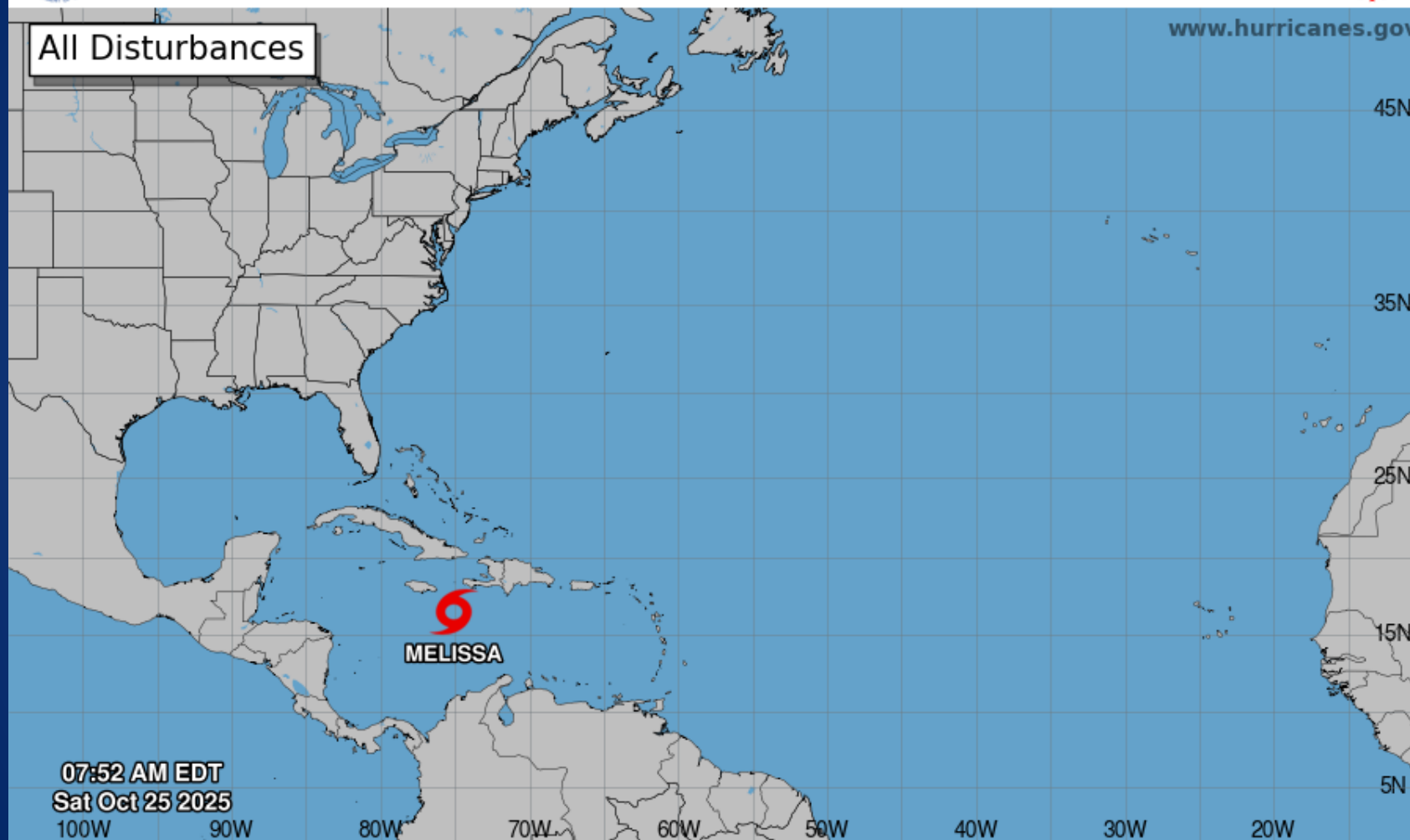
Seven-Day Graphical Tropical Weather Outlook

