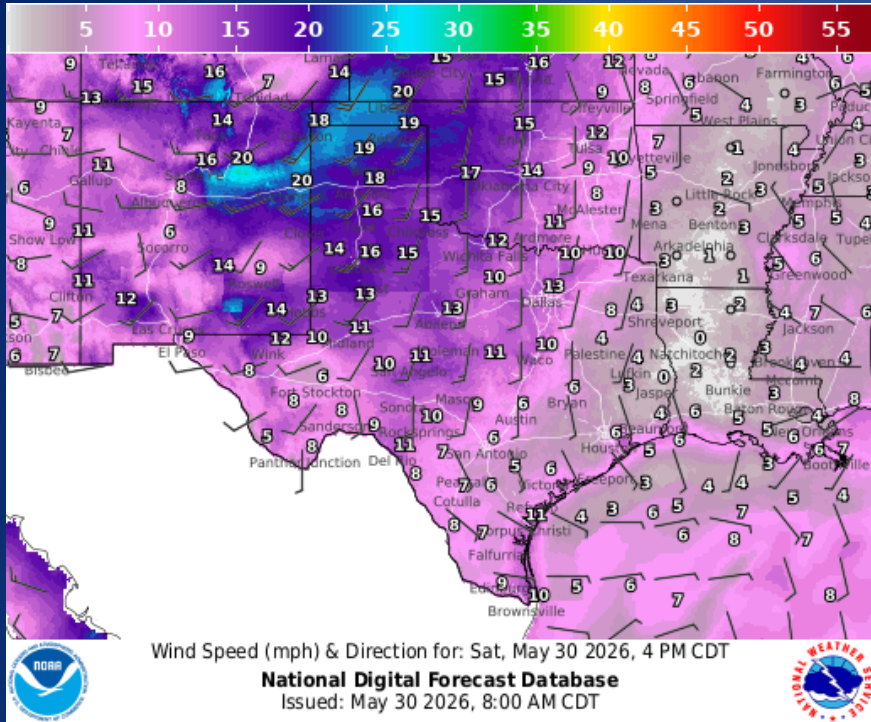

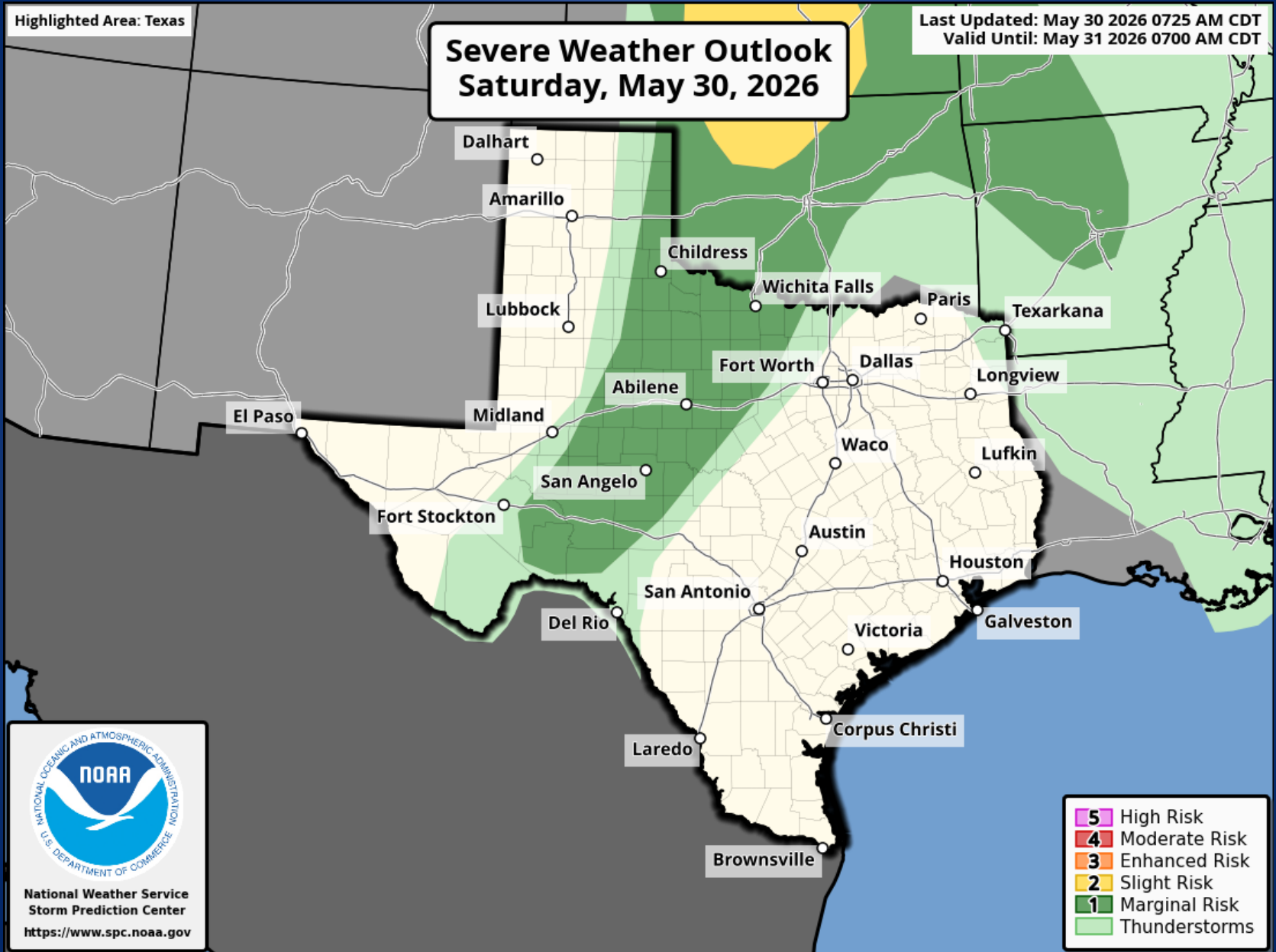


Wind Speeds

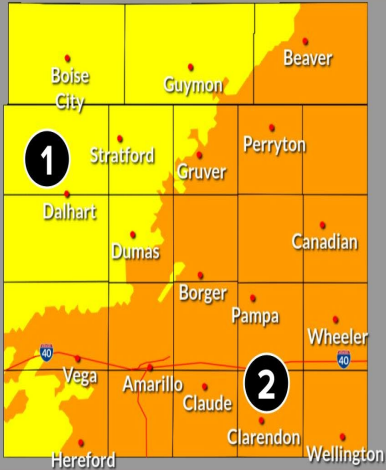

Max Heat Risk: Mainly Sun & Mon



What Does This Mean?

- 1 - Minor:** Minor risk of heat-related impacts, primarily those susceptible to being affected by heat
- 2 - Moderate:** Moderate risk of heat-related impacts, primarily those susceptible to being affected by heat
- 3 - Major:** Major risk of heat-related impacts for anyone without effective cooling and/or hydration
- 4 - Extreme:** Extreme risk of heat-related impacts for anyone without effective cooling and/or hydration

Be Prepared!



- Heat related illnesses are possible
- Limit outdoor activities to the early morning or evening
- Stay hydrated!



