Today's forecast continues to show a low (1 out of 5) chance of severe thunderstorms, primarily from late evening into the overnight hours. The main threats are large hail, potentially up to ping-pong ball size, and wind gusts up to 60 mph. While the risk of a tornado remains very low, it cannot be entirely discounted. Please stay updated with us for the latest information on this active weather event.




Isolated showers and storms may develop during the day today (20%) before chances increase mainly across the northwest this evening and overnight (20-60%). There is a low threat for a storm becoming severe with large hail and gusty winds. Most showers and storms will hold off until after midnight, but there is a low (10-20%) chance of isolated strong/severe storms in the late afternoon & evening (as early as ~4 PM) across the northwest.


A marginal risk for severe weather is expected Thursday, favoring Otero, Hudspeth, and El counties. The primary hazards will be damaging wind gusts.




Fire Danger Forecast

Keetch-Byram Drought Index


