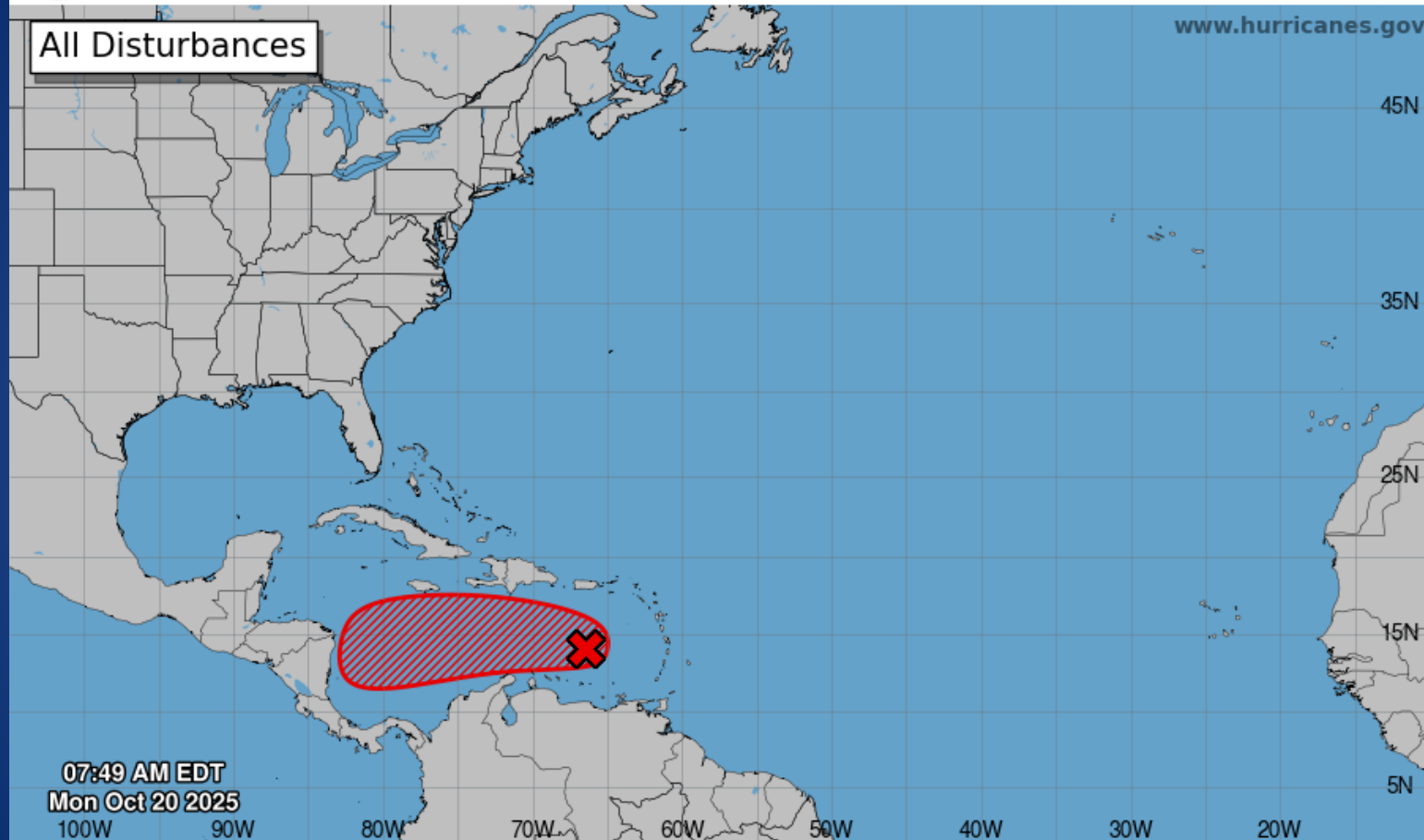
Seven-Day Graphical Tropical Weather Outlook

