, Lomita, San Saba, Kempner, Brady, Lampasas, Eldorado, and Killeen. Little Lucy RV Park in Lampasas was evacuated due to rising water. Colorado Bend State Park was closed until July 14, and the surrounding State Parks are monitoring conditions. In Kerrville, Game Wardens continue to conduct recovery missions and are in collaboration with first responders.

Game Wardens issued 14 evacuation notifications for the town of Sonora in Sutton County. Game Wardens conducted UAS assessments of 13 dams in Sutton County, Dry Devil's River, and Fork Llano River. Additional Game Wardens reported to TX-TF2 in Leander on July 14 to support SAR operations. TPWD has performed a total of 35 rescues and 434 evacuations.

On July 12, Game Wardens participated in multi-agency SAR operations in Cow Creek, Travis County. These agencies included Texas TX-TF2, TDEM, TMD, DPS, with national task force teams from Alabama, Florida, California, New York, and Wisconsin with five cadaver dogs assisted them.

There is one helicopter available in Austin and SAR boat teams, Unmanned Aircraft System (UAS) pilots, and All Terrain Vehicle (ATV) teams are actively engaged in SAR missions.

TFR QRF patrol had a positive hit on UAS detections systems in Kerr County and quickly contacted a father/daughter that launched the drone. Texas Game Wardens

UAS pilots were able to educate them on the TFR and safety concerns. The father completed the TEEX UAS Survey that is required for UAS Pilots.

In Travis and Williamson Counties, Texas Game Wardens are actively engaged in search and recovery missions in the Sandy Creek area. They are collaborating with numerous agencies, including teams from Florida, Alabama, Wisconsin, California, and New York State Police, supported by five cadaver dogs.

Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs (TDHCA):

TDHCA is actively supporting the state's response to the severe weather event by supporting its community action agency partners at the local level and coordinating resources with HUD at the federal level.

The following partners are collaborating with local officials to identify and assist impacted households with immediate food/gas/hotel needs.

- Tom Green County: Concho Valley Community Action Agency
- Kerr County: Community Council of South-Central Texas

American Red Cross (ARC):

The ARC is engaged in multiple support efforts across various counties. Disaster Emergency Supplies (DES) are being distributed through community partners and mobile routes in Kerr, Tom Green, McCulloch, and Williamson Counties. ARC is supporting the Multi-Agency Resource Center (MARC) in Burnet County. In Kerrville, the ARC is supporting both the Mass Fatality Task Group and the Family Assistance Center at BT Wilson Sixth Grade School. Alongside these efforts, the ARC is working both in-person and virtually to reconnect families and loved ones. While a shelter resident transition was initiated, recent rainfall has unfortunately led to new shelter intakes.

The ARC has provided mass fatality care services in Kerr County to families of the deceased and initiated Integrated Care Condolence Teams (ICCT) for Tom Green, Concho, McCulloch, Menard, Mason, San Saba, Burnet, Williamson, and Travis Counties. The ARC also expanded community outreach and care services. Mobile Community Outreach Teams (MCOT) were deployed in Tom Green County, while Individual Disaster Care (IDC) services were provided at the Multi-Agency Resource Center (MARC) in Burnet County.

Mobile Disaster Emergency Services (DES) are in Tom Green, McCulloch and Williamson Counties. Relationship Managers contacted all emergency management partners to provide updates and confirm new mission requests across 15 counties without activated EOCs.

Personnel are staffed for EOCs in the City of Kerrville, City of San Angelo, Travis County, and SOC. Partner organizations were mobilized to align resources, and

outreach to elected officials has been consistent to ensure awareness and confidence in ARC's readiness. Finally, detailed damage assessments (DDA) were completed in Burnet, San Saba, Tom Green, Travis, and Williamson Counties, with all reports due by end of day July 12. The ARC has distributed 480 bottles of water, 200 Comfort Kits, 226 cots, and 270 blankets.

The ARC has shelters open in Kerr, Tom Green, Lampasas, Kimble, and Williamson Counties, with standby shelters in Travis. The ARC has supported shelters in Tom Green, Kimble, Williamson, and Lampasas Counties. The shelter in San Saba County has closed. ARC has initiated Shelter Resident Transition; however, recent rains have resulted in new shelter intake. Immediate Assistance will begin in Tom Green, Williamson, Burnet, and San Saba Counties.

The Salvation Army (TSA):

The TSA is supporting feeding operations and Emotional and Spiritual Care in Ingram (City West Church). In Kerrville, the San Antonio Canteen is stationed at the Wal-Mart providing drinks, snacks, and distributing relief supplies. A volunteer reception center is set up in the Kerrville Social Services Building. The San Angelo canteen is stationed at Hargraves Auto and is serving first responders and survivors. The Big Lake RRU are patrolling neighborhoods to provide food, hydration, and snacks. TSA has provided 4,853 meals, 32,366 drinks, 27,691 snacks, 1,438 hygiene kits, 998 clean up kits, 324 cleaning supplies, and 1,229 articles of clothing.

Southern Baptists of Texas Convention Disaster Relief (SBTC):

SBTC has Quick Response Feeding Units (QRUs) currently operational at First Baptist Church in Kerr County, at First Baptist Church in San Saba County, Glen Meadows Baptist Church in San Angelo, and Round Mountain Baptist Church in Leander. SBTC has provided 7,810 volunteer hours, 678 ministry contacts, and 4,963 meals.

Texans on Mission (TXM):

On July 14, TXM responded to the floods in San Angelo with assessors, IMT, electrical, electronic, shower and laundry services, feeding, with the flood recovery team. Assessors continue to work and are also pursuing work orders and signatures for the sorting of debris at houses that have had muck-out completed. This is to help the City of San Angelo meet the FEMA requirements. There have been 62 work orders processed with 52 remaining.

On July 14, the San Angelo Emergency Manager has asked TXM to figure out how to help to sort the debris per FEMA guideline, and we are working on a plan. The logistics required to do this work, such as obtaining work orders and owner liability signatures to access their property are ongoing. Our assessors will be assisting with this effort. This project will be coordinated with the City of San Angelo Public Works Department. TXM have worked 6,540 hours, distributed 2,640 meals, and completed 44 assessments.
