
Isolated Thunderstorms Possible Later Today

Isolated thunderstorms will be possible late this afternoon and evening across much of the area, but chances increase some after 1 AM as a cold front approaches. Although the chances are very low, less than 5%, can't rule out a severe thunderstorm or two late this afternoon and evening. If this were to occur, wind gusts up to 60 mph and hail up to the size of quarters would be the primary hazards. Be sure to have multiple ways to receive weather alerts!




A Coastal Flood Advisory is currently in effect along the Gulf-facing beaches of the Middle Texas Coast through Monday evening. Conditions will be hazardous, especially during times of high tide. Up to 1 ft of beach inundation.

Unseasonably warm again today, with isolated coastal showers/storms



Today's Weather Keys

- The beach may beckon, but also carries risks today
 - High Risk of dangerous risk currents on Gulf-facing beaches
 - Unusually high water levels can cause minor coastal flooding at high tide
- Gulf winds and seas are beginning to subside, but those operating small craft will need to exercise caution
- Afternoon highs about 5° above average for early October, 3-5° beneath record highs for October 5.
- Most stay dry, but those coastward of I-10 will need to keep an eye out for an isolated shower/storm.





Expect above average temperatures to continue with some isolated to scattered showers and thunderstorms. The weather will surely beckon many to the beach, but there is also a high risk for dangerous rip currents for all Gulf-facing beaches and minor coastal flooding during high tide. While an isolated shower or storm could occur anywhere in the area, they will be very low inland with the best chances near the coast and over the Gulf.





Fire Danger Forecast




Burn Ban