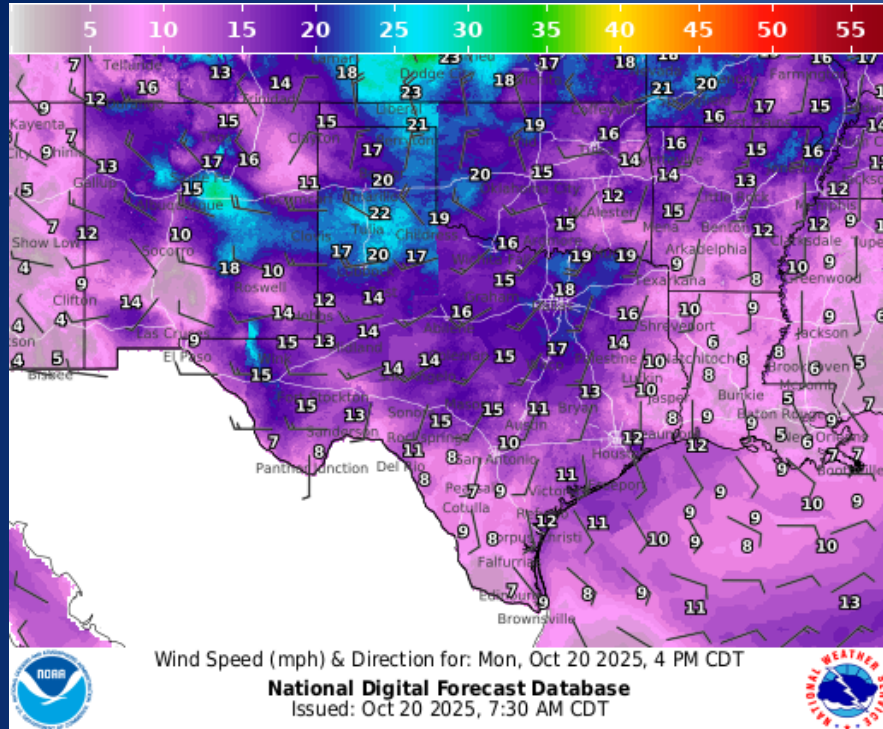

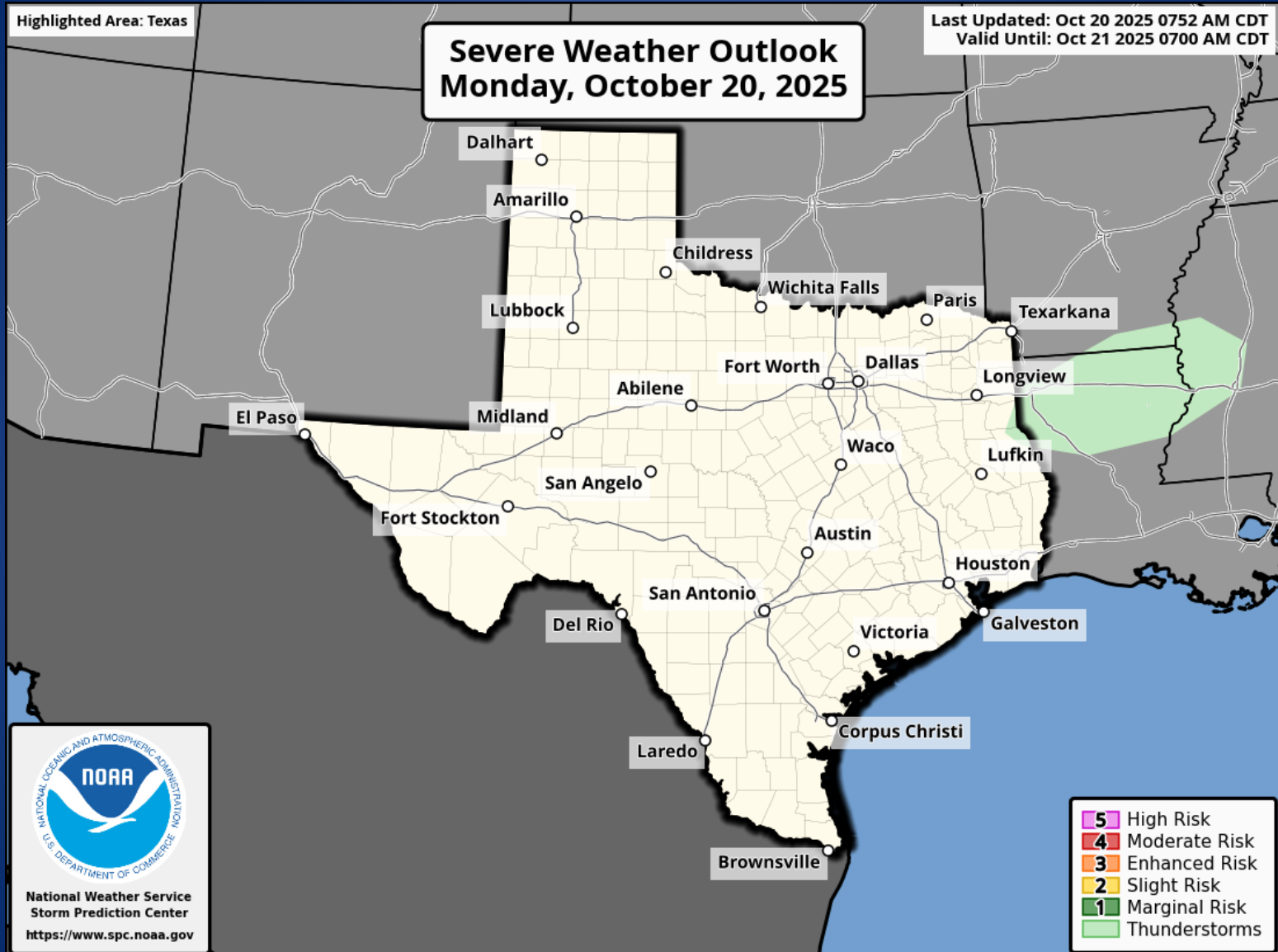


Wind Speeds

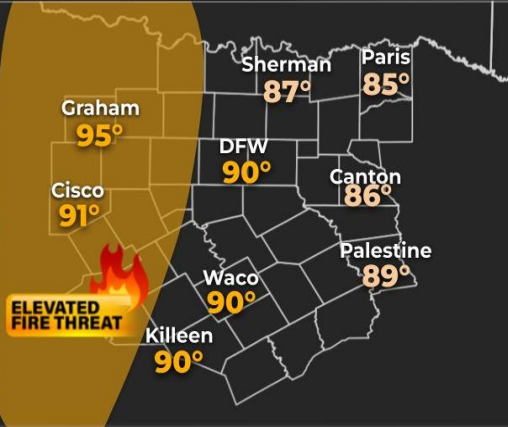

Avoid outside burning & do not toss cigarettes



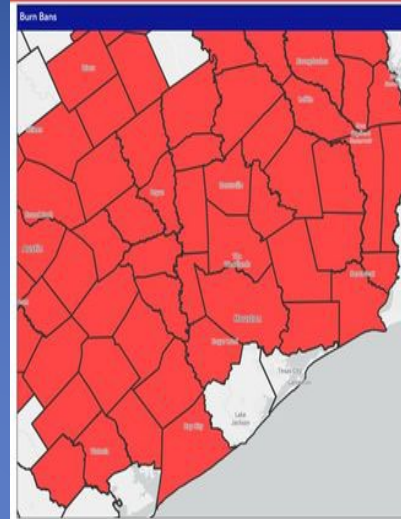

AVOID any activities that could spark a wildfire, as fires could spread rapidly



Do NOT leave a fire unattended or burn unnecessarily.



Secure tow chains to avoid dragging and sparking. NEVER park or drive over tall grass.



Contact law enforcement or the fire department if you smell smoke or see fire!



NEVER toss lit cigarettes on the ground!

