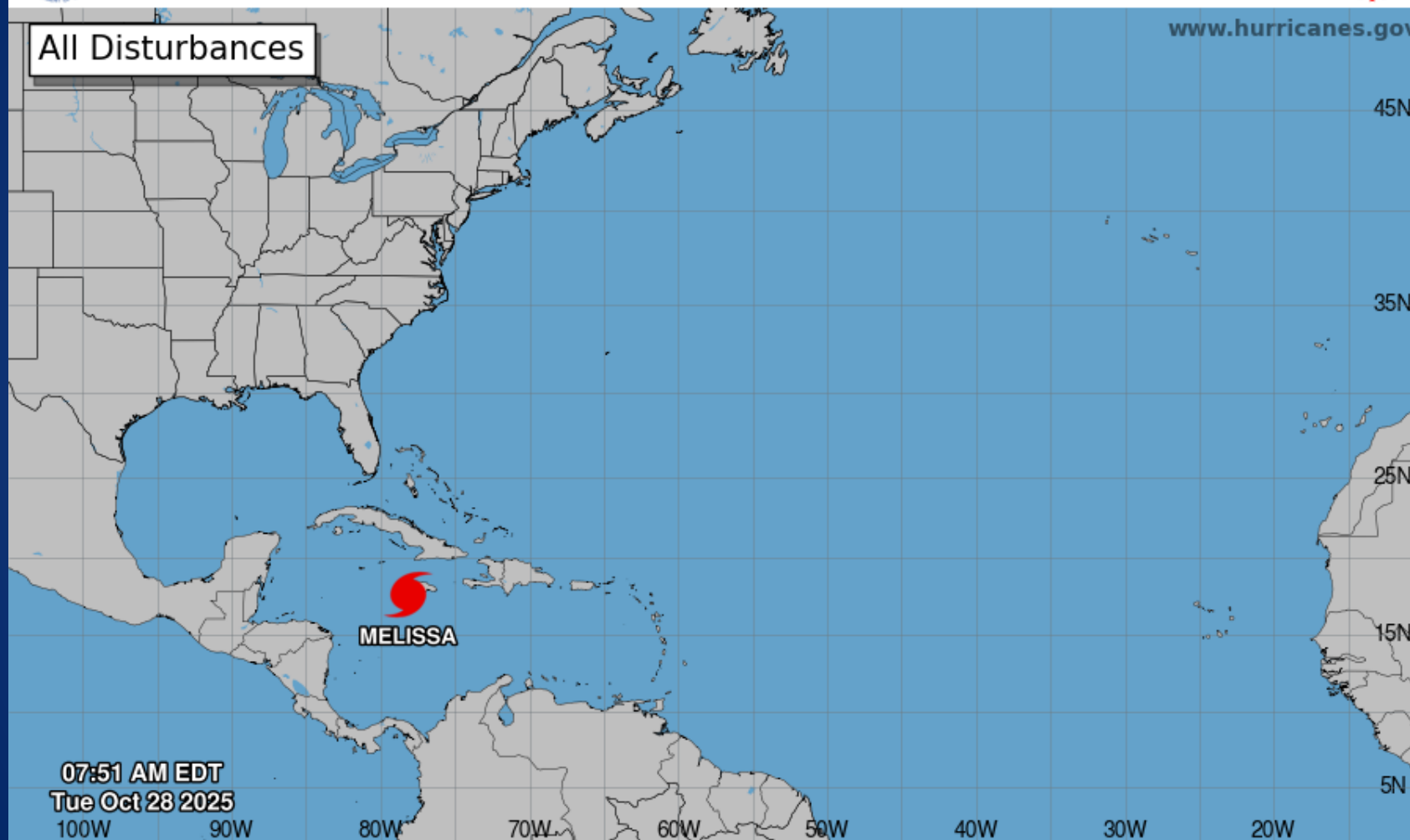
Seven-Day Graphical Tropical Weather Outlook

