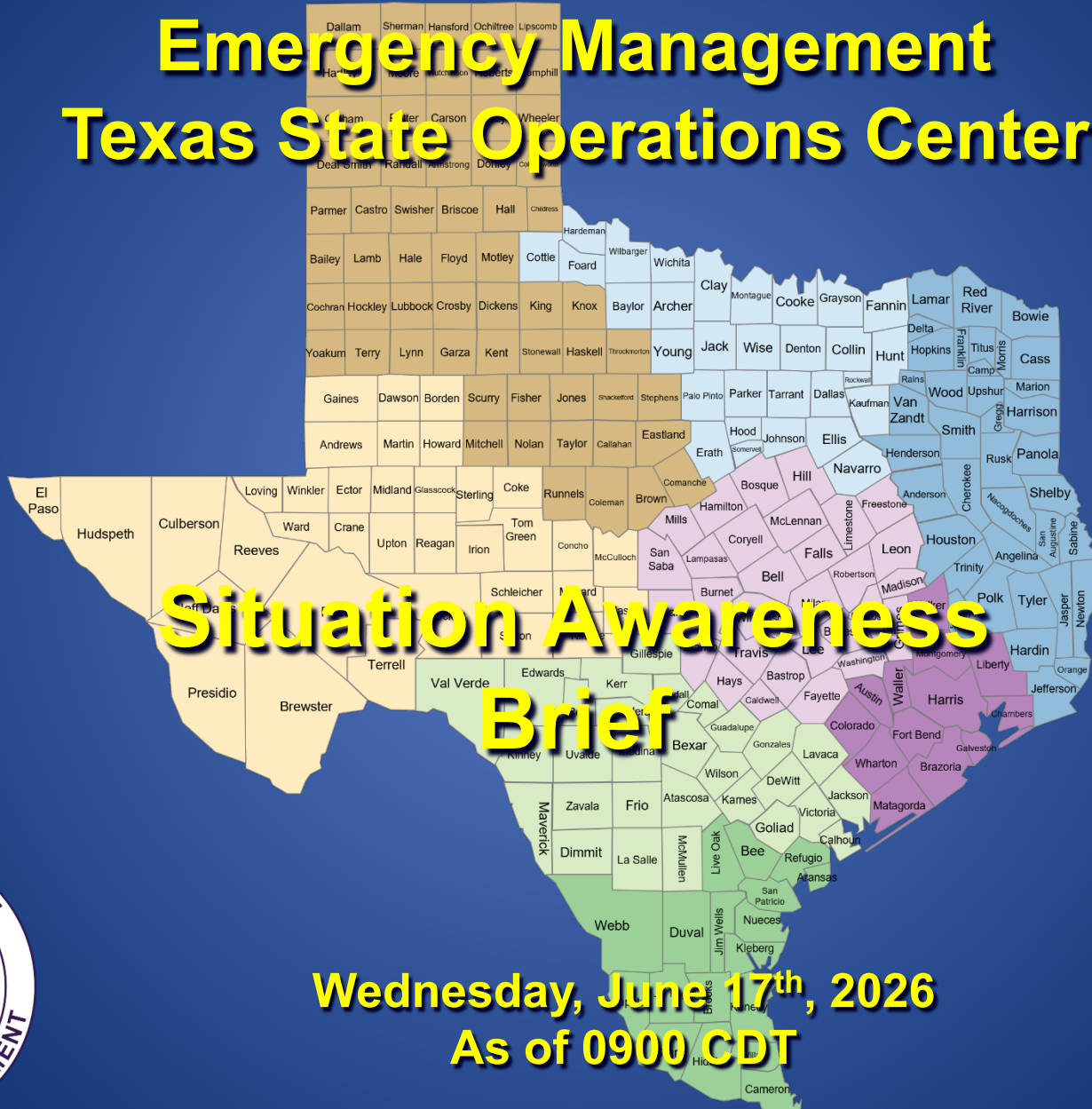

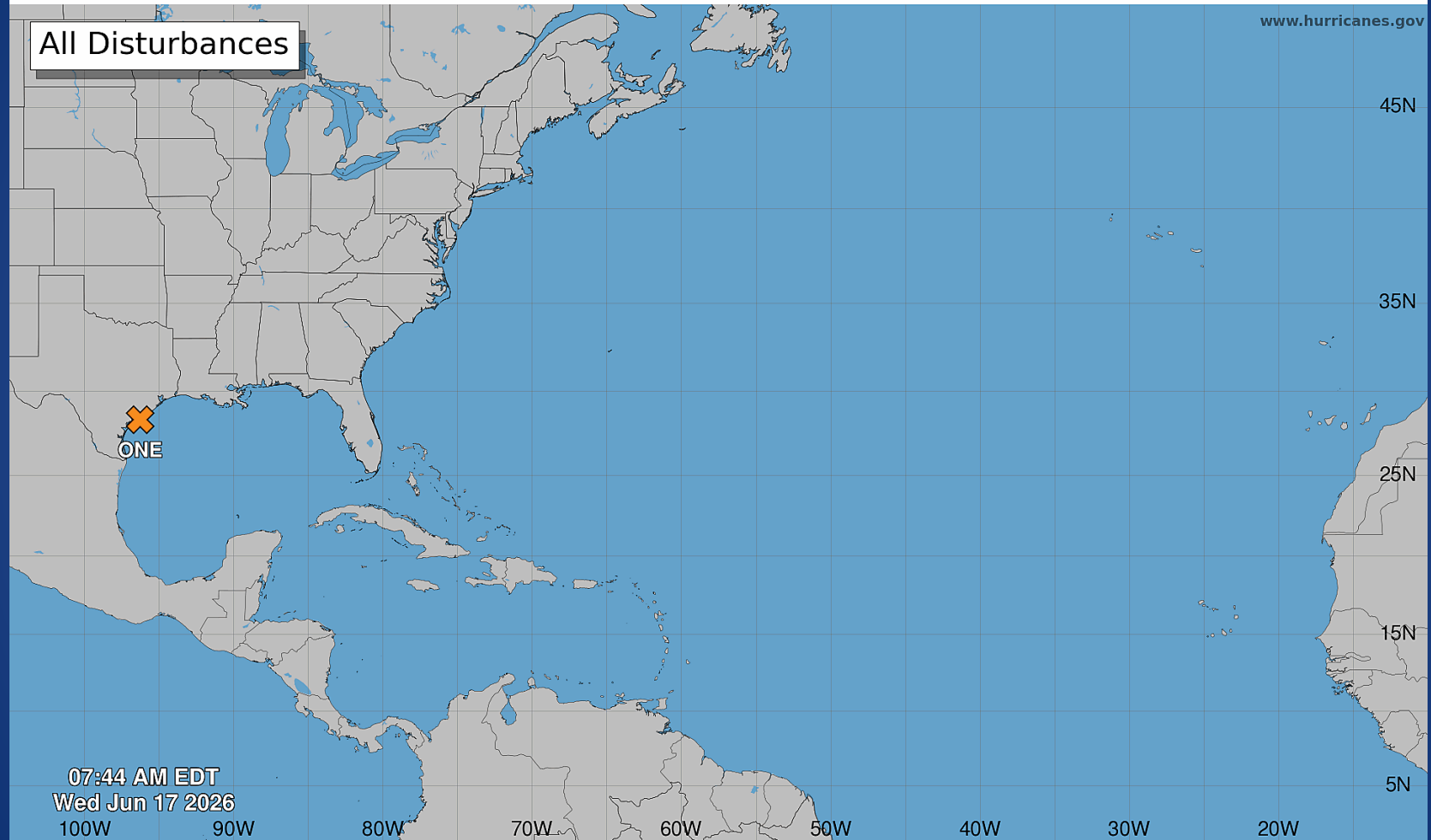
Seven-Day Graphical Tropical Weather Outlook

Hot temperatures are forecast for today across the Texas and Oklahoma Panhandles. Widespread high temperatures in the triple digits are expected and the temperature may approach 110°F for Palo Duro Canyon. If you are planning to be outside today, practice heat safety by staying hydrated.

After very hot temperatures today, a cold front will cool us back down into the 70s to 80s on Thursday. There will be chances for storms most days, with the highest chances during the evening into the overnight hours. The 100s may return to the Panhandles this weekend.

A heat advisory will be in effect for all of North and Central Texas Thursday afternoon. Heat index values will be between 105-110 degrees, leading to dangerous heat if precautions are not taken. Stay hydrated, wear lightweight and loose fitting clothing, and limit strenuous activities to early morning or evening hours.

