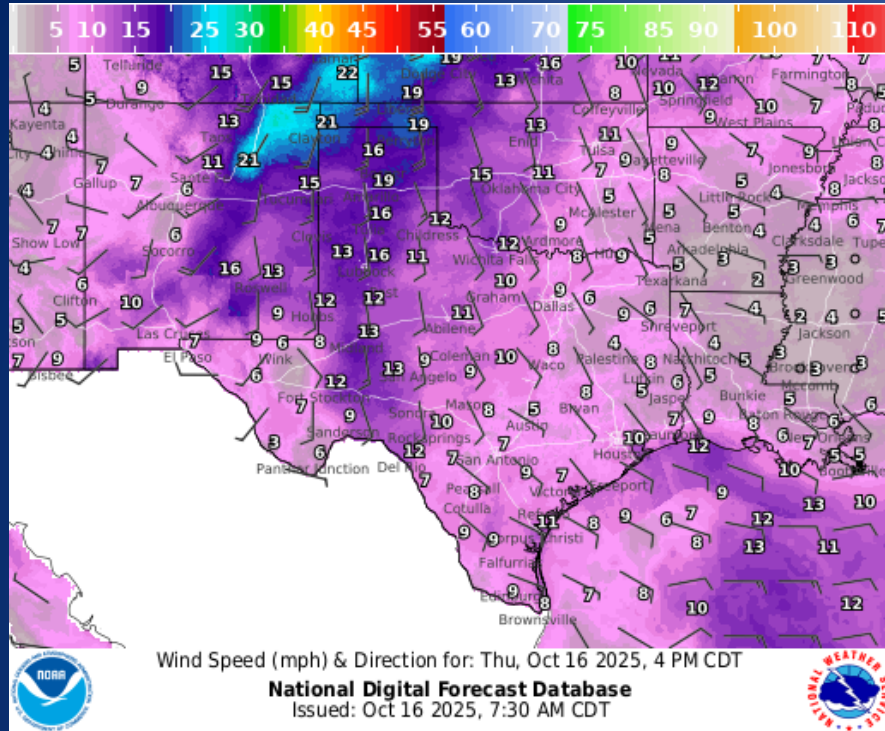

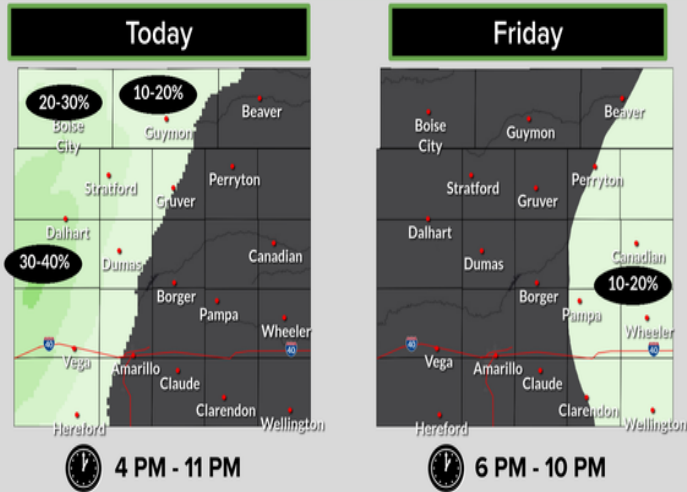

Fire Weather Outlook

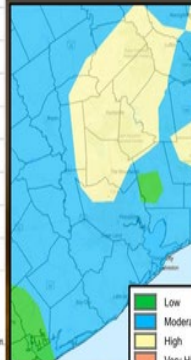

Warm and dry weather will bring a greater risk of fire across Southeast Texas. **Only you can prevent wildfires! Here's how:**

- AVOID any activities that could spark a wildfire, as fires could spread rapidly.
- Do NOT leave a fire unattended or burn unnecessarily.
- Secure tow chains to avoid dragging and sparking. NEVER park or drive over tall grass.
- Contact law enforcement or the fire department if you smell smoke or see fire!
- NEVER toss lit cigarettes on the ground!

