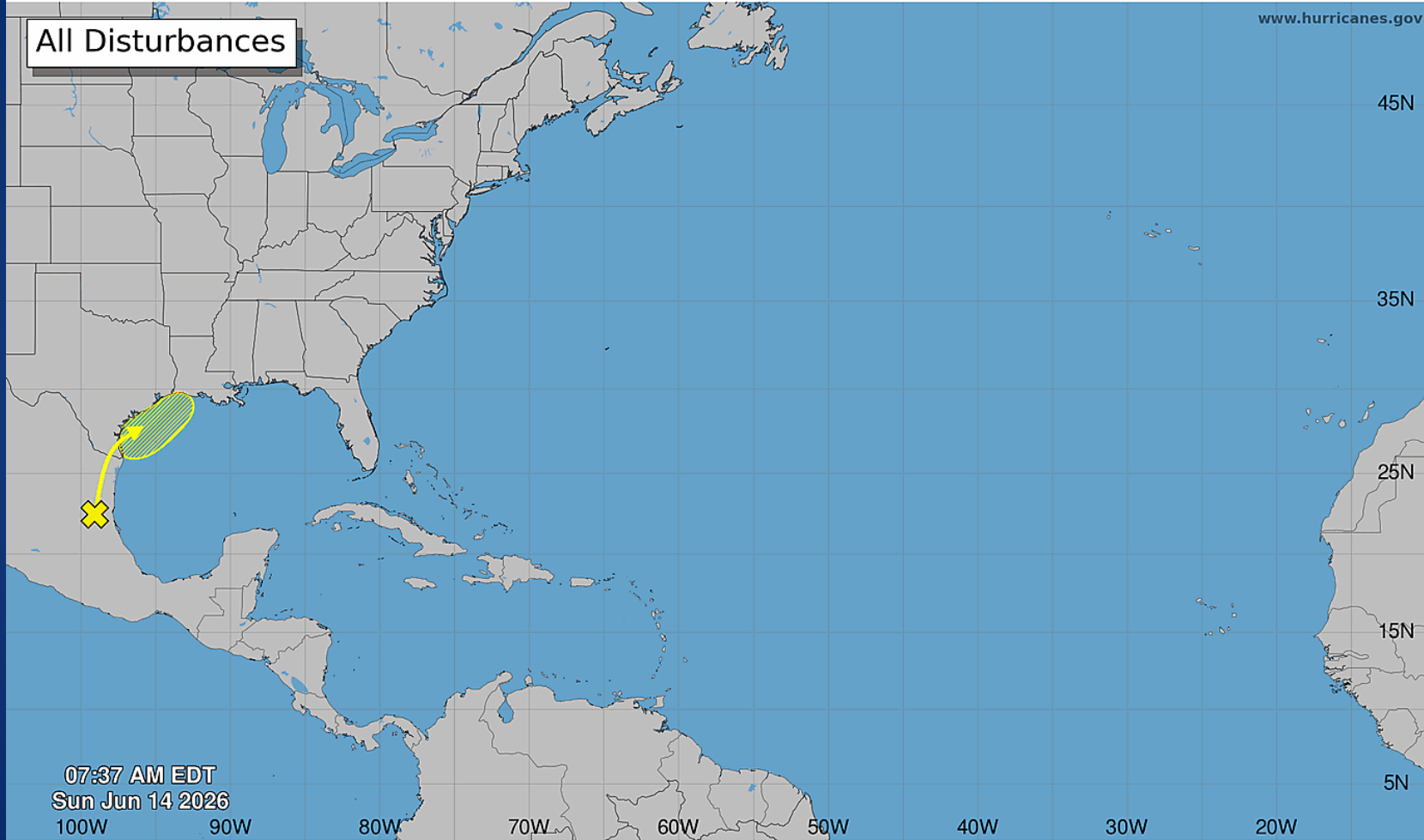
Seven-Day Graphical Tropical Weather Outlook