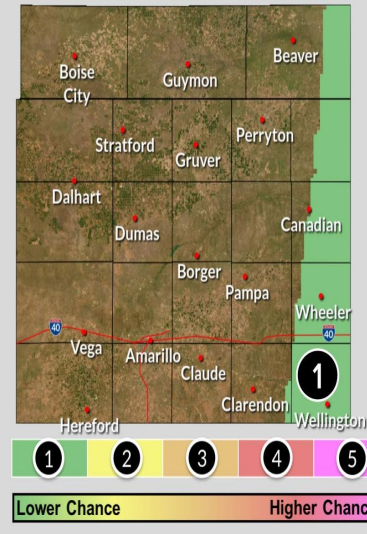

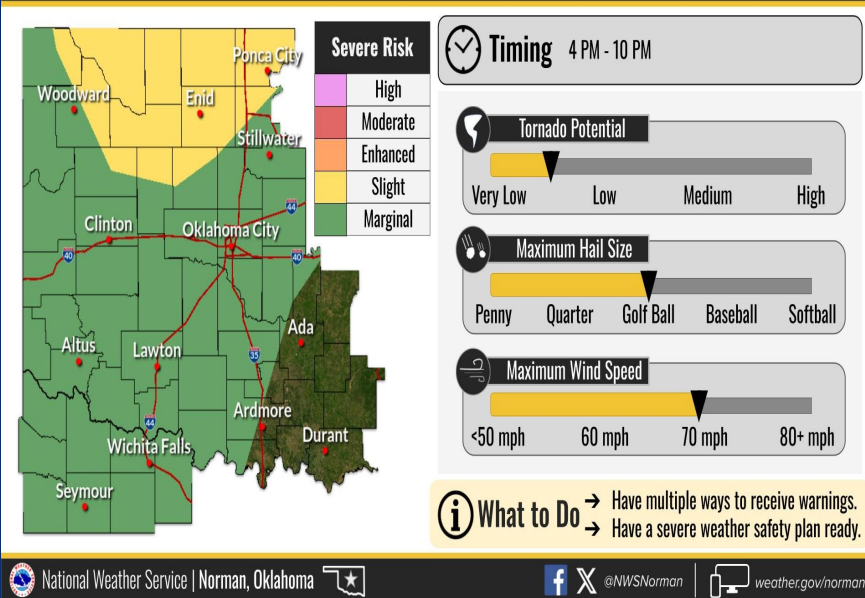
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Depending on the location of a dryline there is a potential for an isolated storm or two in the far eastern combined Panhandles. Along with that is the potential for any storm to become severe with large hail and damaging winds being the primary threat.

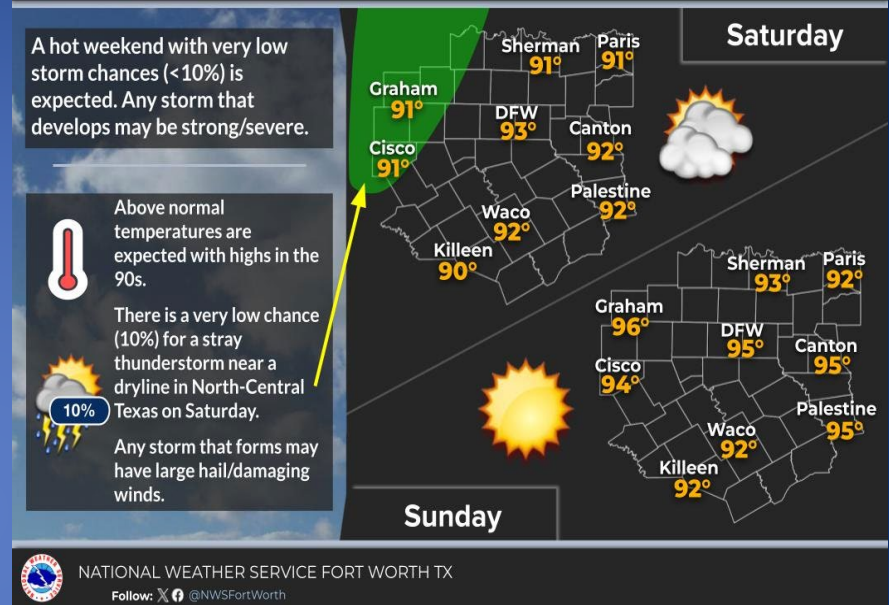

Strong to severe storms will be possible Saturday afternoon and evening and capable of producing large hail and damaging winds.

Hot Weekend with Low Storm Chances

The vast majority of those across North and Central Texas will be hot and dry this weekend as temperatures climb into the low and mid-90s. Saturday afternoon/evening there will be a very low chance (<10%) for a stray thunderstorm near a dryline in North-Central Texas. Any storm that develops will be capable of large hail/damaging winds. This potential should remain west of US-281.

Can You Spot a Rip Current?



Clue: Waves are *not* breaking & water is often darker



Lower Texas beaches



Life threatening rip currents are possible and may appear suddenly.



Rip currents can sweep even the best swimmers away from shore into deeper water!

Always remember to swim near a lifeguard and heed the guidance of local officials.

