# FEMA Region 6 Weather Threat Briefing

Sunday, September 28, 2025

#### • Flash Flooding:

- Slight risk (level 2 of 4) over S NM and Far W TX today.
- NM Burn Scars: Major (level 3 of 4) today, Moderate (level 2 of 4) Monday.

#### • Severe Storms:

Marginal risk (level 1 of 5) today over NM, Far W TX.

#### • Tropical Weather:

- Hurricane Humberto is expected to remain out in the Atlantic Ocean and not impact FEMA 6.
- Tropical Depression Nine is forecast to move northward and strengthen into a tropical storm later today and a hurricane on Tuesday. Track forecast is becoming more confident in a turn to the east on Tuesday. FEMA 6 impacts are not expected over the next week.

Note: Even though the image displays 5 days of forecasted rainfall, river forecasts only include 1-2 days of rainfall












## Watches, Warnings, and Advisories

#### Wind, Severe, Heat, and Flood Hazards










Flood Watch over the Ruidoso burn scar area and SE NM, Far W TX in effect through 9 PM. Expecting 0.5-1.0", but low end chances for up to 3" with repeated storms. Rainfall rates increase in the afternoon/evening to 1-2" per hr.


#### Tomorrow's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities
