Strong to severe thunderstorms are possible Friday afternoon into early Saturday morning with the threat for large hail and damaging wind gusts.




A line of showers and thunderstorms will move through North and Central TX overnight Friday night and will be accompanied by heavy rainfall and some severe weather. The severe threat will generally be strong winds and perhaps a tornado or two and will be greatest west of I-35. Heavy rainfall may result in some areas picking up 4 to 5 inches of rain through Saturday.

Storm System to Bring Heavy Rain This Weekend

FORECAST KEY POINTS

- Flash Flooding and severe weather possible this weekend
- An area of low pressure moving across northeast Texas and northern Louisiana will produce thunderstorms across the region Friday night through Sunday Morning
- Rainfall totals of two to four inches are expected with higher amounts locally.
 Nuisance street flooding in low and poorly drained areas are possible