A Flood Watch continues for portions of East Texas and North Louisiana. Expect additional rain amounts of 1-2 inches in much of the Flood Watch area over the next few days. Training storms may result in 1-2+ inch hourly rain rates, increasing the threat of flash flooding.

- With recent rises in area drainage basins, a Flood Watch remains in effect across portions of Deep East Texas and north Louisiana.



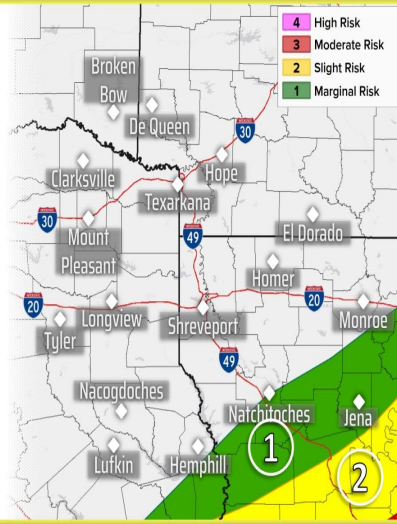

Potential Tropical Cyclone One Forecast Track

NOTE: Do not focus on the exact track.

Impacts can occur well outside the area enclosed by the cone.

- A Tropical Storm Warning remains in effect from Sabine Pass Texas to Morgan City Louisiana.
- A Tropical Storm Watch remains in effect for coastal Southeast Texas west of Sabine Pass.
- The Potential Tropical Cyclone is forecast to move toward the southwest Louisiana coast on Wednesday becoming a minimal Tropical Storm before the center moves inland on Wednesday evening.
- The possibility of heavy rainfall and flooding is the main concern with impacts occurring near and possibly well off to the east of the center.

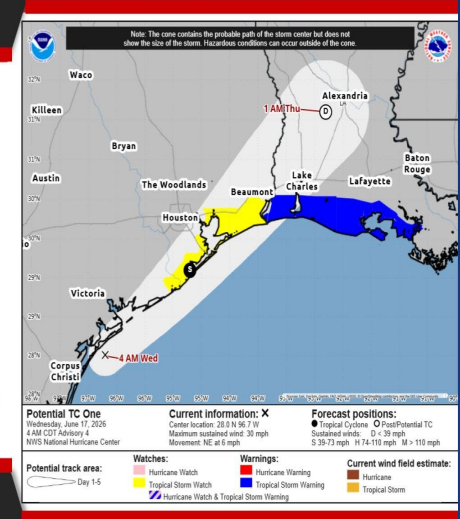

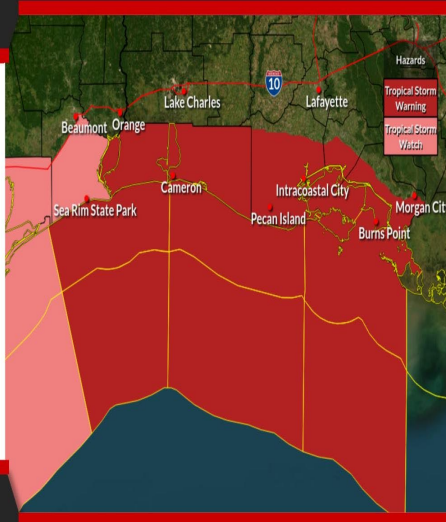

Potential Tropical Cyclone One

- A **Tropical Storm Warning** is now in effect for Cameron and coastal Vermilion, Iberia, and St. Mary Parishes as well as all lakes, bays, and Gulf waters.
- A **Tropical Storm Watch** remains in effect for lower Jefferson County.
- A **Tropical Storm Warning** means that tropical storm conditions are **expected** within 36 hours.
- A **Tropical Storm Watch** means that tropical storm conditions are **possible** within 48 hours.
- Potential Tropical Cyclone is forecast to become a minimal tropical storm before moving into southwest Louisiana on Wednesday Evening.

An Extreme Heat Warning and Heat Advisory are in effect for South Central Texas Thursday from noon to 8pm. Heat indices will spike into the 108-115 range Thursday afternoon for all of the region. Exercise heat safety and precautions.

Very hot and humid conditions will develop Wednesday and continue on Thursday. Temperatures between 100 and 105 degrees Wednesday and Thursday will combine with high relative humidity to produce heat index values or feels like temperatures of 105 to 110 degrees.

