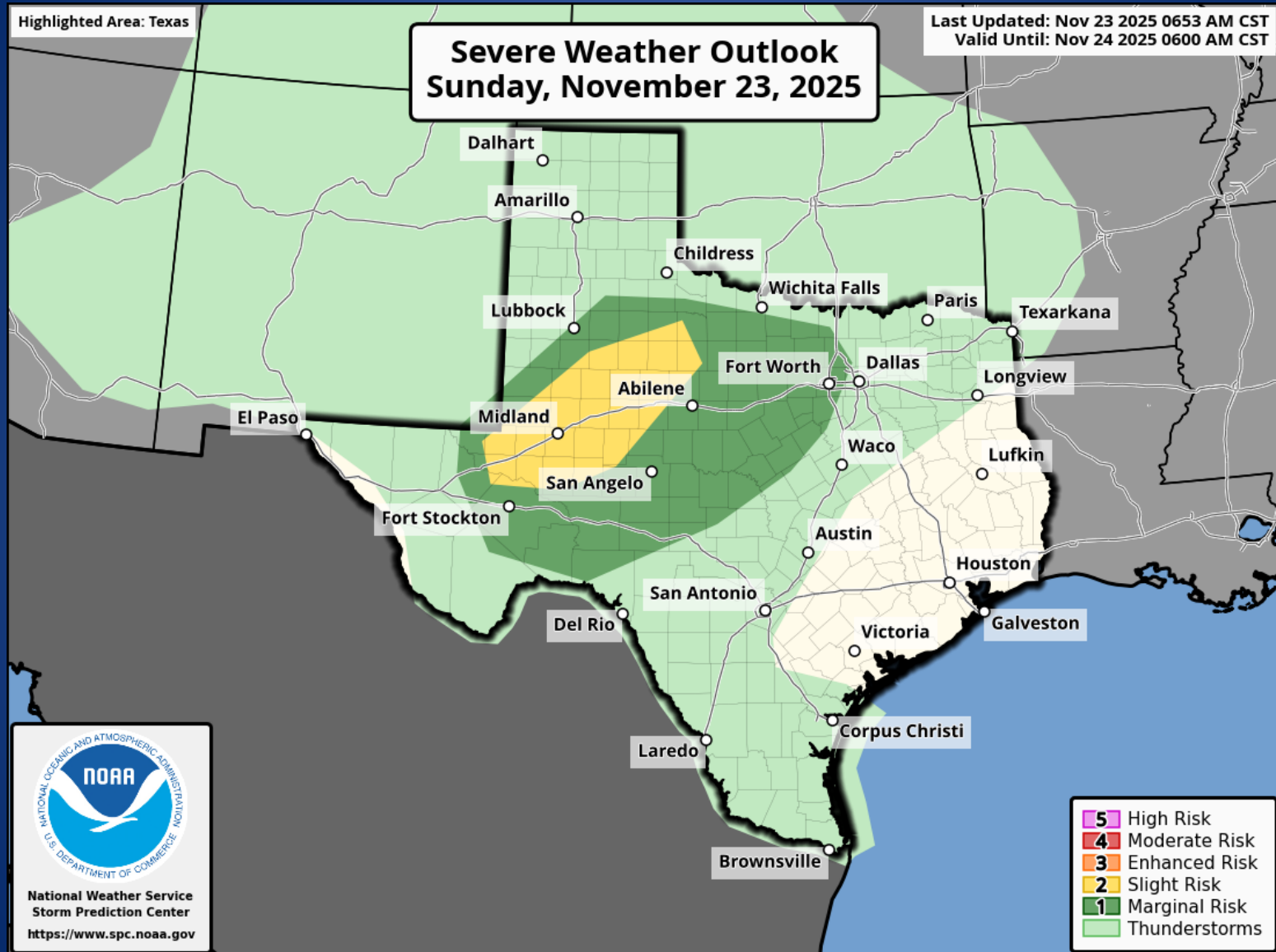

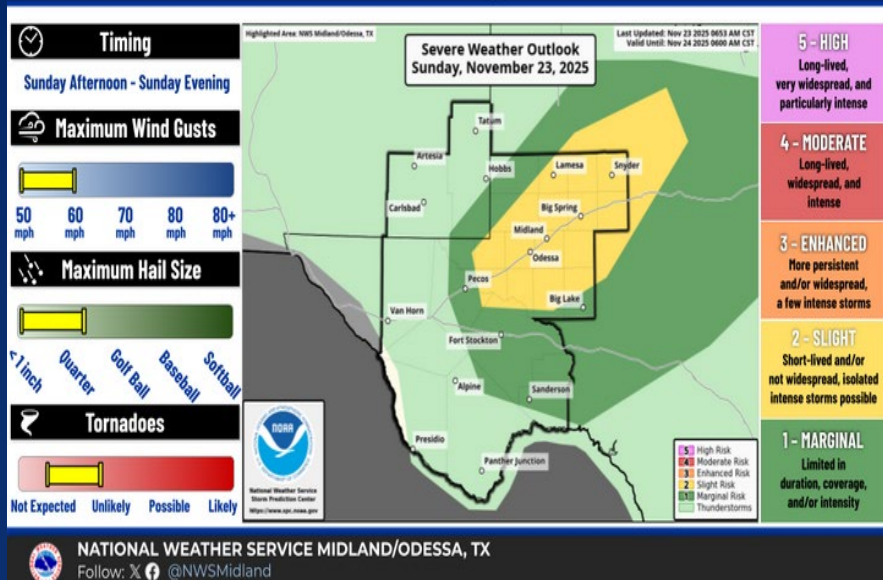


A few severe storms are possible on Sunday afternoon, mainly over the Rolling Plains. Large hail up to quarter size will be the primary hazard.

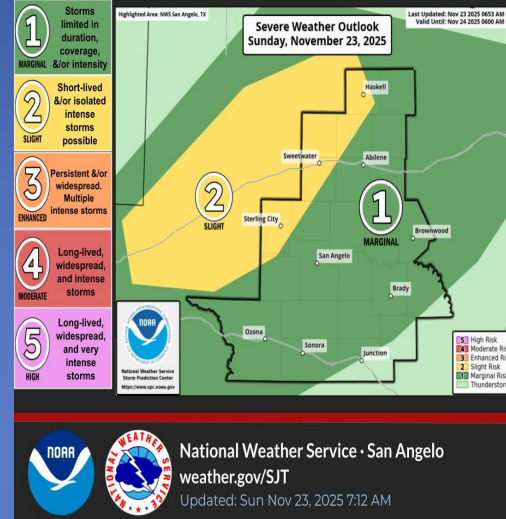