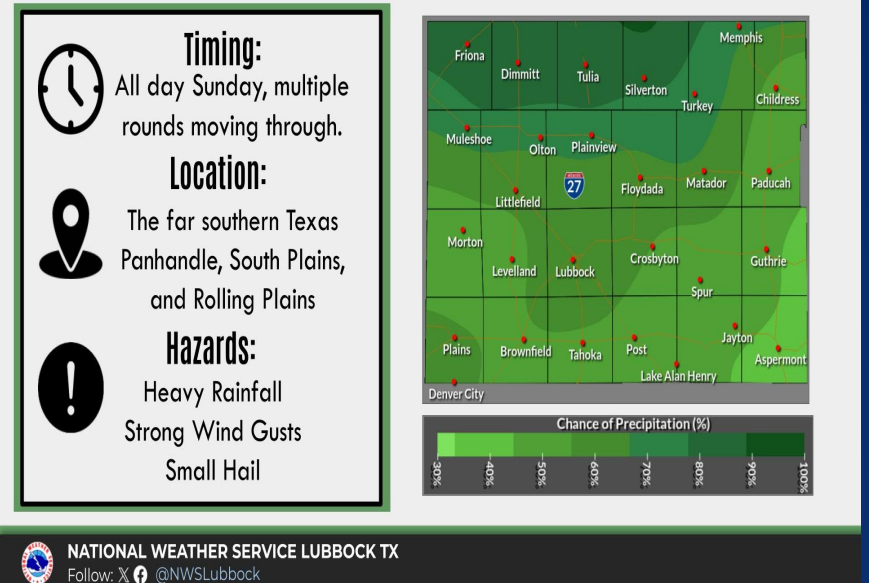

What We Know

- Flooding possible especially in those areas that have already received heavy rain over the last few days.

Impacts

- Localized flooding possible in some locations, especially in low-lying and poorly drained areas.
- Ponding on area roadways.

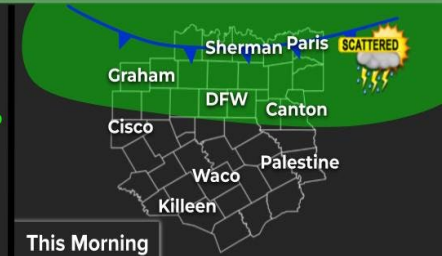

SCATTERED Scattered storms are expected along a cold front through this evening with greater coverage later tonight south of I-20.

HEAVY Very localized areas of 2-3" of rain may lead to minor low-water crossing/urban flooding.

The severe threat remains very low, though some storms could produce **gusty winds and frequent lightning**.

Key Messages

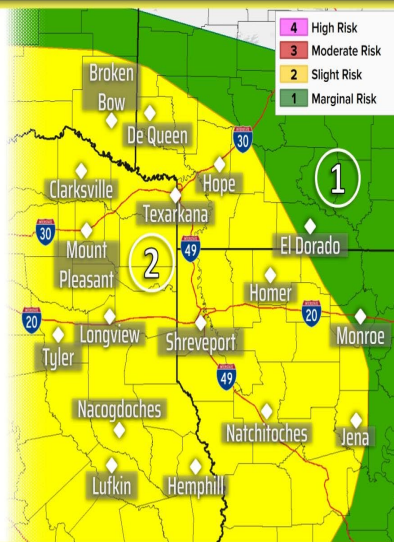
- Periods of prolonged heavy rainfall may result in flash flooding across parts of Four State Region beginning this morning and continuing through tonight.