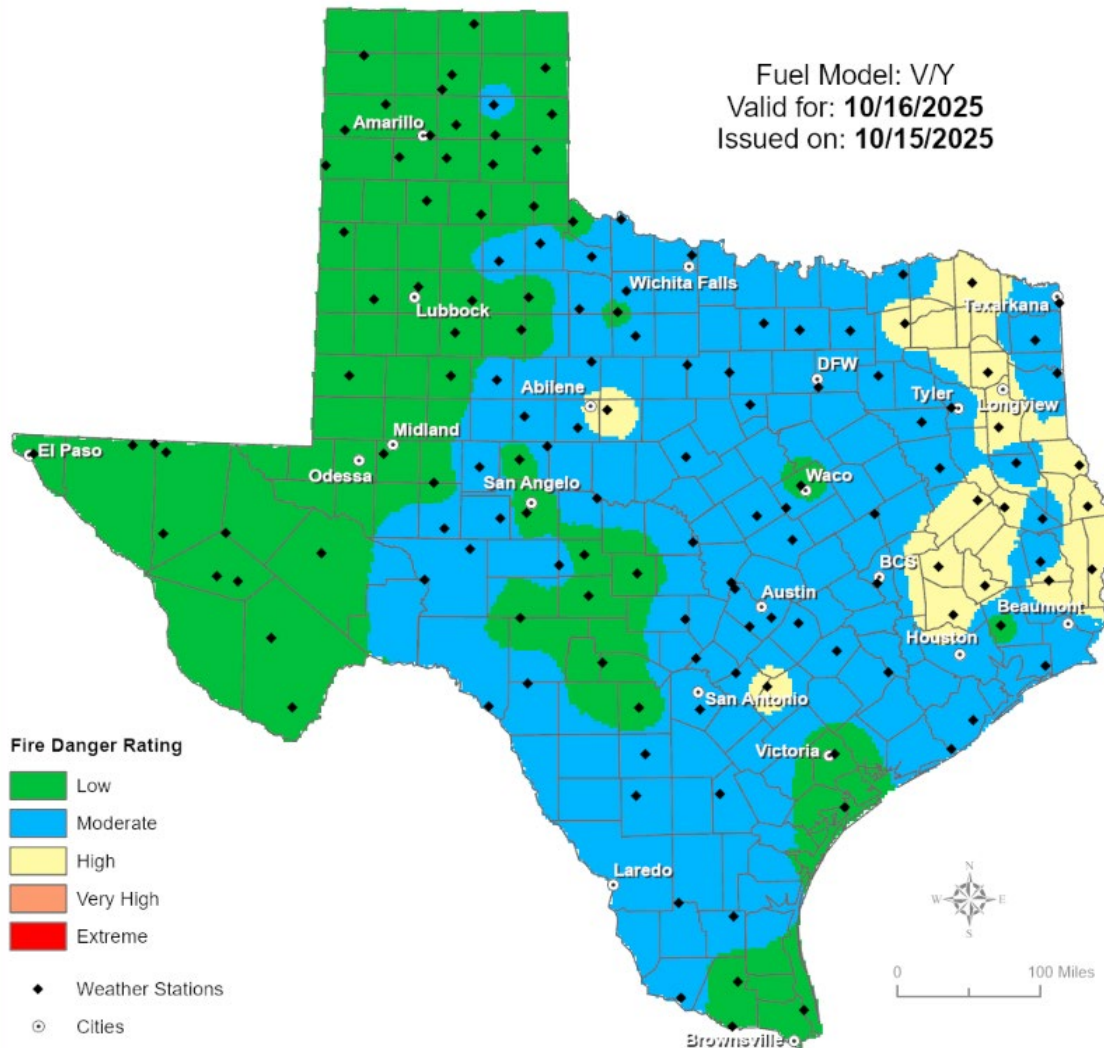

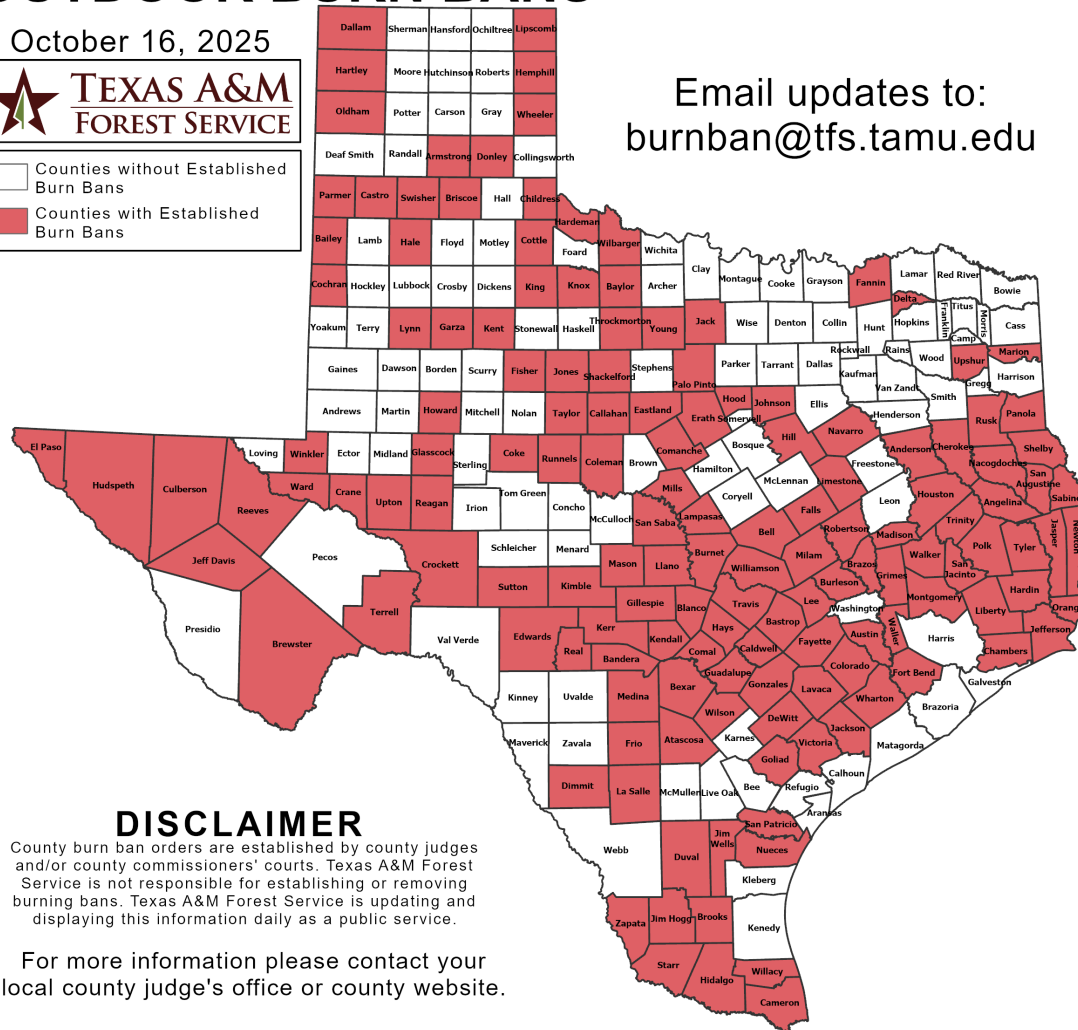

