

The chance of showers and thunderstorms will increase this afternoon with a medium to high (55-85%) chance by tonight through Thursday as a cold front moves through South Texas. Heavy rainfall with totals of 1-2 inches expected and isolated 3-4 inches possible. Areas that receive higher amounts may experience scattered flash flooding, especially urban areas and low lying areas. Some of the storms may become strong to severe with damaging wind being the main threat. Small hail and isolated tornados are also possible.



#### Rain Chances - Thursday, September 25



#### → Timing and Coverage

- · 2 5 PM: Scattered (30-50% coverage) storms along AZ/NM state line (Grant and Hidalgo Counties)
- · 6 9 PM; Scattered showers and thunderstorms across southwest New Mexico, mostly west of the Rio Grande
- · 10 PM 1 AM: Lingering rain showers, gusty outflow winds

#### → Hazards

- · Brief downpours and localized flooding
- · Cloud-to-ground lightning
- · Gusty outflow winds up to 50 mph

#### → Actions and Preparedness

- · Monitor local news and weather.gov for latest forecasts
- · Have a way to receive alerts and warnings by cell phone, TV, or NOAA weather radio

#### **Key Messages**

- → Isolated to scattered storms continue through the night
  - ◆ Greater coverage along & south of I-10

Radar images are model generated and intended to give you an idea of the coverage of storms. Do not use them as exact forecasts of storm locations!