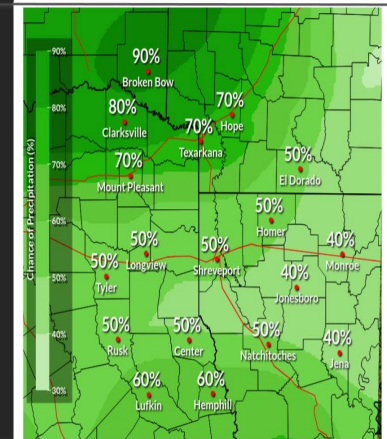

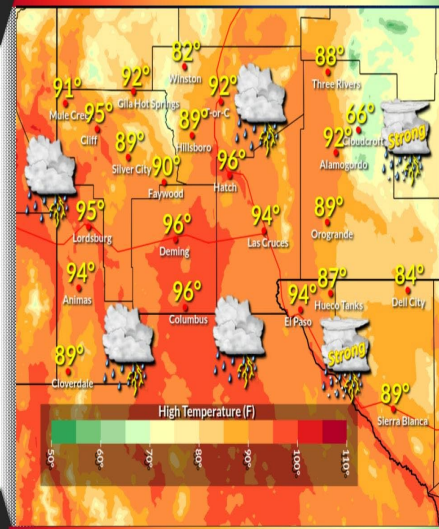

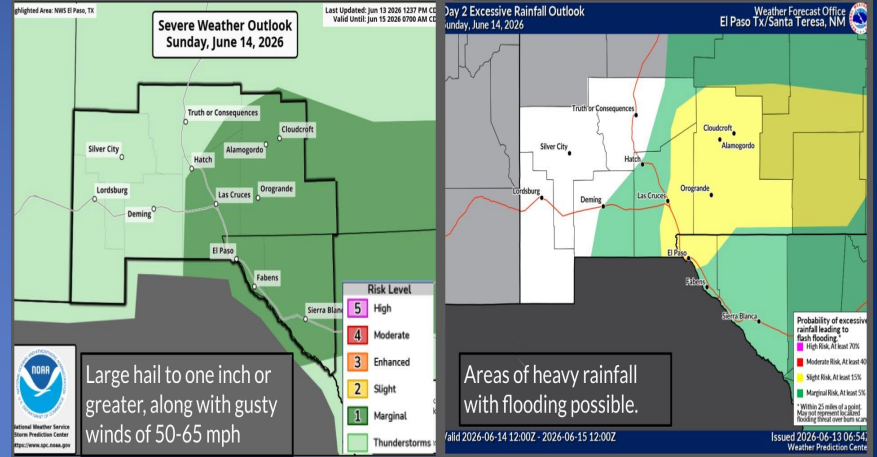

Highest risk for most of the Rio Grande Valley east



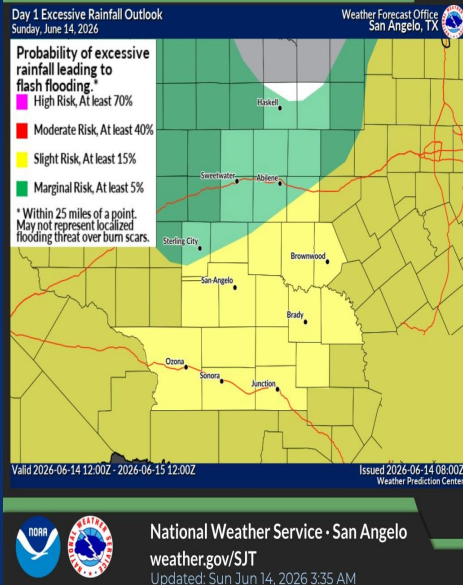

Abundant moisture and an unstable airmass will lead to scattered thunderstorms Sunday across the area. The best chances for storms are from the Rio Grande Valley east, and this same area will see the highest risk for large hail and damaging winds, along with flooding.

Excessive Rainfall Outlook for Today and Tonight



Scattered to numerous showers and thunderstorms are expected to develop along a cold front this afternoon, within a moisture-rich environment. Some of these storms will produce very heavy rainfall in short periods of time.

Excessive runoff may produce flooding of rivers, creeks, streams, and other low-lying or flood-prone areas, especially area roadways.

