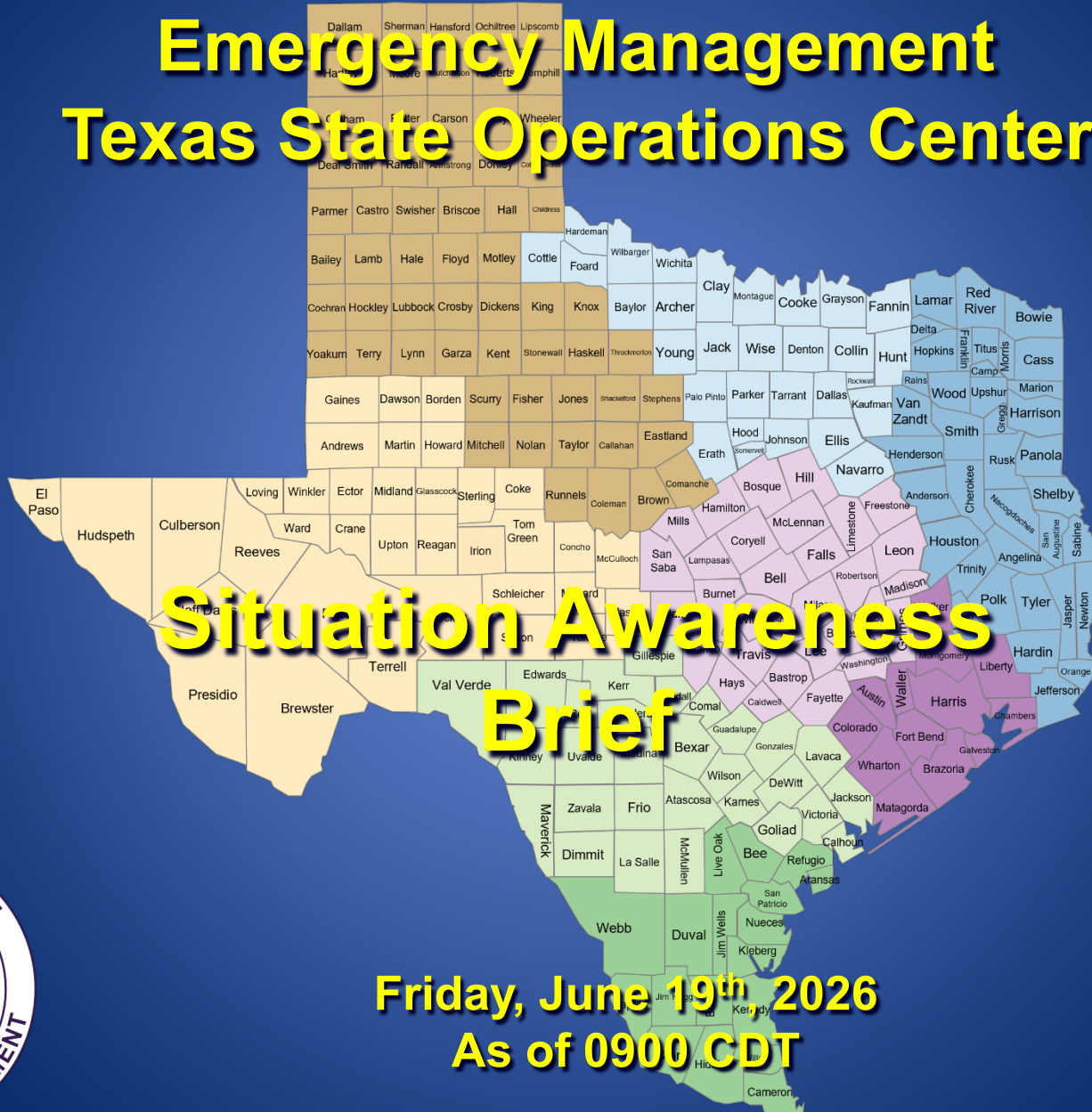

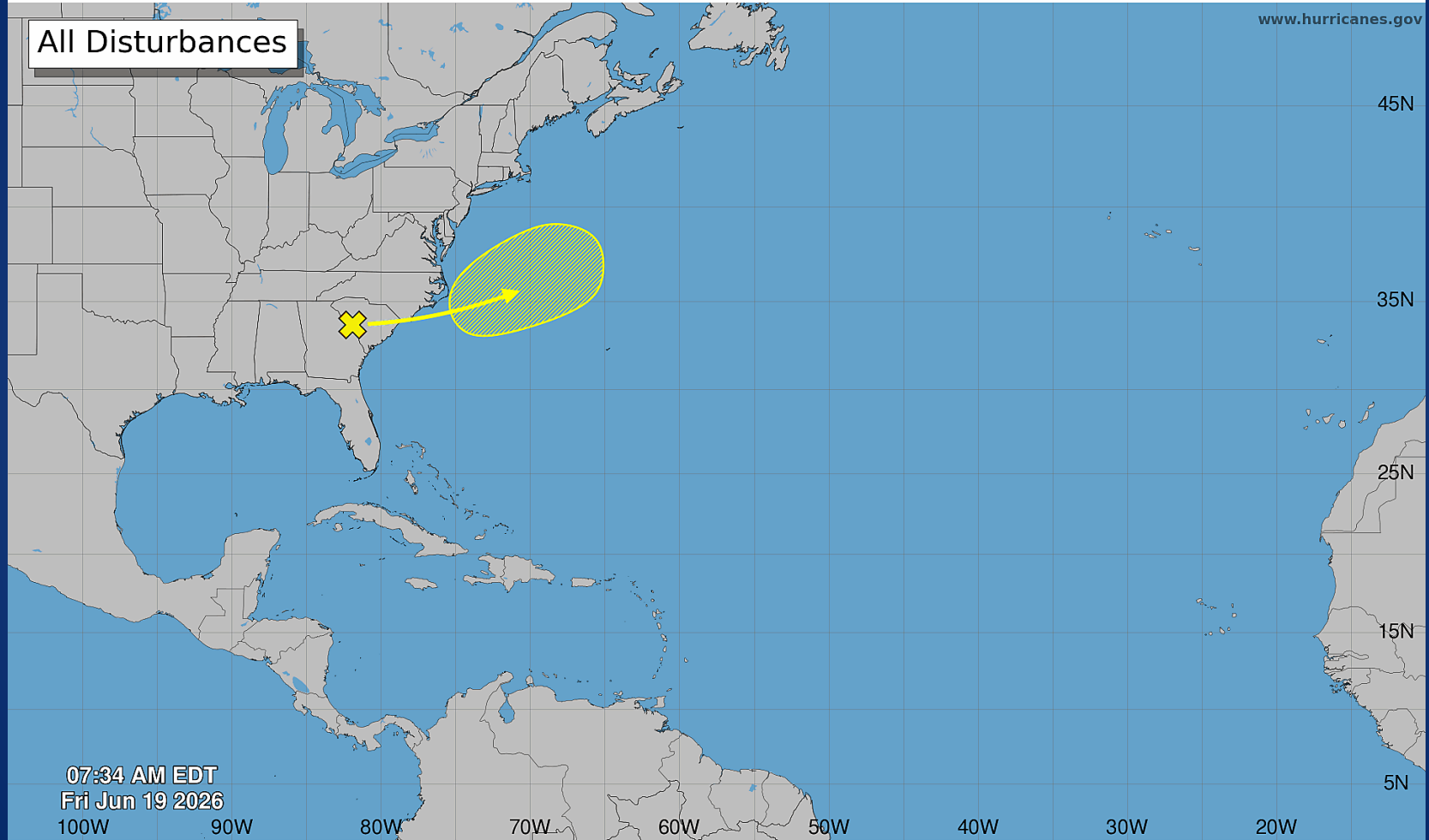
