STATEWIDE CURRENT SITUATION: On June 11, Governor Greg Abbott directed the Texas Division of Emergency Management (TDEM) to activate state emergency response resources ahead of severe weather and flash flooding threats across multiple regions of Texas heading into the weekend.

OPERATIONAL PRIORITIES:

- Protect life and property.
- Support rapid & effective response.
- Collect and disseminate accurate incident information to improve decision-making.
- Accurately track incident costs associated with assigned resources for cost recovery.

Region 1 (Includes DDs 1, 2, and 7)

DD 1 – Amarillo (Includes Armstrong, Briscoe, Carson, Castro, Childress, Collingsworth, Dallam, Deaf Smith, Donley, Gray, Hall, Hansford, Hartley, Hemphill, Hutchinson, Lipscomb, Moore, Ochiltree, Oldham, Parmer, Potter, Randall, Roberts, Sherman,

Swisher, and Wheeler Counties): Disaster District Emergency Operations Center (DDEOC) 1 is activated to Level III (Increased Readiness Conditions).

DD 2 – Lubbock (Includes Bailey, Cochran, Crosby, Dickens, Floyd, Garza, Hale, Hockley, King, Lamb, Lubbock, Lynn, Motley, Terry, and Yoakum Counties): DDEOC 2 is activated to Level III (Increased Readiness Conditions).

DD 7 – Abilene (Includes Brown, Callahan, Coleman, Comanche, Eastland, Fisher, Haskell, Jones, Kent, Knox, Mitchell, Nolan, Runnels, Scurry, Shackelford, Stephens, Stonewall, Throckmorton, and Taylor Counties): DDEOC 7 is activated to Level III (Increased Readiness Conditions).

RESPONDING STATE AGENCIES/ORGANIZATIONS REPORTS

Texas Division of Emergency Management, Texas A&M University System (TDEM):

The Texas State Operations Center (SOC) is postured to support the state for the expected severe weather that may impact the state this week.

Texas A&M Engineering Extension Service Texas Task Force 1 (TEEX/TX-TF1):

As of June 11, TX-TF1 activated four Swift Water Rescue Boat Squads in TDEM Regions 1 and 2 for predicted severe weather.

Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS):

As of June 12, the DSHS State Medical Operations Center (SMOC) is at an Increased Readiness to support the SOC.

Volunteer Organizations Active in Disasters (VOAD)

American Red Cross (ARC):

On June 14, the ARC reported closed the Shepherd Community shelter in San Jacinto County (DD-14).

FINAL COMMENTS: The State Operations Center (SOC) is currently operating at Level II (Escalated Response Conditions). [The SOC continues severe weather response, transitioning all assets to 26-0018 14JUN Severe Weather.](#) The Texas Division of Emergency Management (TDEM) continues to monitor the situation and will provide additional situation reports as needed.

- Level I (Emergency Conditions)
- Level II (Escalated Response Conditions)
- Level III (Increased Readiness Conditions)
- Level IV (Normal Conditions)