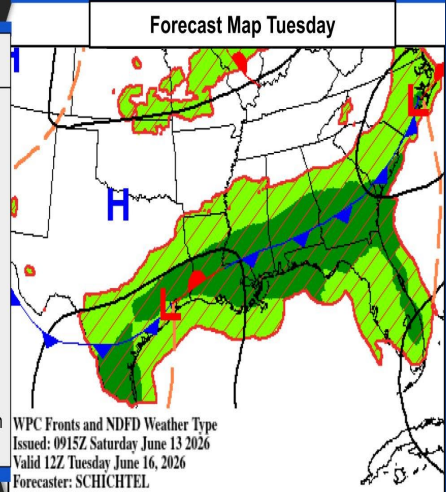


Forecast Key Messages

Hot & Humid Weekend; Flood Risk this Week

Key Messages

- Upper level high pressure remains overhead through early Sunday limiting rain chances and continuing very warm temps.
- Afternoon highs in the 90s and very humid conditions will bring about heat indices in the 100 to 105°F range.
- Several rounds of widespread tropical rains are expected from Sunday afternoon through early Wednesday.
- A flash flood risk will exist Sunday afternoon - early Wednesday. Rain totals of 3-5 inches are expected with higher amounts in some spots.
- Coastal flooding will be possible around high tide times Sun - Wed mornings due to a low moving near the coastline.



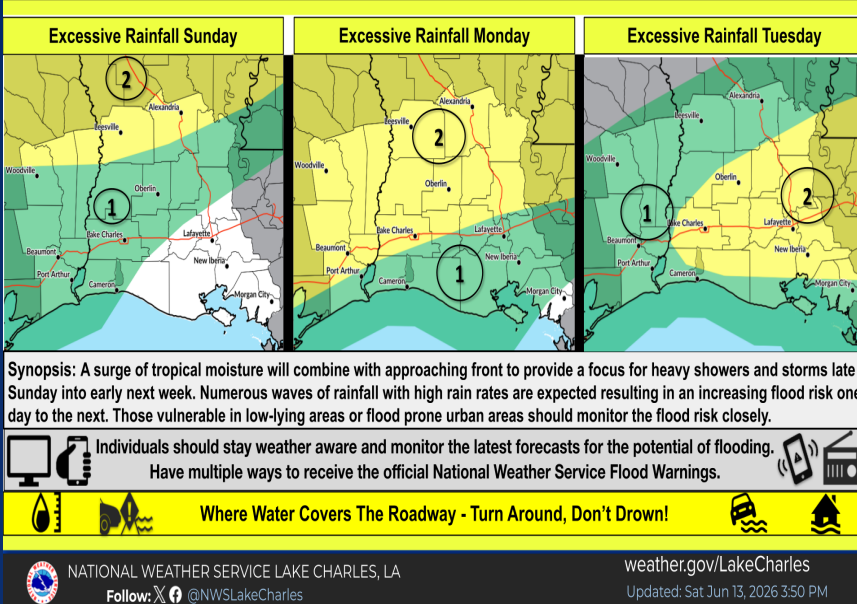

A cold frontal passage will bring thunderstorms to west-central Texas Sunday afternoon and night. Locally heavy rainfall will pose a Slight Risk of excessive rainfall leading to flash flooding.

Upper level high pressure remains overhead through early Sunday limiting rain chances and continuing very warm temps. Afternoon highs in the 90s and very humid conditions will bring about heat indices in the 100 to 105°F range. Several rounds of widespread tropical rains are expected from Sunday afternoon through early Wednesday. A flash flood risk will exist Sunday afternoon - early Wednesday. Rain totals of 3-5 inches are expected with higher amounts in some spots. Coastal flooding will be possible around high tide times Sun - Wed mornings due to a low moving near the coastline.

Multi-Day Risk of Flooding



A surge of tropical moisture will combine with approaching front to provide a focus for heavy showers and storms late Sunday into early next week. Numerous waves of rainfall with high rain rates are expected resulting in an increasing flood risk one day to the next. Those vulnerable in low-lying areas or flood prone urban areas should monitor the flood risk closely.