Highs in the mid 80's to low 90s

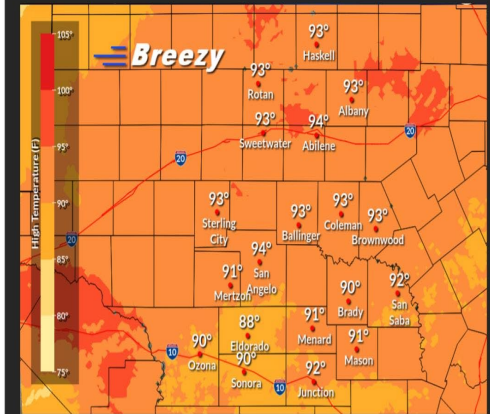


South-southeast winds of 10 to 15 mph with higher gusts

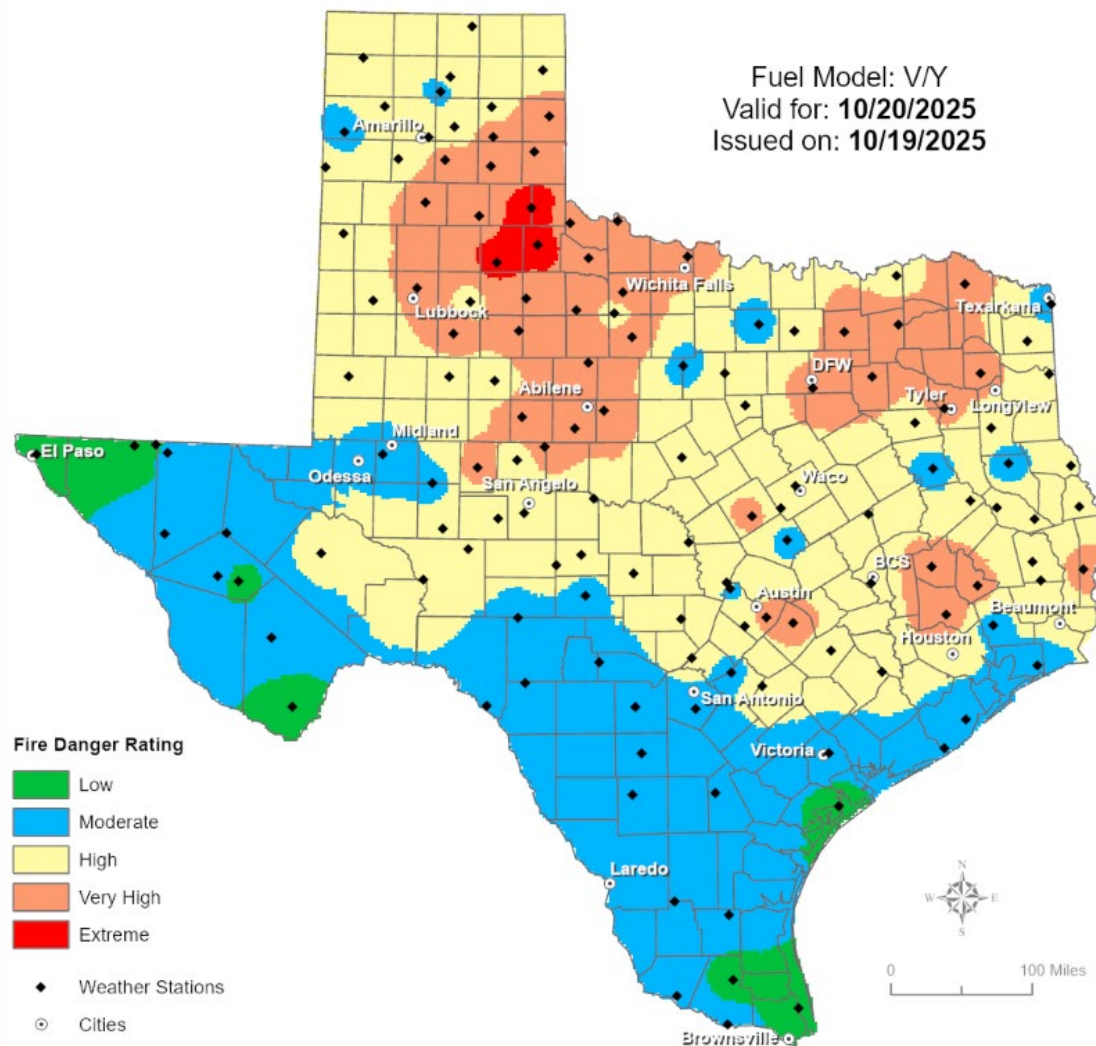