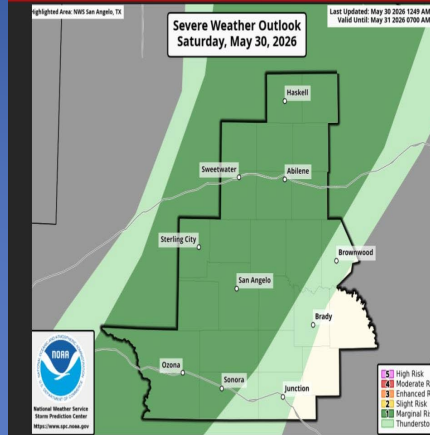

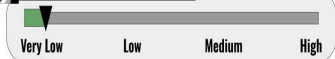

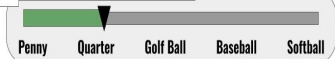

- Have multiple ways to receive any warnings that go out

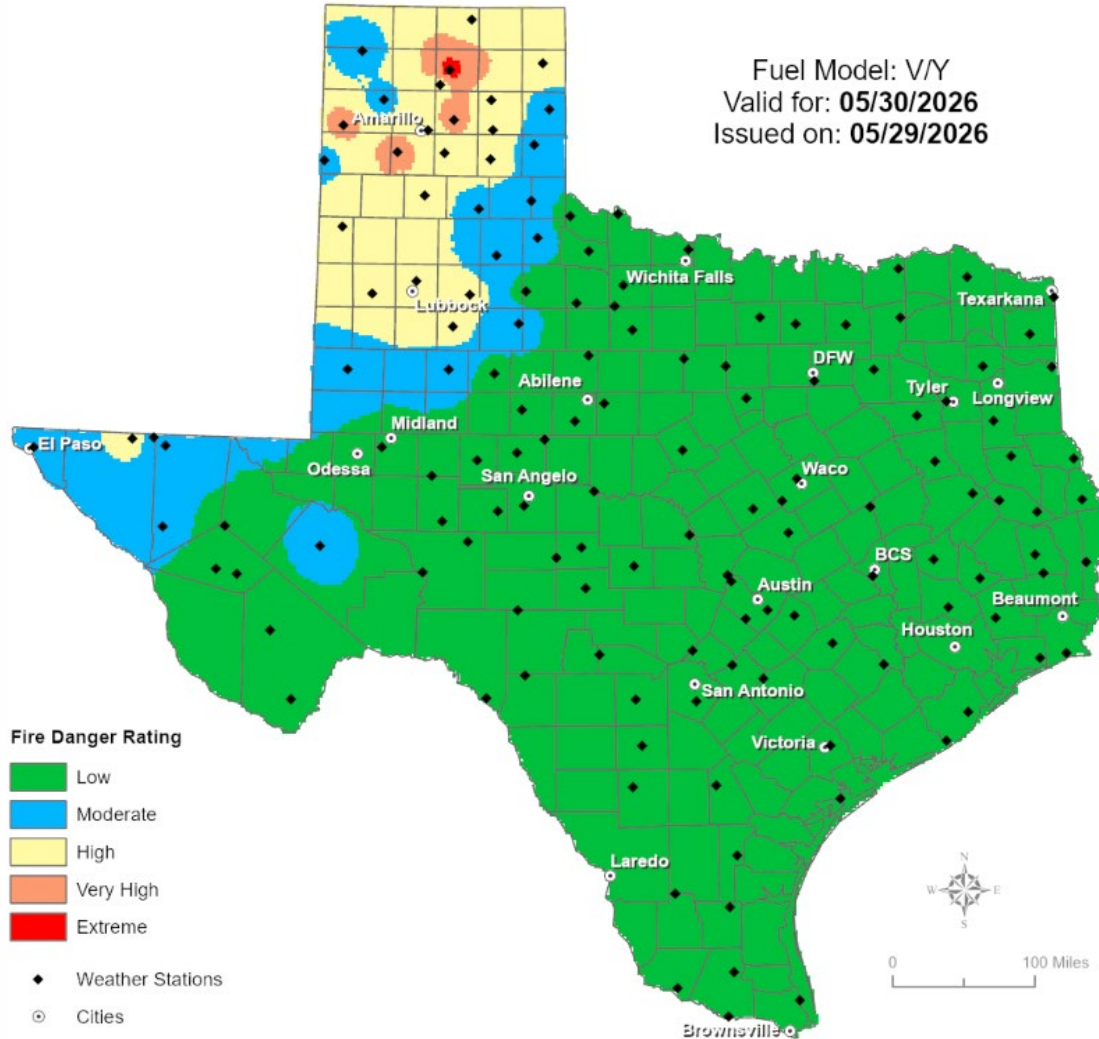
There is a low (<20%) chance for strong to severe storms on Saturday evening. Thunderstorms are expected to be isolated. The main concerns are quarter-size hail and locally damaging wind gusts.