Key Messages

- Deep moisture, a stalled front and a passing disturbance will bring heavy rainfall through at least mid week.
- **Slight Risk (level 2 of 4)** of Heavy Rainfall each today, mainly for the southeast coastal region.
- Rainfall Rates could exceed 4" per hour in the heaviest downpours.

Potential Impacts

- Flash Flooding, especially in urban and low lying areas with poor drainage.
- Rises in rivers, creeks and streams.

- Have multiple ways to receive warnings!
- Remain weather-aware and check the forecast for updates!

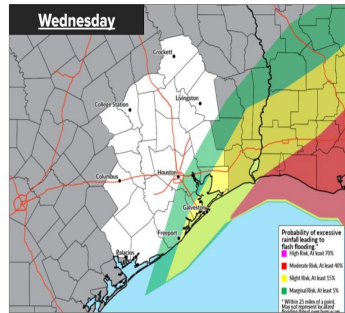

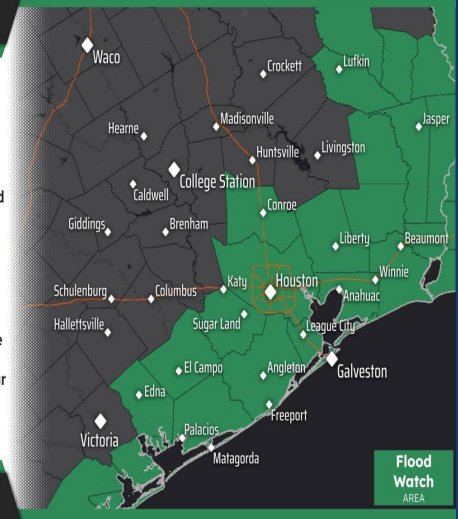

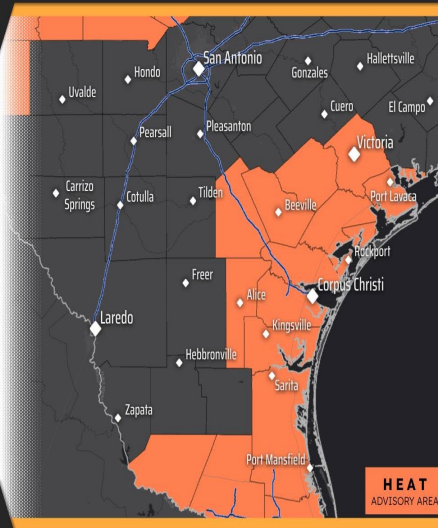

Overview

- Potential Tropical Cyclone One will continue a NE track over the next few days
- The system has the potential to become a very short-lived weak tropical storm as it moves over the Gulf of America
- As PTC One moves up the Texas coast, impacts to southeast Texas will include the potential for life threatening flash and urban flooding. Widespread small stream and minor river flooding is expected with isolated areas of significant river flooding possible
- A Tropical Storm Watch is in effect for the Upper Texas Coast through 09 AM Thursday.

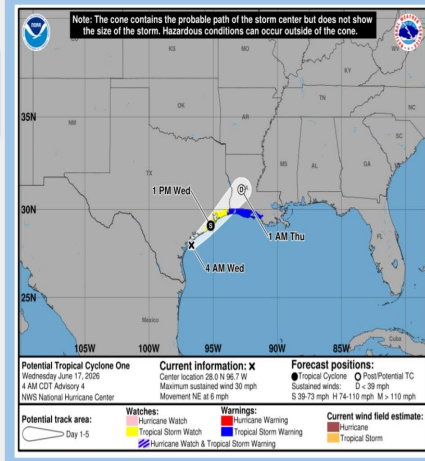

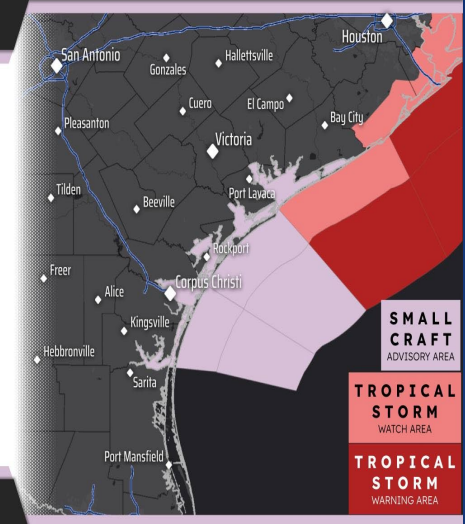

Tropical Update 4AM CDT: Potential Tropical Cyclone One is forecast to hug the Texas coast as the system moves northeast away from South Texas. It looks less likely to develop tropical characteristics but regardless of tropical formation, although less likely, the impacts would be short lived and below Tropical Storm criteria along our coast. Our messaging remains the same; isolated areas (northeast counties) of additional light rainfall through Wednesday, as this threat continues to decrease for South Texas.