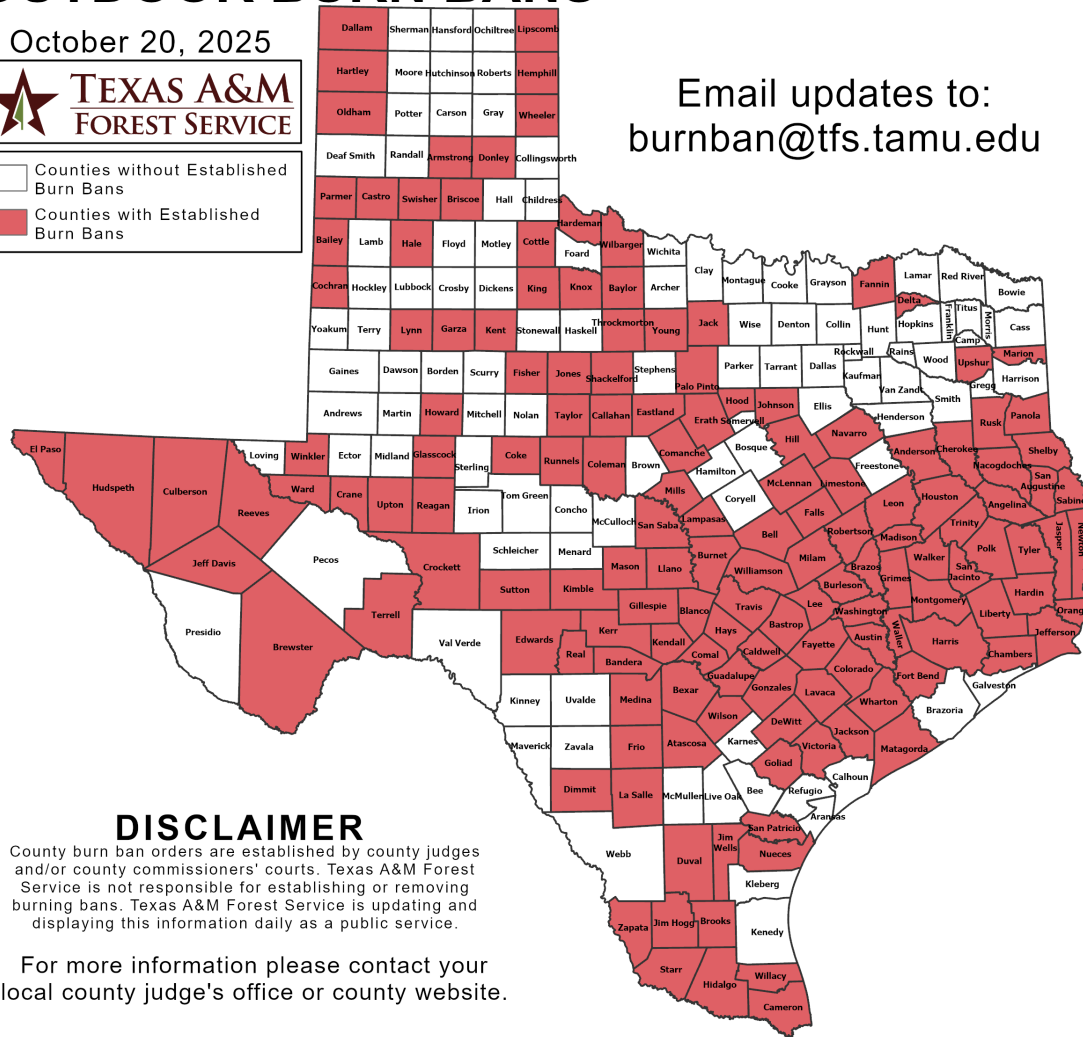

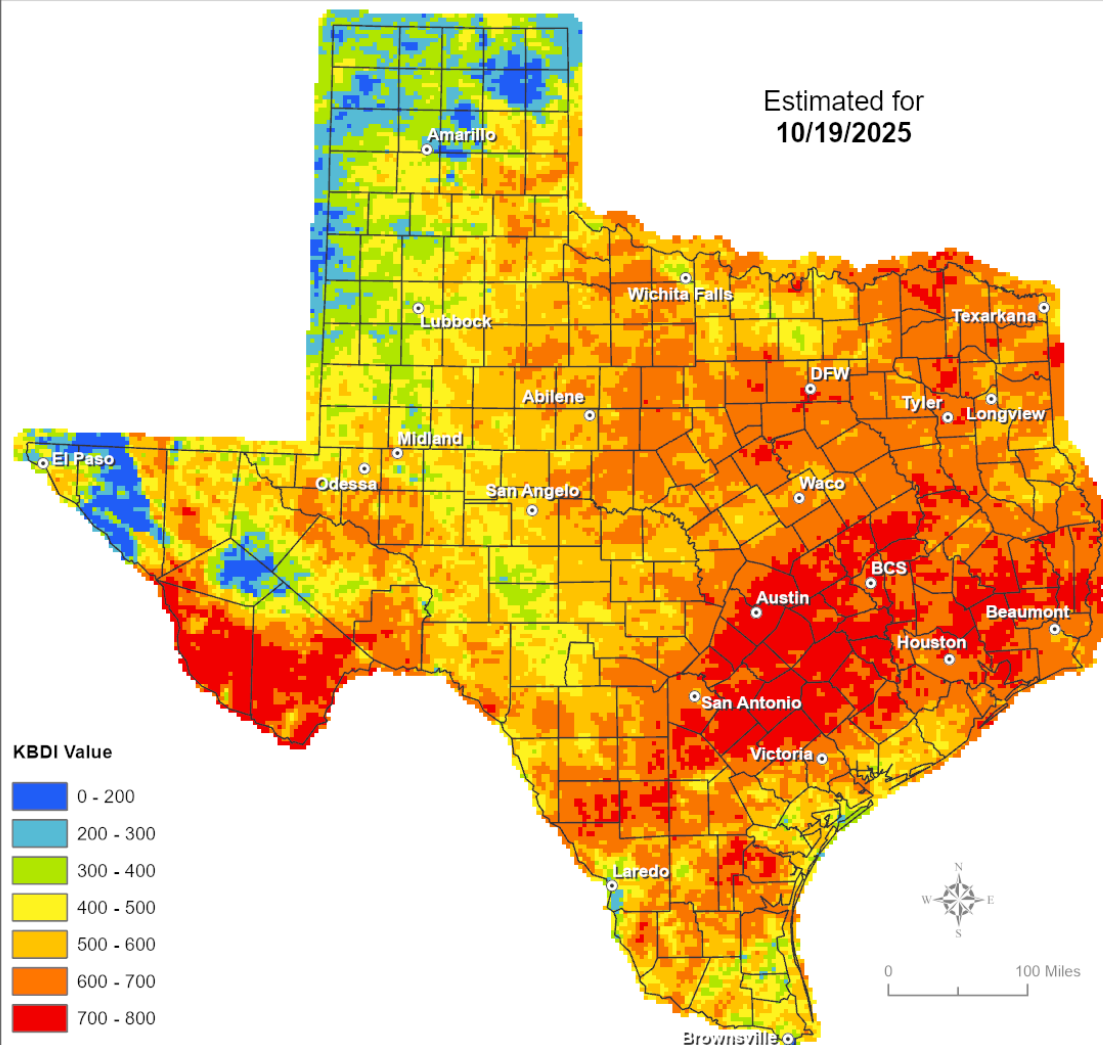

