




Wind Speeds




Some strong to severe storms are possible today. Large hail and damaging wind gusts are the primary hazards.



Thunderstorms will move east across North and Central Texas today associated with an approaching cold front. Some of these storms may be strong to severe, with the greatest severe potential being east of I-35. Remember to have multiple methods of receiving warnings and keep an eye on the skies!

There is a Slight Risk of severe thunderstorms across nearly all of our Four-State area beginning from roughly noon today until around midnight tonight. The primary threat is damaging winds, but the tornado threat has expanded slightly from previous forecasts. Large hail and localized flash flooding will also be possible.

Probability of severe weather within 25 mi of a point up to 29% or between 10 and 30 times greater than a non-risk weather day.



There is a slight risk for severe storms across northern portions of Jasper and Newton counties as well as Vernon, Rapides and Avoyelles parishes. There is a Marginal Risk (level 1 out of 5) for Severe Storms down to near the I-10 corridor for late Saturday afternoon into Saturday night. The main concern is the potential for damaging thunderstorm winds if a squall line can form ahead of a cold front.

#### **Isolated Strong to Severe Storms Possible Saturday**

- A weak disturbance moving through the area will trigger scattered showers and storms Saturday afternoon into Saturday night.
- → One or two strong to severe thunderstorms may develop.
- → A Marginal Risk (level 1 of 5) of severe weather is in place for areas generally north and east of Lake Livingston, but conditions are more favorable further to the northeast.

Isolated strong to severe storms are possible Saturday afternoon into Saturday night due to a passing weak disturbance. A Marginal Risk (Level 1 of 5) for severe weather is in place for areas generally north and east of Lake Livingston. Potential impacts include damaging wind gusts (up to 60 mph), with a lower chance of large hail or a brief tornado. Remain weather-aware!




Isolated to scattered showers and thunderstorms possible, mainly across the northern half of the area this morning






## **Fire Danger Forecast**



## **Burn Ban**