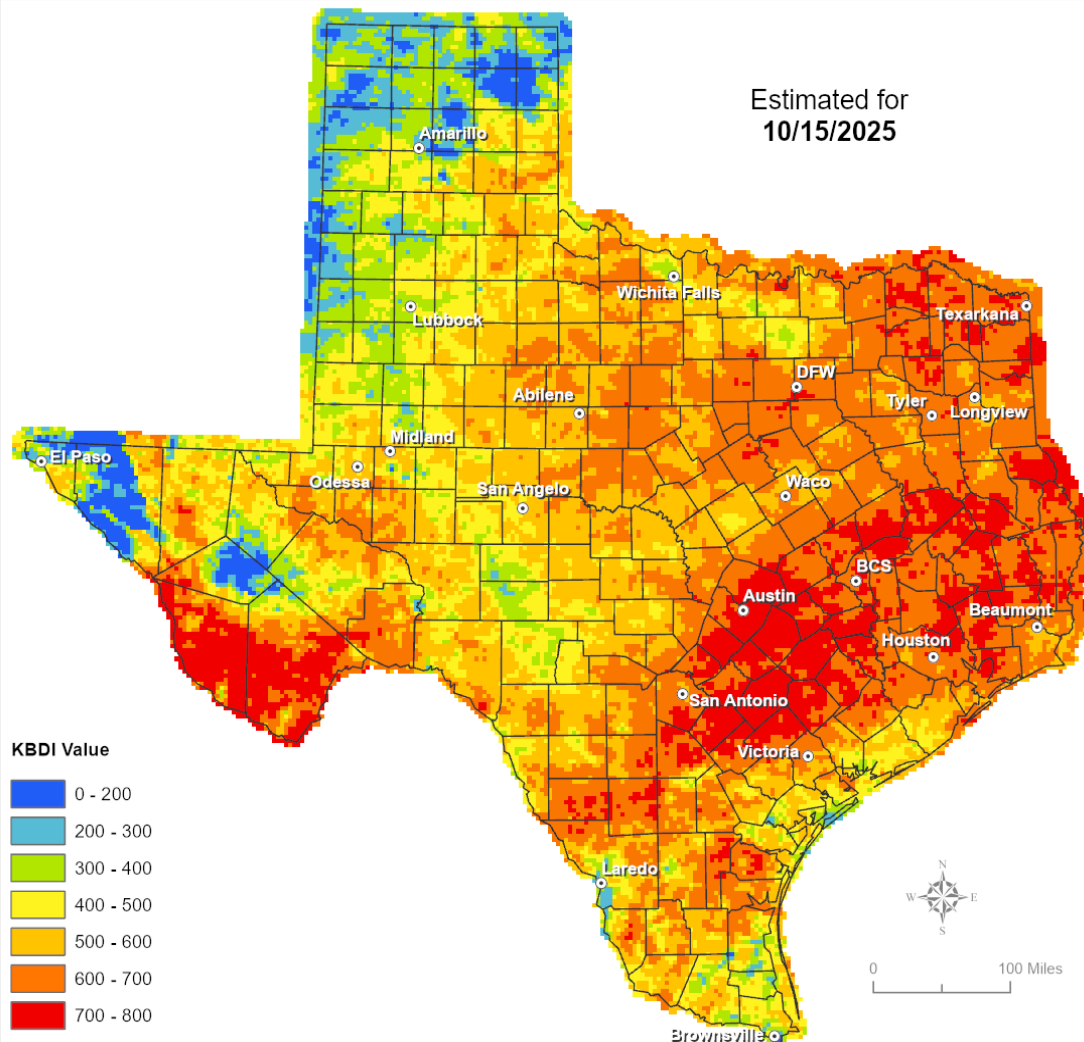