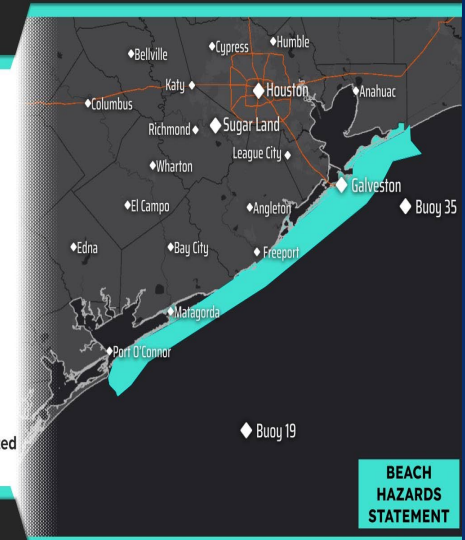

Rip Currents can sweep even the best swimmers away from shore! Don't swim against the current. You may be able to escape by swimming in a direction following the shoreline, then at an angle toward the beach. If you feel you will be unable to reach shore, draw attention to yourself. Elevated tides could lead to minor flooding of beaches, lots, parks, and roads with only isolated road closures possible.

Key Messages

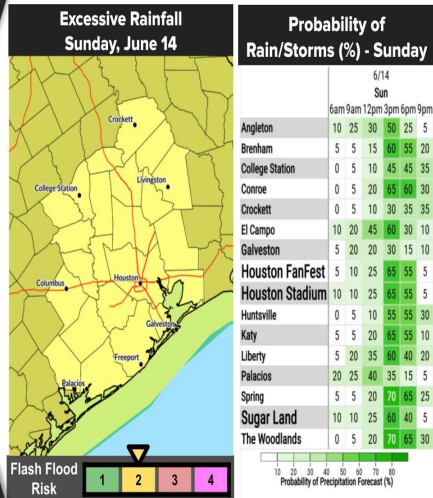
- Scattered to numerous showers and thunderstorms are expected ahead of and along an approaching front Sunday. Locally heavy rainfall is possible.
- **Timing:** Only isolated showers/t-storms are expected in the morning. The best rain and storm chances arrive early Sunday afternoon and continue into the evening. Additional showers/storms may develop during the overnight hours.

Potential Impacts

- Locally stronger thunderstorms capable of heavy rain, frequent lightning strikes & gusty winds
- Flooding is the most likely impact if repeated rounds of heavy rainfall move over the same area

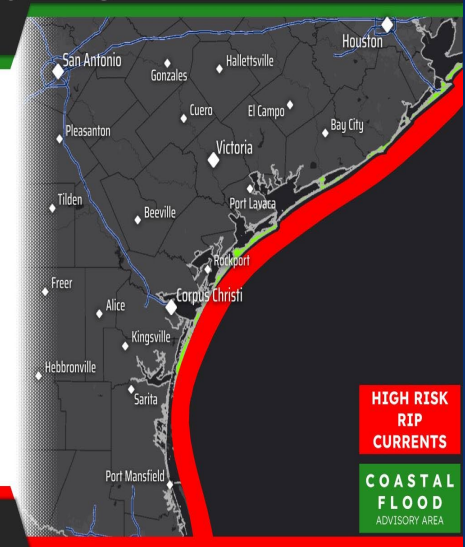

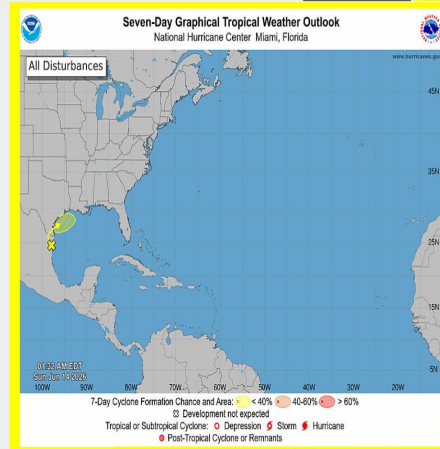
A broad area of low pressure has a low (20%) chance of development over the Bay of Campeche in the next 7 days.