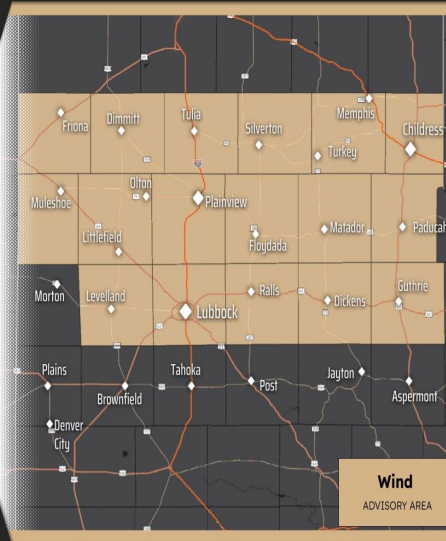

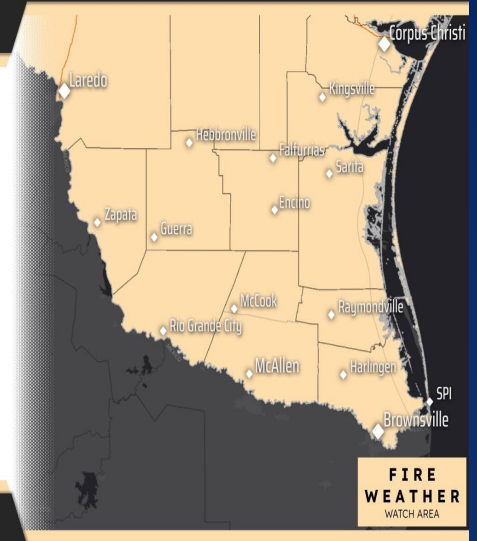

The combination of strong north winds, very low humidity, rapidly drying grasses and brush, and warm temperatures (70s to lower 80s) will produce high to potentially extreme fire weather conditions on Wednesday. Most critical times will be from mid morning to late afternoon. Farmers, ranchers, and others should avoid any activity that could create sparks that produces a rapidly spreading wildfire.

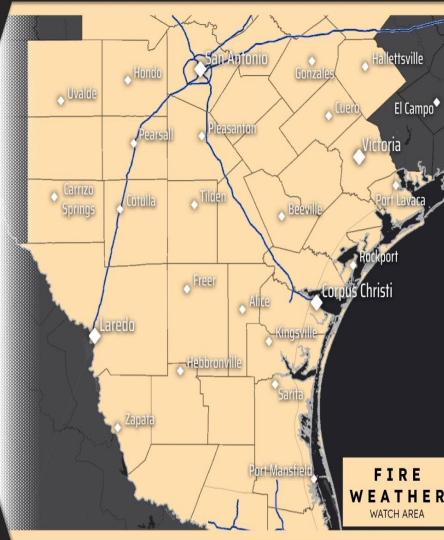

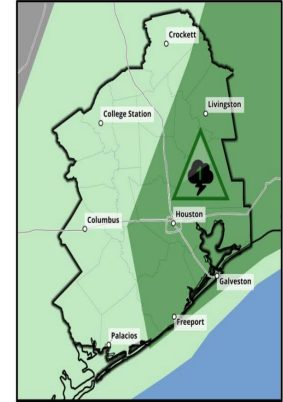

Strong winds arrive with today's front and will continue through Wednesday. A Wind Advisory is in effect for much of North and Central TX from 12 PM Tuesday through 6 PM Wednesday. Peak wind gusts will be around 35 to 45 mph with sustained winds out of the northwest around 20 to 30 mph. If you haven't already, secure lightweight outdoor objects NOW, before the front arrives. This includes your Halloween decorations! Take extra caution when driving, especially in high profile vehicles or on west-east roads.

A High Wind Warning has been issued for the Guadalupe and Delaware Mountains (including Carlsbad Caverns) as high gap winds are expected. The warning will remain in effect from 9 AM CDT/ 8 AM MDT this morning through 10 AM CDT/ 9 AM MDT Wednesday morning. Be sure to exercise caution when driving in these areas today if travel cannot be delayed.

