Breezy south winds today will be strong, particularly around and coastward of I-10. Drivers of high-profile vehicles will need to be prepared for difficulty added by these winds when driving on east-west roads and highways. If you have loose, lightweight objects outdoors, be sure to secure them this morning! In the advisory area, expect winds of 15-25 mph, with gusts as high as 35 mph.

Another very warm, dry, and breezy day will result in elevated fire weather conditions, mainly over western portions of the Caprock. A Fire Danger Statement is in effect from 10 AM to 7 PM for areas near the TX/NM state line.



- Humidity: 10% to 15%
- Winds: From the west 15 to 20 MPH with gusts to 25 MPH
- Temperatures: Upper 80s to Lower 90s

Dry conditions and breezy winds will combine with plentiful dry fuels to bring elevated to near critical fire weather risk today across much of the area.