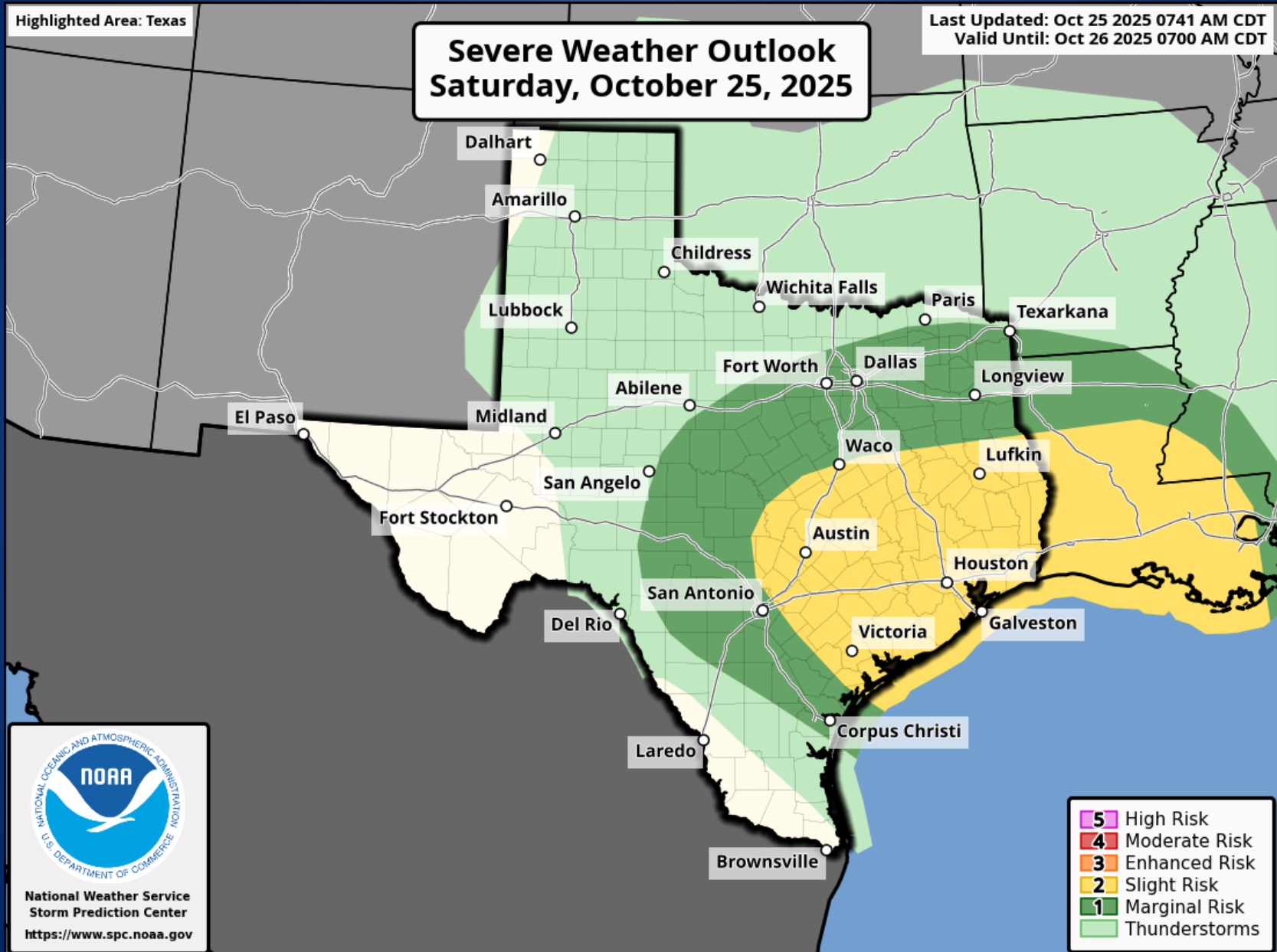

A lull in precipitation will occur this morning before additional scattered activity develops later in the day. A few storms may become strong to severe mainly across Central TX with large hail, damaging winds, and a low but non-zero tornado threat. Areas along and south of HWY 84 will have the greatest hail threat. Locally heavy rain with these storms may also produce instances of flooding, especially in areas that received higher rainfall last night.

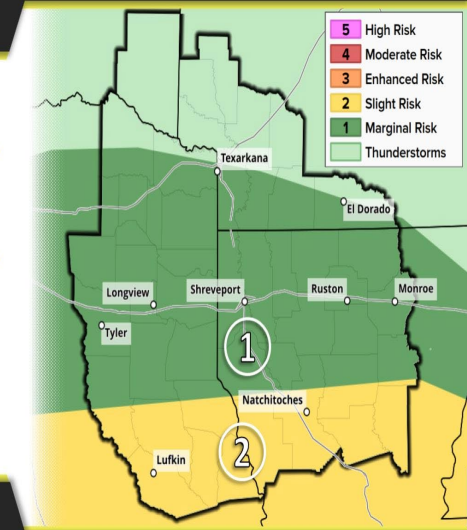

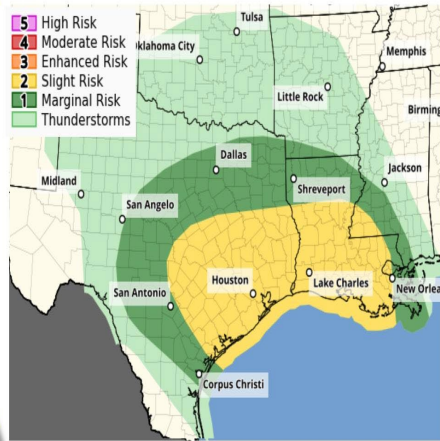
- Chances exist for all modes of severe weather