- Areas of locally heavy rainfall may see isolated flash flooding.
 - ◆ Monitor the forecast for updates.
 - ◆ Have multiple ways to receive warnings.

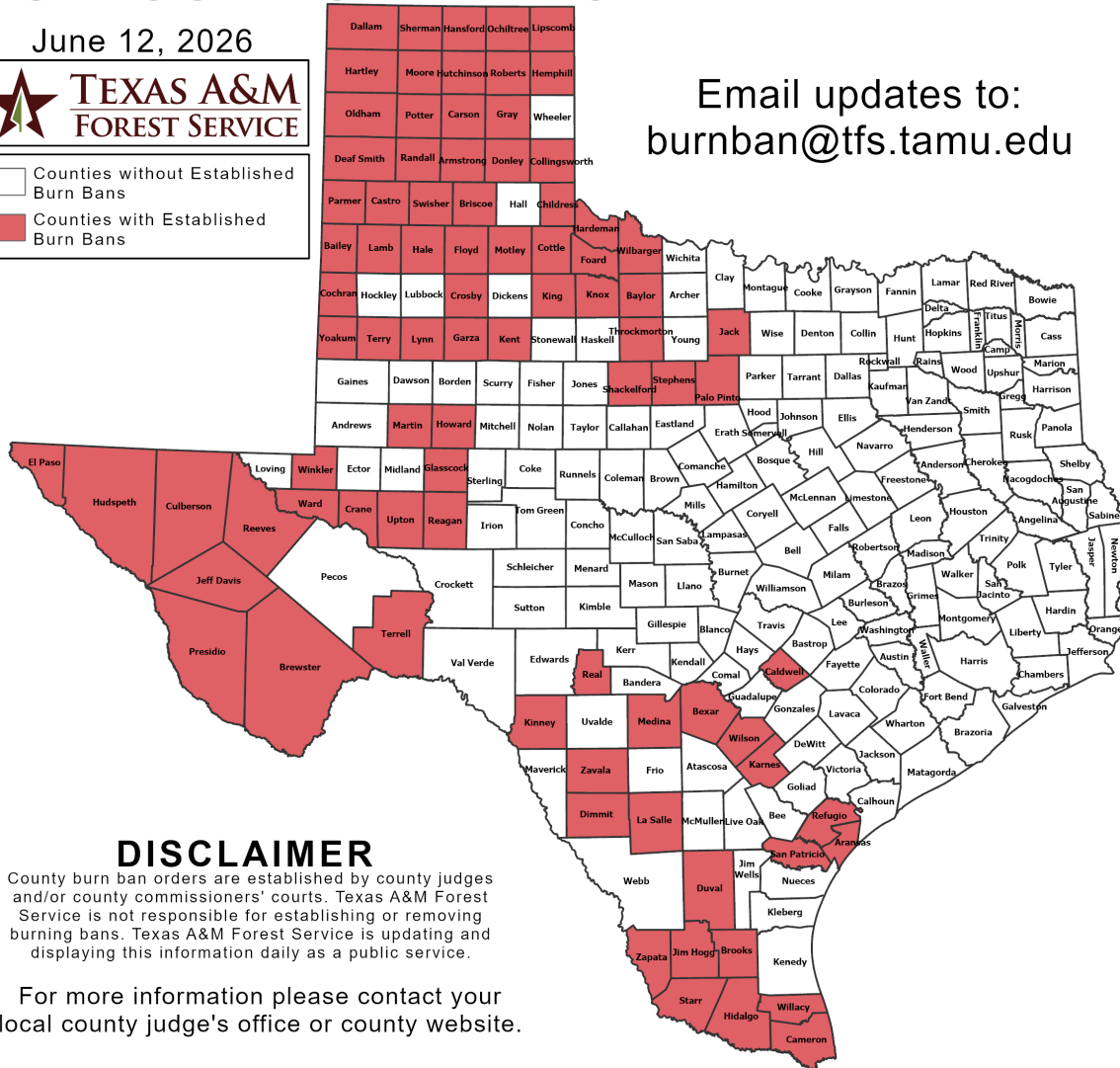

Keetch-Byram Drought Index

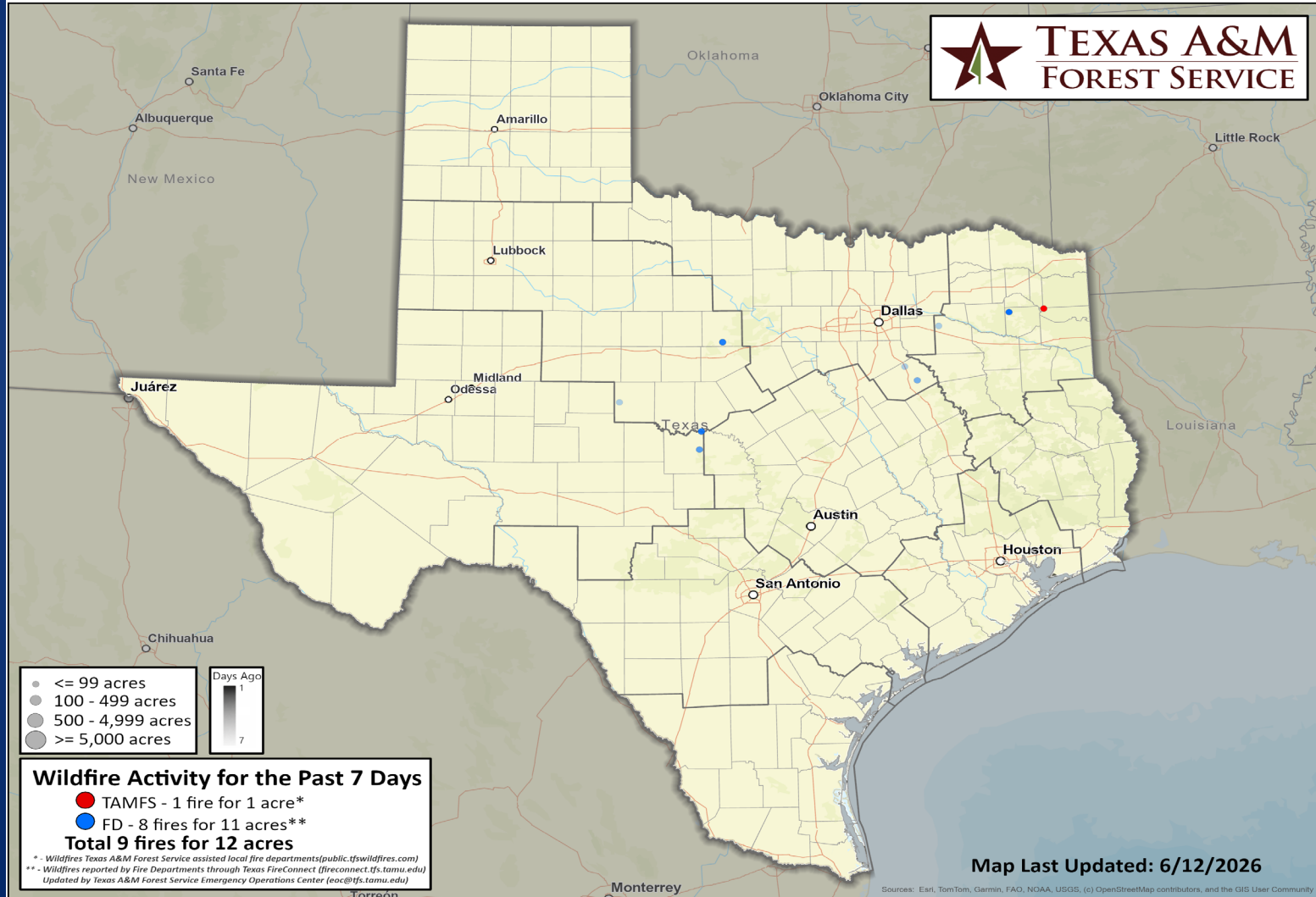
