





A few severe storms are possible on Sunday afternoon, mainly over the Rolling Plains. Large hail up to quarter size will be the primary hazard.



There's a Marginal (1 of 5) Risk for severe thunderstorms Sunday afternoon and evening. The strongest storms will be capable of producing hail up to the size of quarters, damaging wind gusts, and heavy rainfall.!



There is a Slight to Marginal Risk for severe storms this afternoon into tonight. The main hazards will be large hail, damaging winds, and heavy rainfall.




A few strong to severe storms could develop late this afternoon/evening in parts of western north Texas. Large hail will be the primary concern.

There is a Marginal Risk of excessive heavy rainfall and urban flooding starting across portions of our Four State area late Sunday, elevating to a Slight Risk across our Four State area through Monday & Monday night.




Fire Danger Forecast



Burn Ban




Keetch-Byram Drought Index