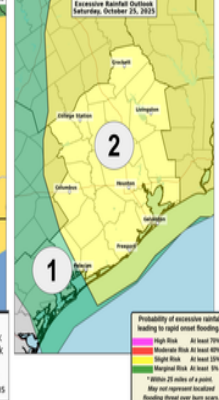

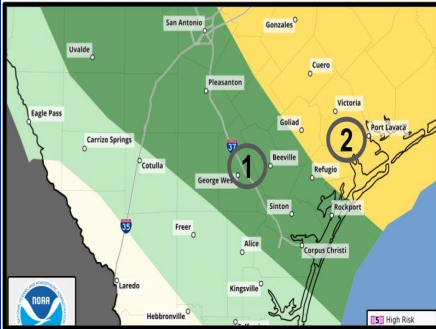

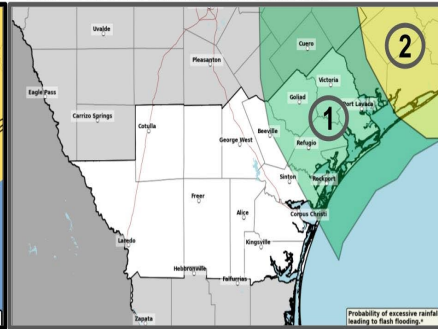

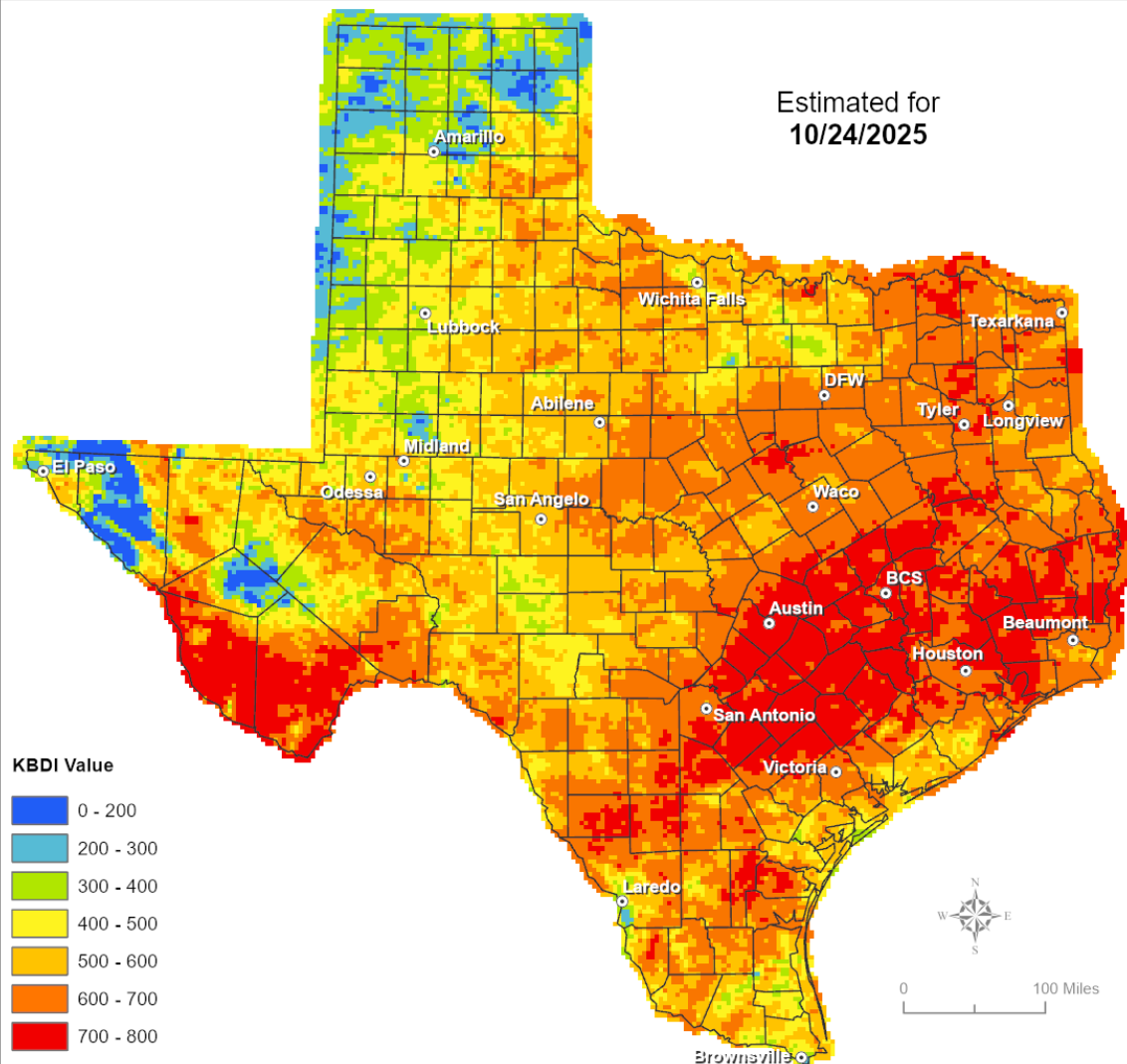

Keetch-Byram Drought Index

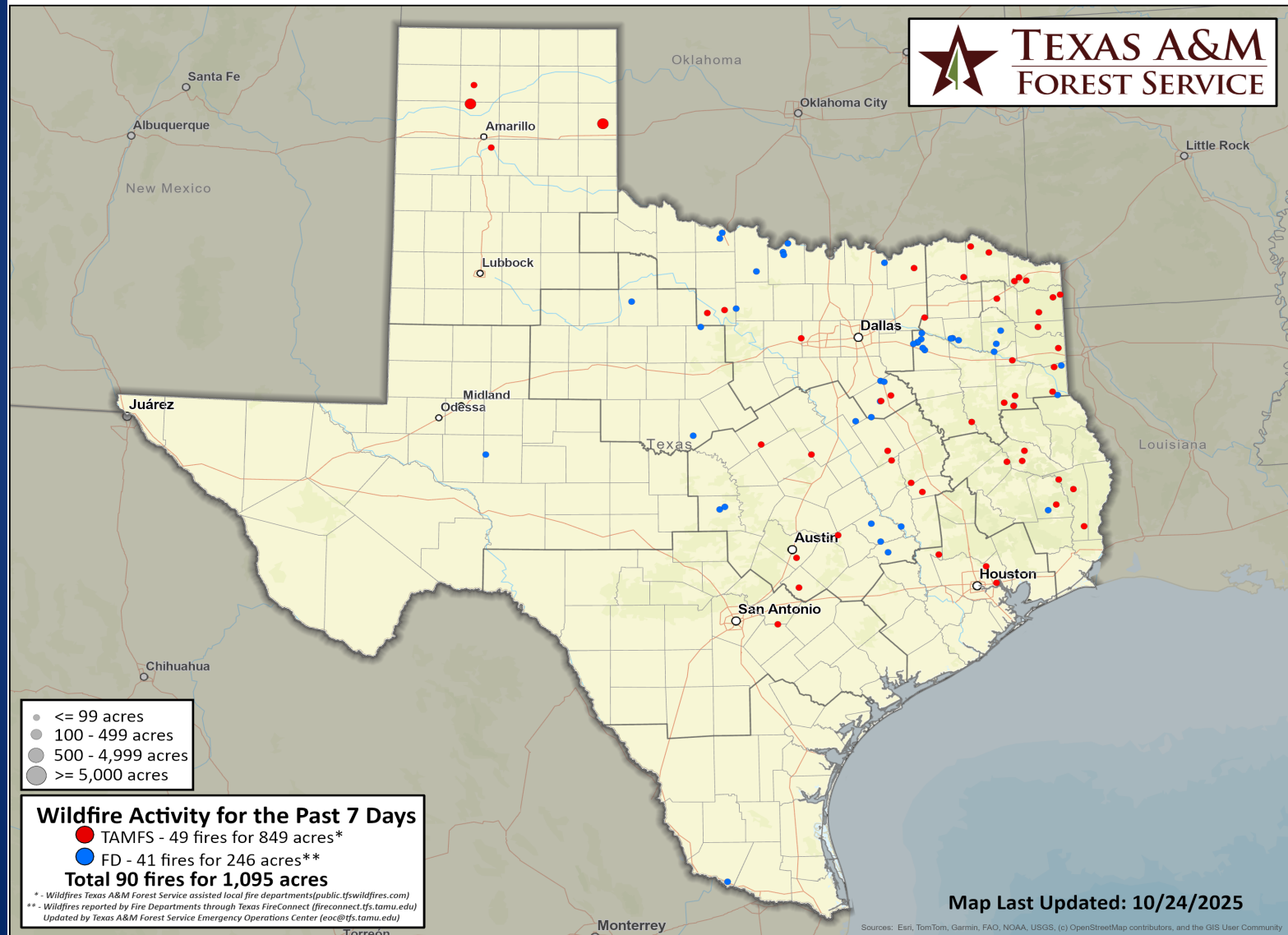
