FEMA Region 6 Weather Threat Briefing

Sunday, September 21, 2025

*****Updated due to addition of a slight risk area for severe storms today over S OK, N/NW TX***

• Flooding:

- Slight risk (level 2 of 4) for flash flooding over NE OK and NW AR today; over E OK and N AR on Tuesday.
- NM Burn Scars: Minor risk (level 1 of 4) Monday through Wednesday.
- Severe Weather: Slight risk (level 2 of 5) over S OK, N/NW TX today (large hail will be the main threat);
 W OK and the TX Panhandle on Monday.

Tropical Weather:

- Tropical Storm Gabrielle is forecast to remain in the Atlantic. FEMA 6 impacts are not expected.
- Medium chance (40%) for a wave in the eastern Atlantic to develop over the next 7 days. FEMA 6 impacts are not expected over the next week.







Note: Even though the image displays 5 days of forecasted rainfall, river forecasts only include 1-2 days of rainfall







Today's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities



















"Day 3-7" Hazards Outlook