A Small Craft Advisory for all our waters is in effect until 7 PM Wednesday evening. Seas will be around 5-7 feet and winds will be around 10-20 knots with gusts to 35 knots.

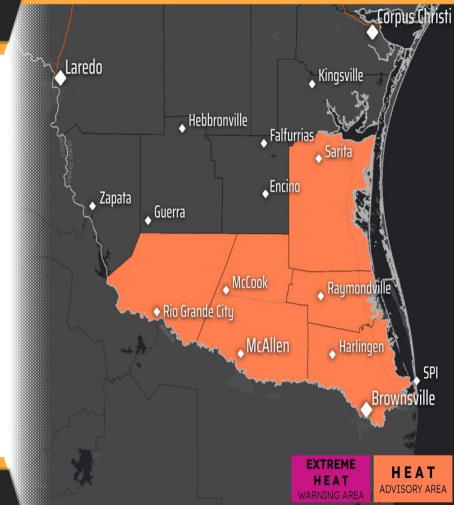

A Coastal Flood Advisory remains in effect until 7 PM Wednesday evening. Be aware that water will likely reach the dunes, especially during times around high tide, and beach roads may be inundated.

A Heat Advisory is in effect for the Rio Grande Valley (Starr, Hidalgo, Cameron, Willacy) and Kenedy County, except for the barrier island, for afternoon heat index values generally between 110 and 114°F. People outdoors should hydrate continuously and take frequent breaks; all should seek cooler locations.