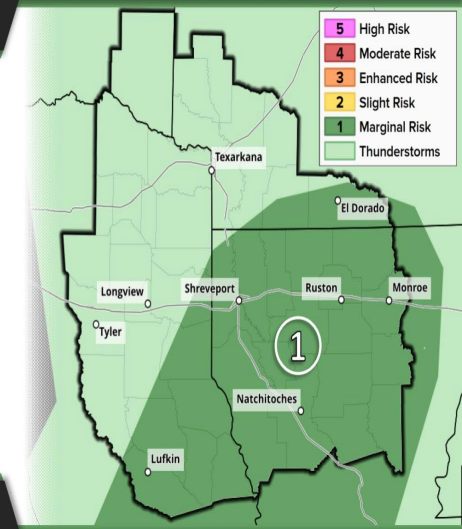


Highest Risk for Severe Storms across Deep East Texas into Northern Louisiana and extreme Southern Arkansas

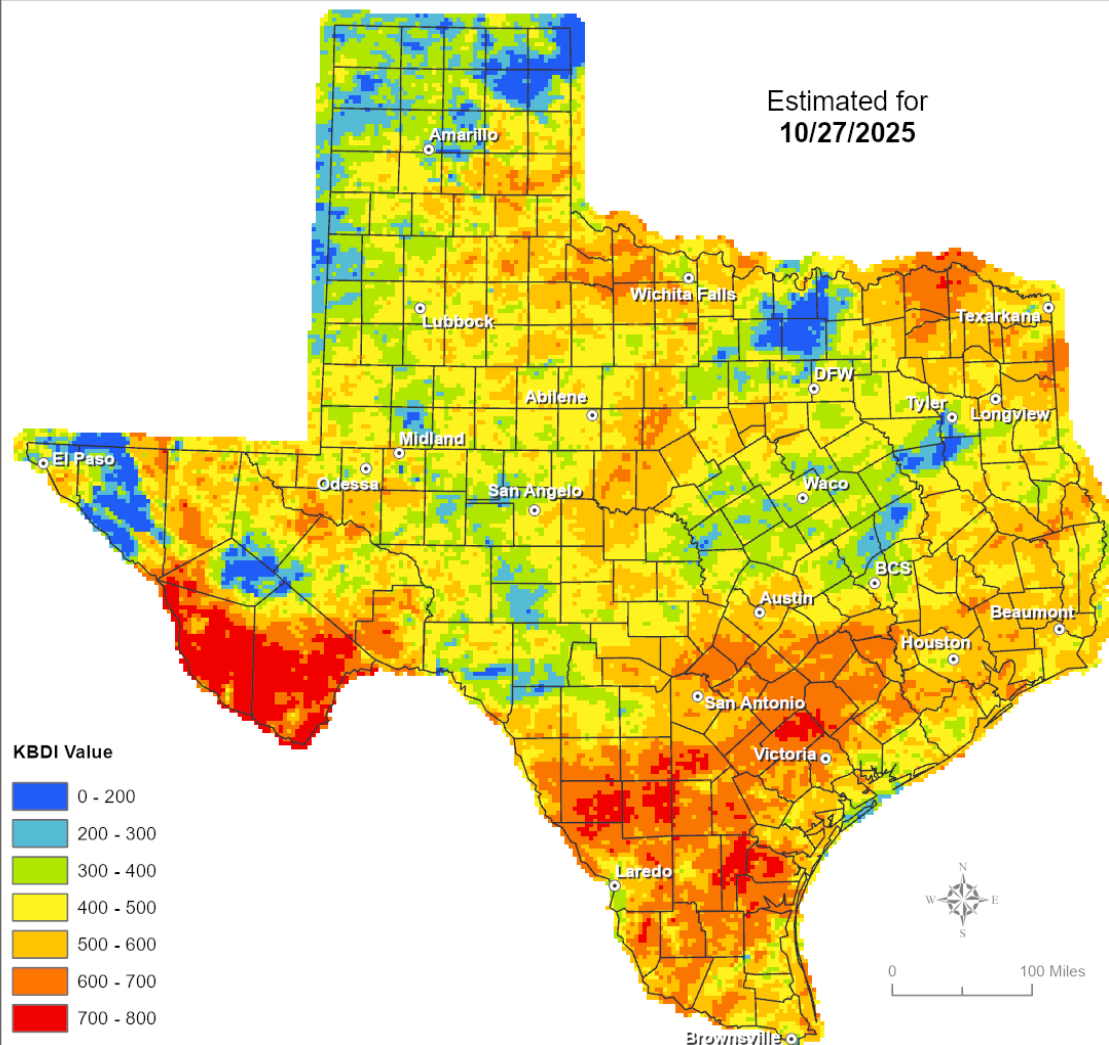