Highest Local Risk: **Slight** (Risk Level 2 out of 5)

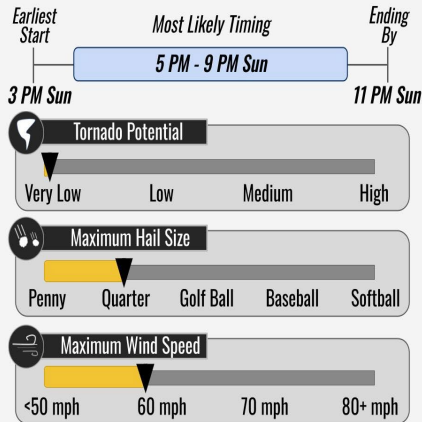
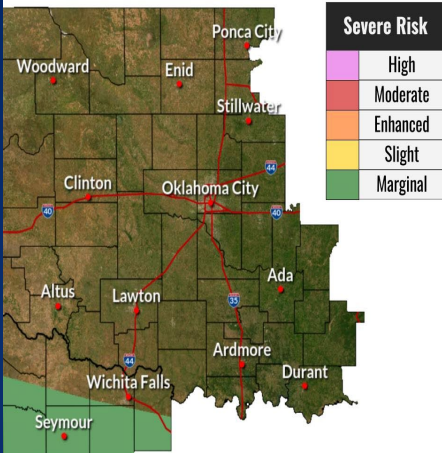


There is a Slight to Marginal Risk for severe storms this afternoon into tonight. The main hazards will be large hail, damaging winds, and heavy rainfall.