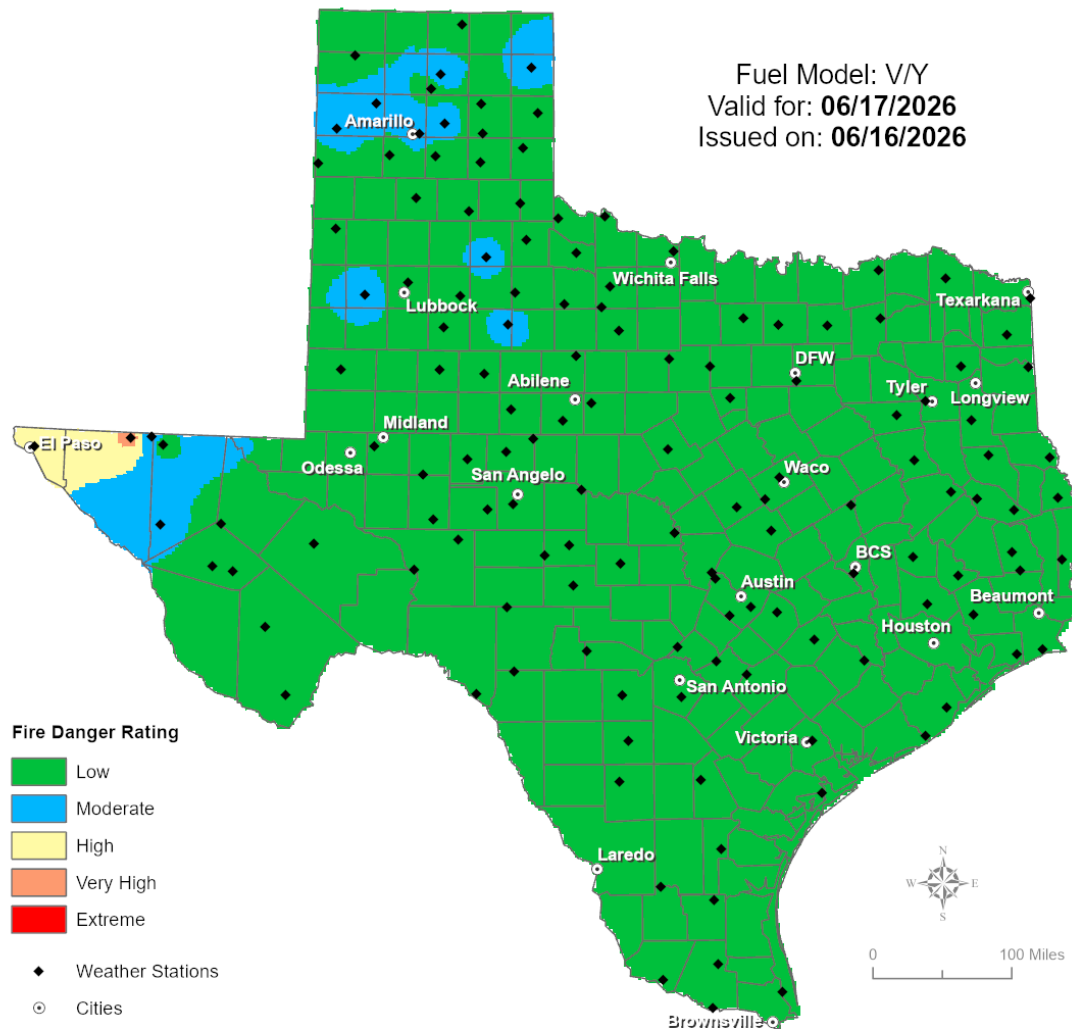

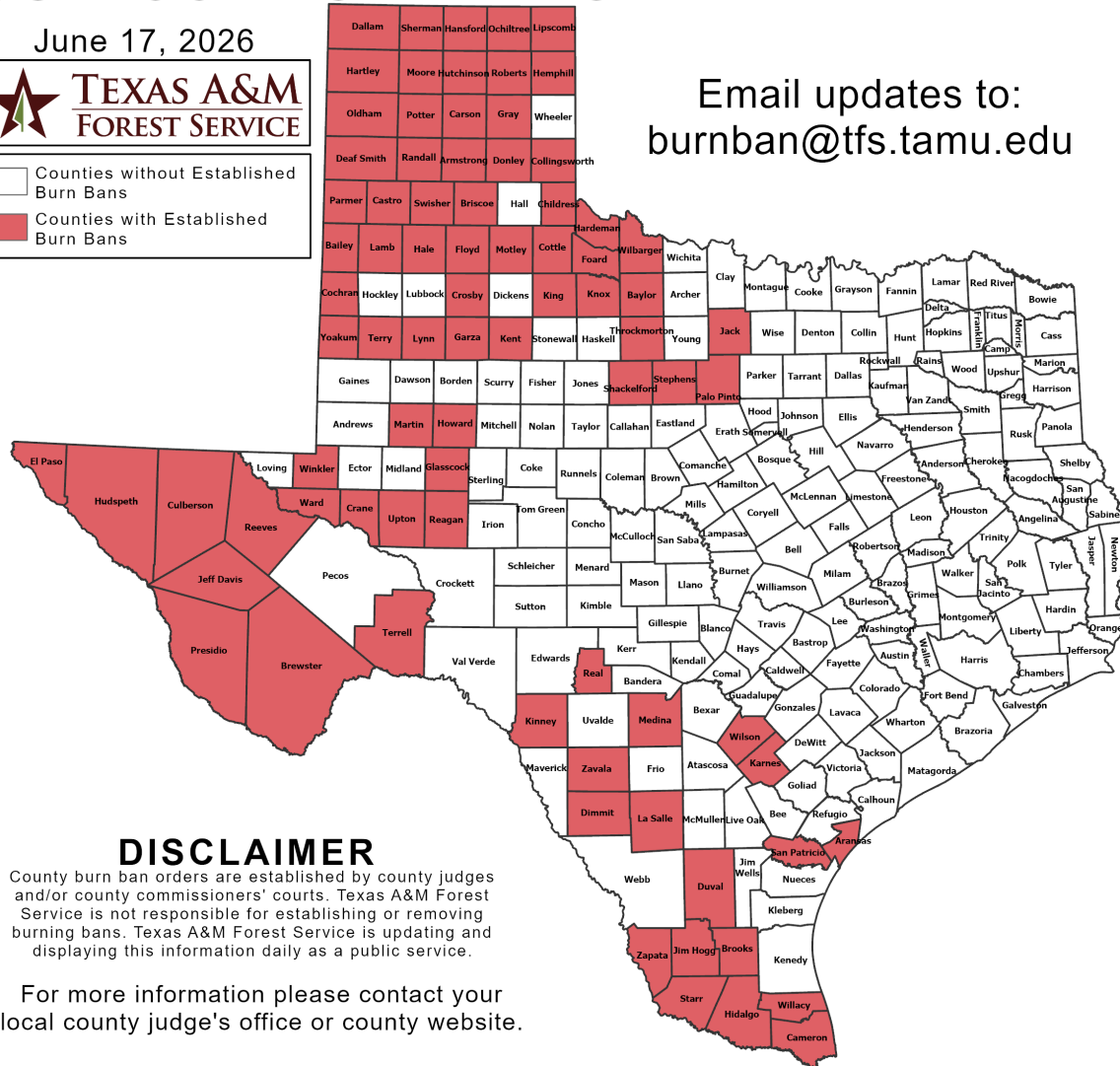

