




Wednesday's Severe Storm Potential



The severe weather threat will ramp up this afternoon and evening with large hail (less than 2") and damaging winds (up to 65 mph) the main threats. Although the tornado potential will remain low, one cannot be completely ruled out. Prior to the severe weather threat, a few showers and isolated storms may develop this morning. The severe weather threat will taper off this evening as the stalled front retreats north as a warm front.

Severe Thunderstorm Outlook for Today

Highest Local Risk: **Marginal** (Risk Level 1 out of 5)



i Isolated to scattered thunderstorms are expected across much of the area, with the strongest storms across our eastern counties. The stronger storms will be capable of producing hail, gusty winds, frequent lightning and brief heavy rainfall.





Keetch-Byram Drought Index