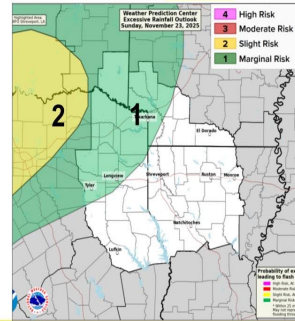
A few strong to severe storms could develop late this afternoon/evening in parts of western north Texas. Large hail will be the primary concern.

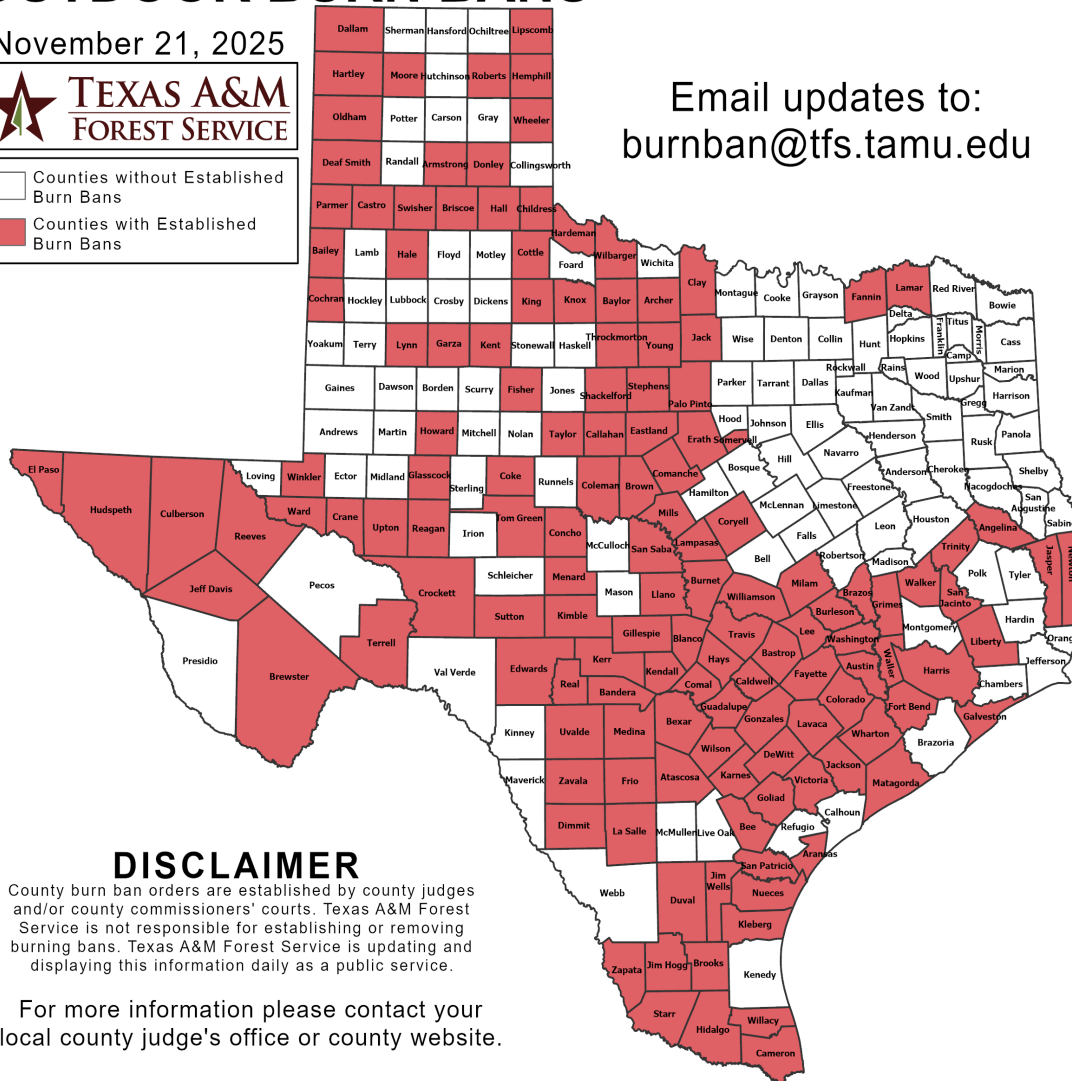

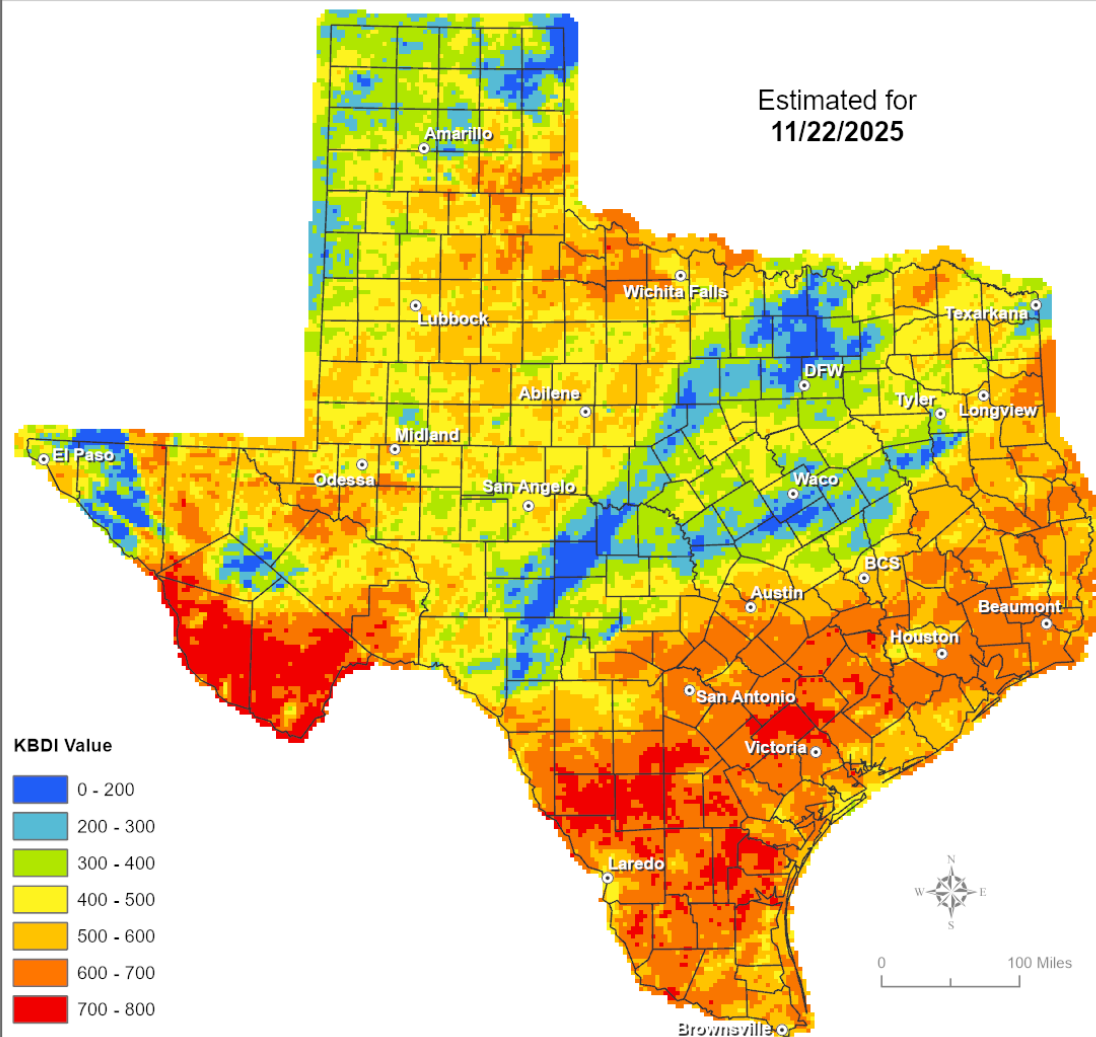

Keetch-Byram Drought Index

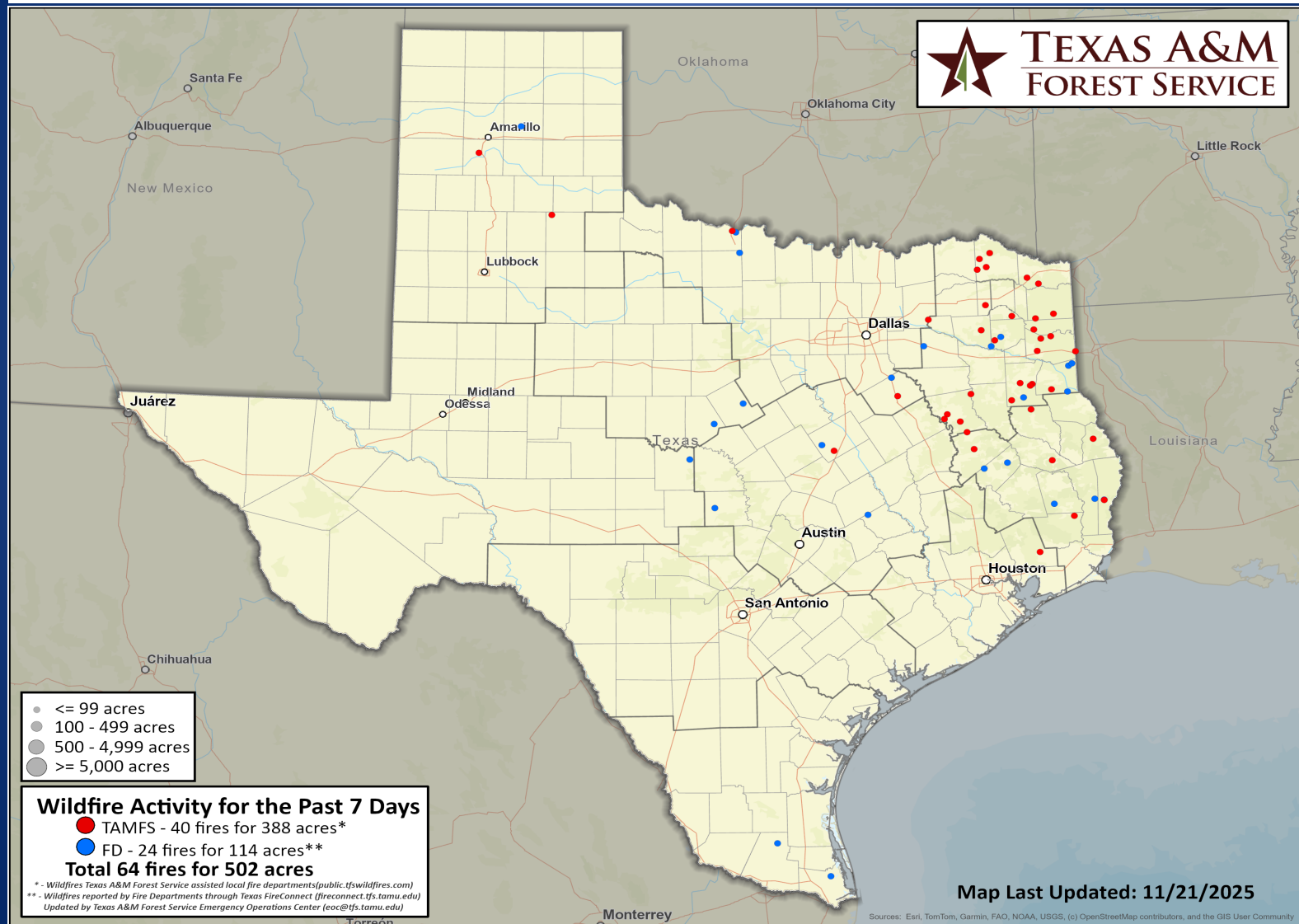

Report of 781 (no change) fires and 99.934 (no change) acres have been burned this year. There are 141 (no change) counties with burn bans. The Keetch–Byram Drought Index list contains 195 (-39) counties with an average over 400.