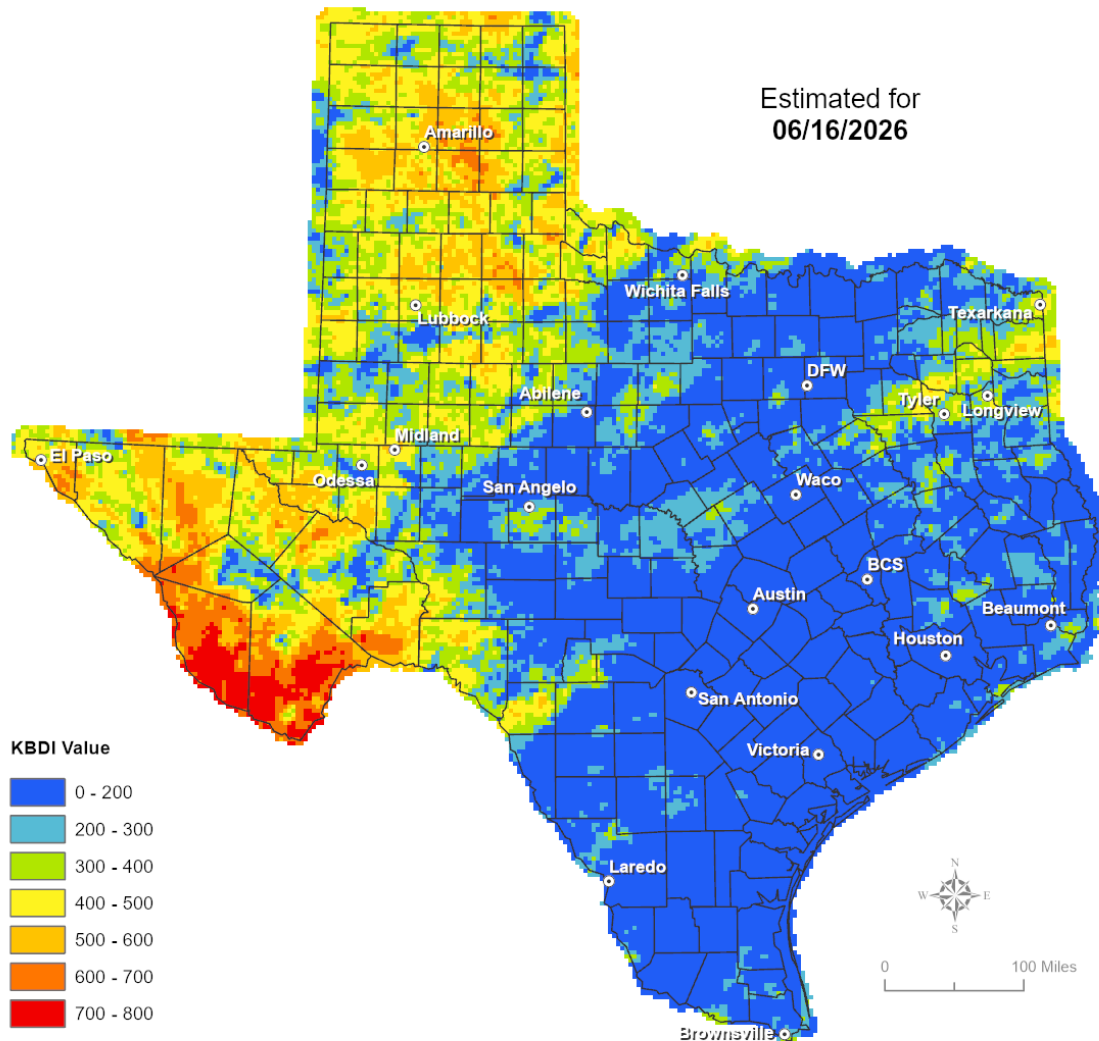