Keetch-Byram Drought Index

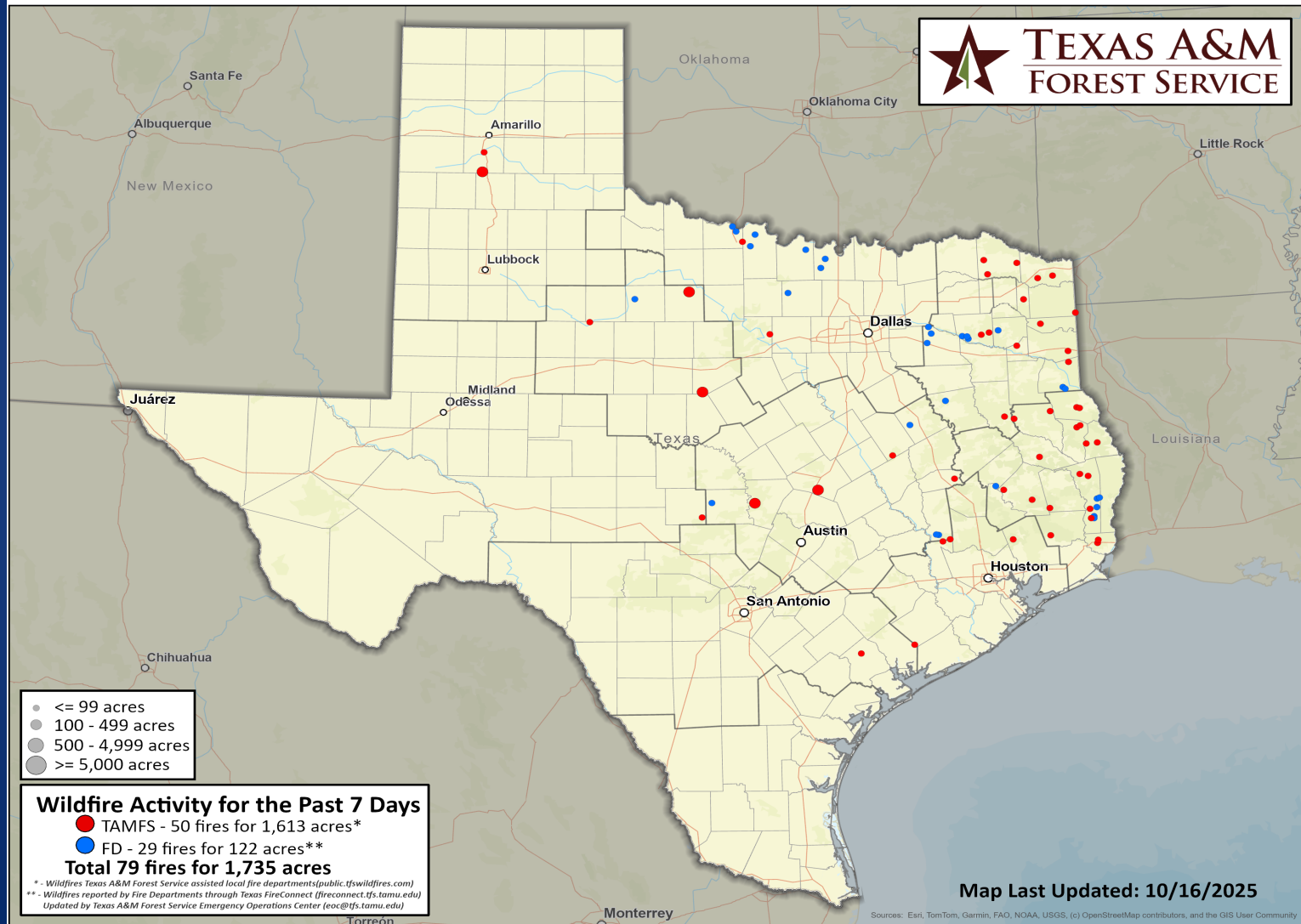