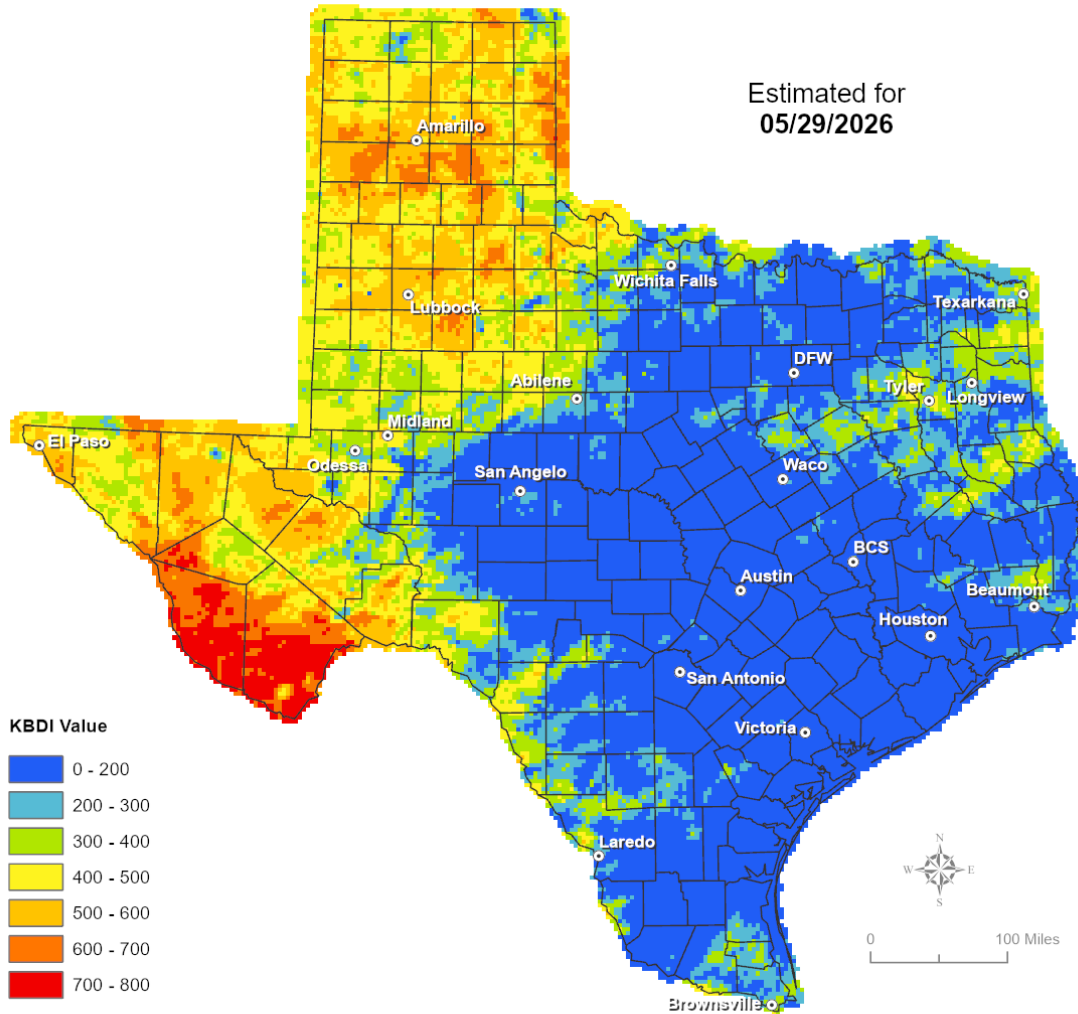


Keetch-Byram Drought Index