Keetch-Byram Drought Index

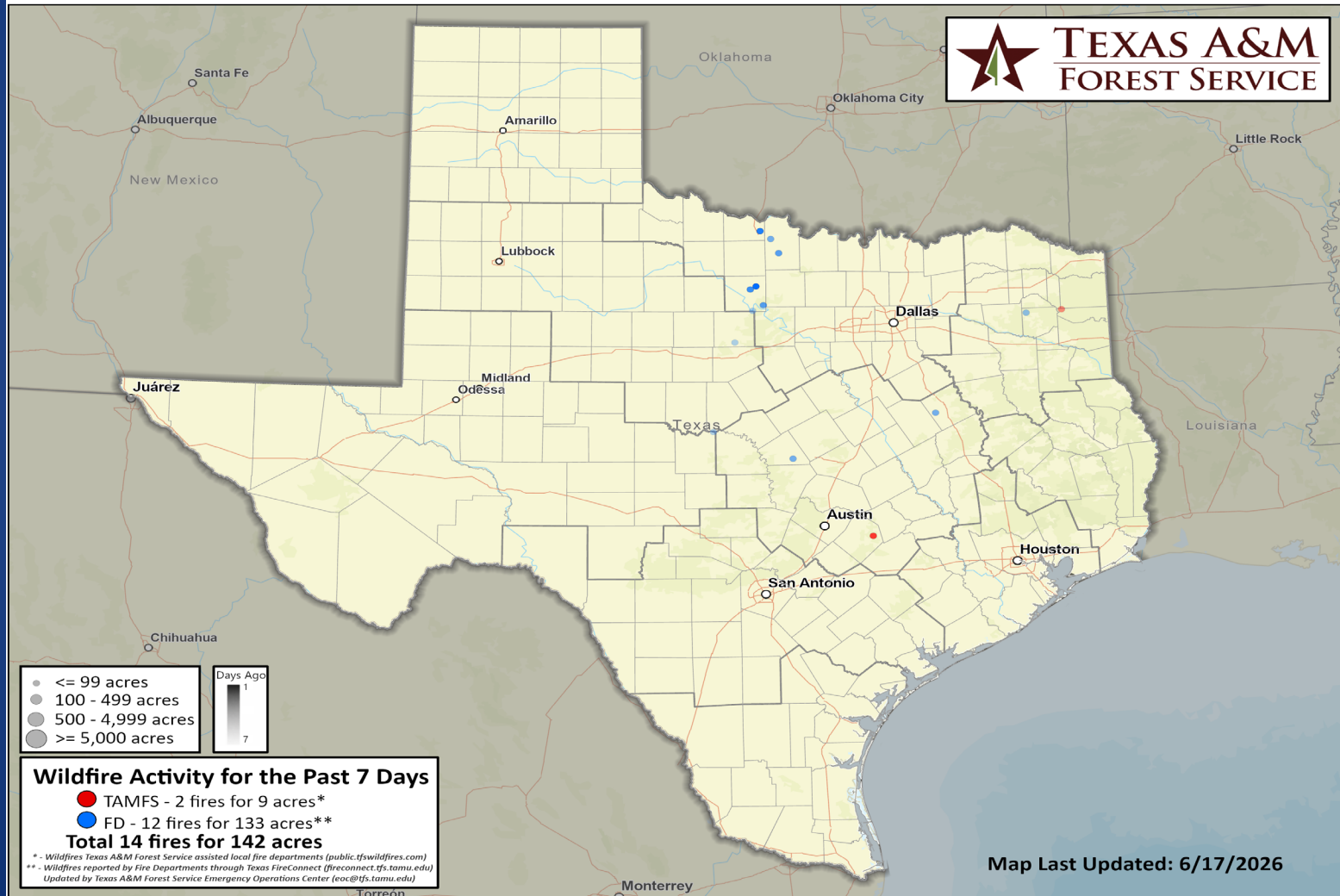