Keetch-Byram Drought Index

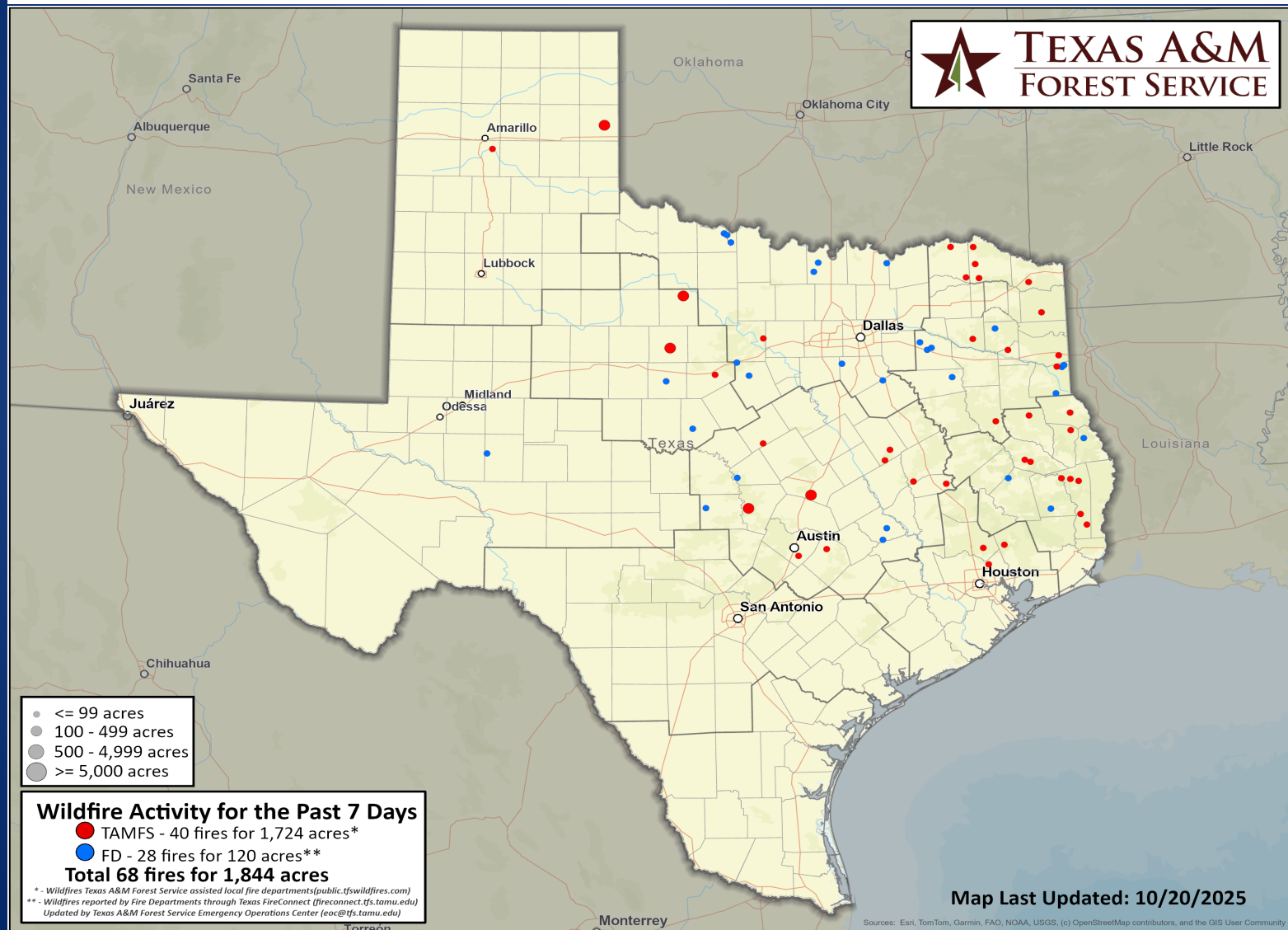
