STATEWIDE CURRENT SITUATION: On March 4, Governor Greg Abbott announced that he directed the Texas Division of Emergency Management (TDEM) to activate state emergency response resources ahead of a severe weather threat expected to impact portions of Texas beginning March 4 and continuing through the weekend.

OPERATIONAL PRIORITIES:

1. Protect life and property.
2. Support rapid & effective response.
3. Collect and disseminate accurate incident information to improve decision-making.
4. Accurately track incident costs associated with assigned resources for cost recovery.

Region 1 (Includes DDs 1, 2, and 7)

DD 1 – Amarillo (Includes Armstrong, Briscoe, Carson, Castro, Childress, Collingsworth, Dallam, Deaf Smith, Donley, Gray, Hall, Hansford, Hartley, Hemphill, Hutchinson,

Lipscomb, Moore, Ochiltree, Oldham, Parmer, Potter, Randall, Roberts, Sherman, Swisher, and Wheeler Counties.) DDEOC 1 – Amarillo activated to Level III (Increased Readiness Conditions) on March 8.

DD 2 – Lubbock (Includes Bailey, Cochran, Crosby, Dickens, Floyd, Garza, Hale, Hockley, King, Lamb, Lubbock, Lynn, Motley, Terry, and Yoakum Counties) DDEOC 2 activated to Level III on March 10.

DD 7 – Abilene (Includes Brown, Callahan, Coleman, Comanche, Eastland, Fisher, Haskell, Jones, Kent, Knox, Mitchell, Nolan, Runnels, Scurry, Shackelford, Stephens, Stonewall, Throckmorton, and Taylor Counties) [DDEOC 7 returned to Level IV \(Normal Conditions\) on March 11.](#)

Region 3 (Includes DDs 5, 6, 14, and 15)

DD 5 – Mt. Pleasant (Includes Bowie, Cass, Delta, Franklin, Hopkins, Lamar, Morris, Red River, and Titus Counties) DDEOC 5 – Mt. Pleasant activated to Level III (Increased Readiness Conditions) on March 10.

DD 6 – Tyler (Includes Anderson, Camp, Cherokee, Gregg, Harrison, Henderson, Marion, Panola, Rains, Rusk, Smith, Upshur, Van Zandt, and Wood Counties) DDEOC 6 activated to Level III (Increased Readiness Conditions) on March 6.

Region 6 (Includes DDs 17, 18, and 24)

DD 18 – San Antonio (Includes Atascosa, Bandera, Bexar, Comal, Frio, Gillespie, Guadalupe, Karnes, Kendall, Kerr, McMullen, Medina, and Wilson Counties) [DDEOC 18 returned to Level IV \(Normal Operations\) on March 11.](#)

DD 24 – Del Rio (Includes Dimmit, Edwards, La Salle, Kinney, Maverick, Real, Uvalde, Val Verde, and Zavala Counties) [DDEOC 24 returned to Level IV \(Normal Operations\) on March 11.](#)

Region 8 (Includes DDs 11, 12, 13, and 23)

DD 11 – Waco (Includes Bosque, Falls, Freestone, Hill, Limestone, and McLennan Counties): [DDEOC 11 returned to Level IV \(Normal Operations\) on March 11.](#)

DD 12 – Austin (Includes Bastrop, Blanco, Burnet, Caldwell, Fayette, Hays, Lee, Llano, Travis, and Williamson Counties) [DDEOC 12 returned to Level IV \(Normal Conditions\) on March 11.](#)

DD 13 – Bryan (Includes Brazos, Burleson, Grimes, Leon, Madison, Robertson, and Washington Counties) DDEOC 13 returned to Level IV (Normal Conditions) on March 11.

DD 23 – Killeen (Includes Bell, Coryell, Hamilton, Lampasas, Milam, Mills, San Saba) DDEOC 23 returned to Level IV (Normal Operations) on March 11.

RESPONDING STATE AGENCIES/ORGANIZATIONS REPORTS

Texas A&M Engineering Extension Service Texas Task Force 1 (TEEX/TX-TF1):

On March 7-8, TX-TF1 relocated water squads (WS) for storm concentrations in the San Antonio, Victoria, and Houston corridor, and assigned four Helicopter Search and Rescue Technicians (HSART). On March 5, TX-TF1 relocated three of eight activated WSs to match the predicted weather threat. A TX-TF1 Type 3 Urban Search and Rescue (US&R) Team is also assigned.

Texas A&M Engineering Extension Service Texas Task Force 2 (TEEX/TX-TF2):

On March 4, TX-TF2 activated a Type 3 US&R Team.

Texas A&M Engineering Extension Service Texas Task Force 3 (TEEX/TX-TF3):

On March 7, TX-TF3 activated one WS.

Texas A&M Forest Service (TAMFS):

The Texas A&M Forest Service has activated two Texas Intrastate Fire Mutual Aid System (TIFMAS) All-hazard Strike Teams (ST) in response to forecasted severe weather. The STs are currently located in [Lubbock and Amarillo](#). In total, TAMFS has 41 personnel committed to the event.

Texas Military Department (TMD):

TMD is supporting state agency partners for potential severe weather. TMD has activated two Ground Transportation Platoons (GTP), one Ground Transportation Headquarters (GTC HQ), two Military District Coordinators (MDC), 1.5 Rotary Wing Mission Ready Packages (MRP) with crews to include two UH-60s, a CH-47, and two Liaison Officers (LNO) in the SOC. TMD has also activated a SOC Support MRP. TMD has activated 62 personnel, three aircraft, and 13 vehicles.

Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD):

TPWD has Texas Game Wardens and State Park Police Officers prepared to respond and support operations.

Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT):

As of [March 11](#), there were no roadways closed or impacted due to weather or wildfires. TxDOT has an Emergency Management Coordinator (EMC) and a State Operations Center (SOC) Liaison Officer (LNO) supporting in Austin. TxDOT continues to coordinate with Texas A&M Forest Service (TAMFS) for Dynamic Message Sign (DMS) wildfire messaging, if needed.

Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS):

[The Kerr County Severe Weather Package \(SWX PKG\) has been repositioned to Lubbock County, and the Comanche County SWX PKG has been moved to Randall County.](#)

Texas Emergency Medical Task Force (EMTF):

As of March 5, DSHS EMTF activated a State Coordination Officer (SCO) and Liaison Officer (LNO). Two severe weather packages have been activated and staged.