Keetch-Byram Drought Index

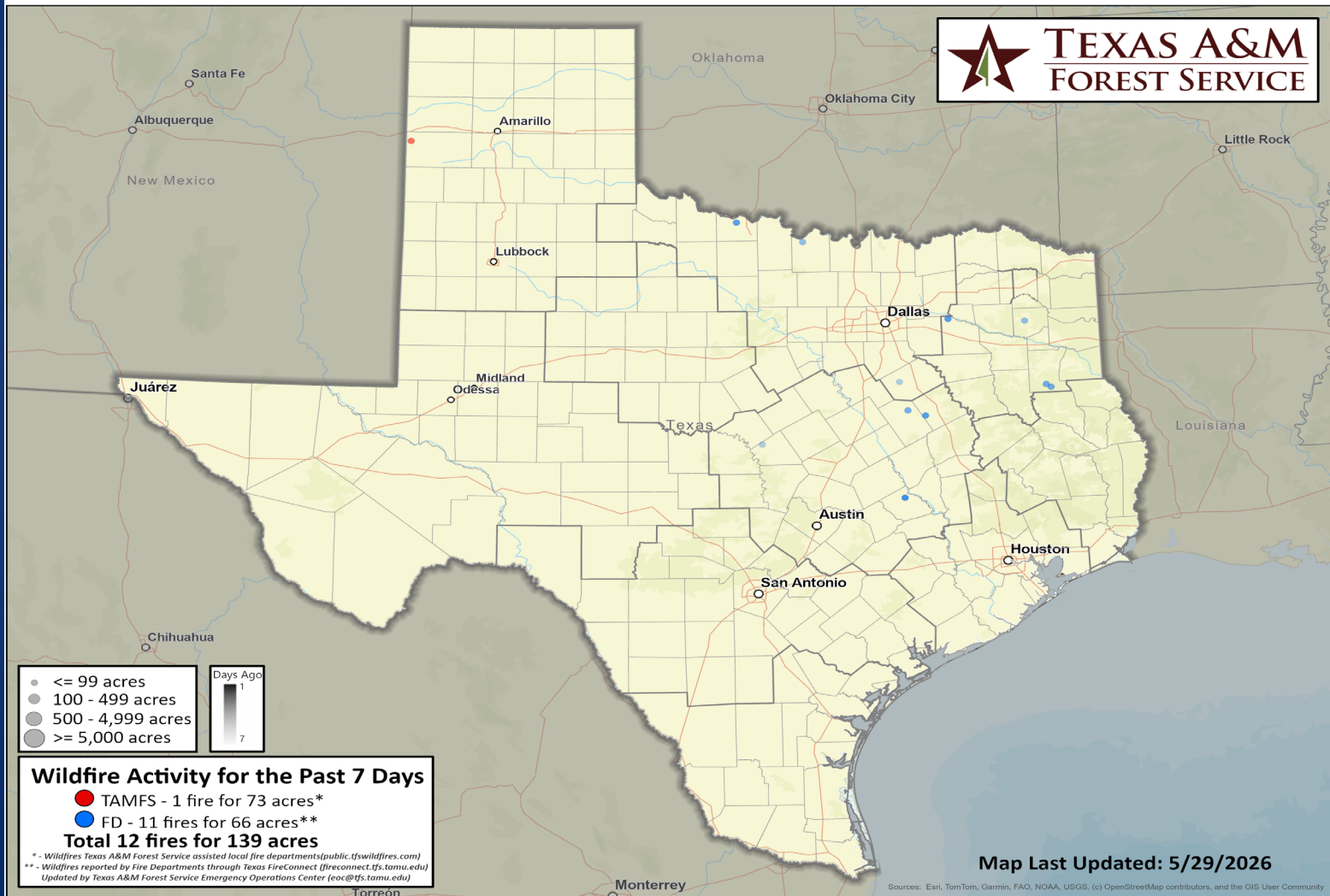
