STATEWIDE CURRENT SITUATION: On June 15, Governor Greg Abbott announced that he issued a disaster declaration for 101 Texas counties as severe storms continue to threaten the state. Additional counties may be added as conditions warrant.

On June 15, Gov. Abbott announced that he directed the Texas Division of Emergency Management (TDEM) to activate additional state emergency response resources as severe weather and flood threats continue across large portions of Texas this week. Additionally, the Governor directed TDEM to implement 24-hour operations at the Texas State Emergency Operations Center (SOC) to support requests for state assistance from local officials.

OPERATIONAL PRIORITIES:

- Protect life and property.
- Support rapid & effective response.
- Collect and disseminate accurate incident information to improve decision-making.
- Accurately track incident costs associated with assigned resources for cost recovery.

RESPONDING STATE AGENCIES/ORGANIZATIONS REPORTS

Texas Division of Emergency Management, Texas A&M University System (TDEM):

Texas A&M Engineering Extension Service Texas Task Force 1 (TEEX/TX-TF1):

On June 14, TX-TF1 transitioned Swift Water Rescue (SWR) boat squads from 26-0017 to response under 26-0018. There have been no requests for service. Additional boat squads have been activated by TX-TF1 and TX-TF3. Overnight, the squads were very active assisting local authorities with rescue, assists, and investigations. More movement occurred during the day, and two Urban Search and Rescue (USAR) mission ready packages (MRP) and four high-profile vehicles (HPV) were activated.

Texas A&M Engineering Extension Service Texas Task Force 3 (TEEX/TX-TF3)

Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service (AgriLife)

Texas A&M Forest Service (TAMFS):

TAMFS continues to support search, rescue, and recovery efforts related to severe weather conditions. There are two Texas Intrastate Fire Mutual Aid System (TIFMAS) All Hazard (AH) Strike Teams, along with two AH Group Supervisors, and two AH Group Supervisor Aides assigned to this response.

Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ)

Texas Military Department (TMD):

TMD has activated two Ground Transportation Platoons (GTP) in support of State Agency Partners. TMD has 20 personnel and 10 vehicles activated for this response.

Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS):

DPS is closely monitoring the severe rain weather event expected to impact multiple DPS Regions across the state. DPS Regions have been in contact with their respective TDEM Disaster District Emergency Operations Centers (DDEOC) and will provide personnel to staff those DDEOCs as they increase their readiness levels. The Texas Highway Patrol (THP) Chief's Office is providing staffing support at the SOC. DPS will continue to work closely with TxDOT to assess road conditions.

DPS Aircraft has helicopters with hoist capabilities in Austin, Dallas, San Antonio, Edinburg, Lubbock, and Alpine ready upon request. DPS Tactical Marine Unit has two Swift Water Rescue Boat Teams deploying to Kingsville for staging; and two additional teams on standby in Port Lavaca. Highway Patrol McAllen are providing staffing at DDEOC 21 Weslaco effective June 15.

Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD):

The Texas Game Wardens have identified Statewide resources ready to support as needed in response to the increased Severe Weather Threat affecting Texas. These resources include Swift Water Rescue boat teams, helicopters with hoisting capabilities, and UAS teams. TPWD Game Wardens are working closely with TDEM and ESF partners through the State Operations Center (SOC) to ensure resources are available should they be needed. Game Warden personnel are continuously being advised of the current weather conditions and are maintaining a state of readiness. Currently TPWD is staffing the SOC and DDEOC 21 during the 24-hour activation for this event, and all resources are ready to support as needed. As of June 15, Texas Game Warden Search and Rescue team members and local Game Wardens performed six rescues across McLennan, Falls, Milam, Williamson, and Burleson Counties overnight and early morning.

TPWD State Parks Division does not have full park closures. Eight parks have affected amenities, campsites, and facilities. State Park visitors may check online at <https://tpwd.texas.gov/state-parks/parks-map>.

Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT):

TxDOT works to maintain safe roadways for the traveling public during adverse conditions. As of June 16, TxDOT had 24 road segments impacted by floodwater including six road segment closures statewide due to flooding. TxDOT crews worked overnight in impacted areas monitoring roadways, clearing debris from drainage systems, barricading flooded road segments, and assisting with traffic control.

Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS):

The DSHS State Medical Operations Center (SMOC) remains activated at Increased Readiness in support of 26-0018 14JUN Severe Weather, 26-0013 New World Screwworm, and 26-0002 FIFA World Cup.

DSHS priorities include coordinating with state partners for any public health or medical needs, monitoring healthcare facilities operational status, identifying Youth Summer Camps in the region with operational status and capacity, and activating four Texas Emergency Medical Task Force (EMTF) Severe Weather Packages (SWX PKG).