Seven-Day Graphical Tropical Weather Outlook

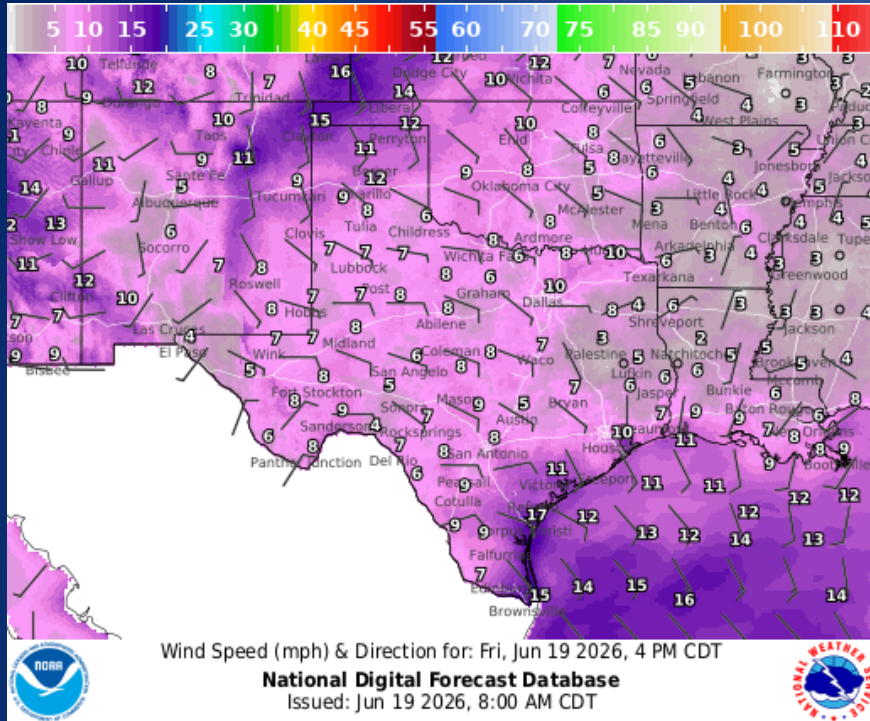

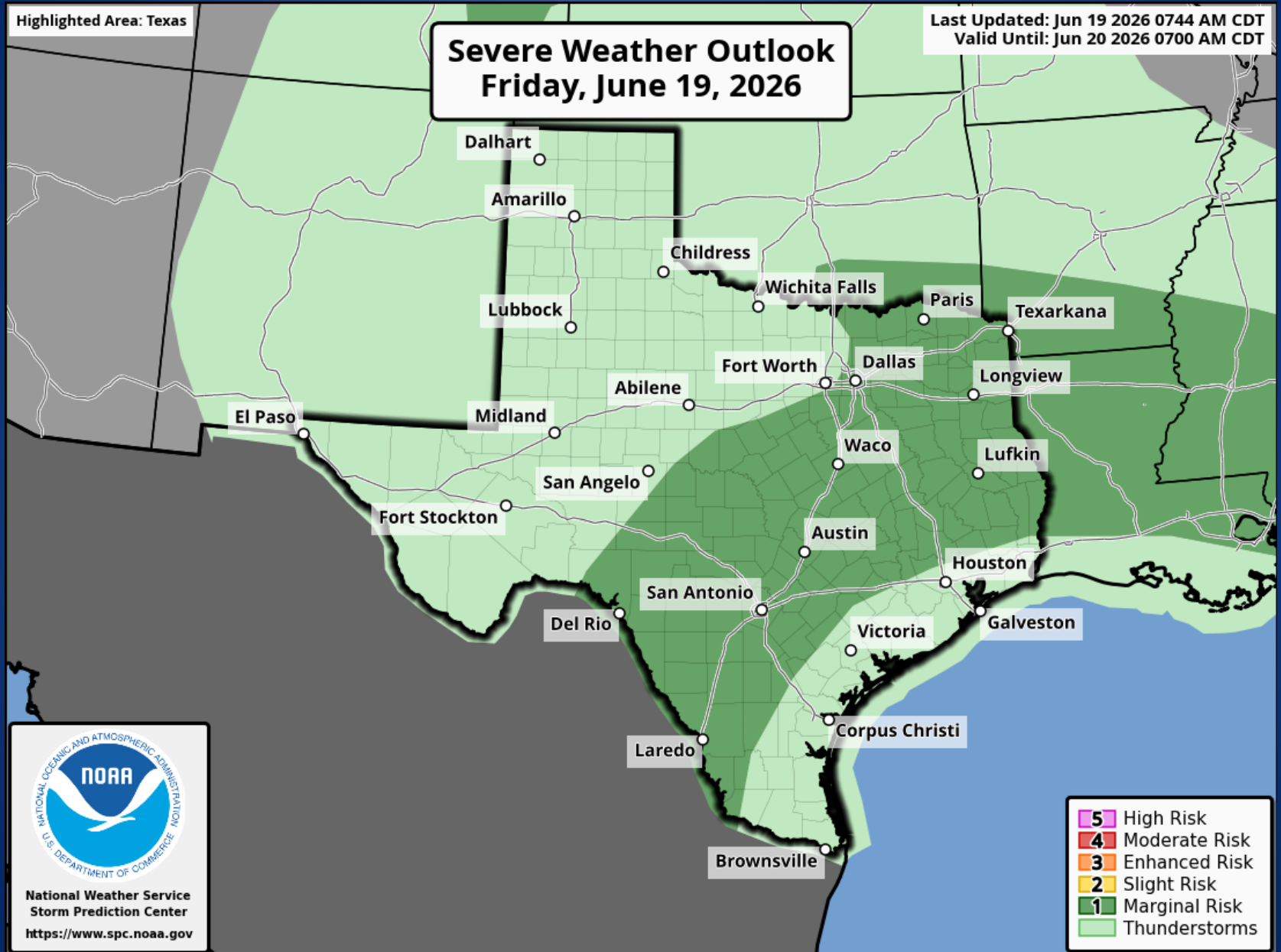

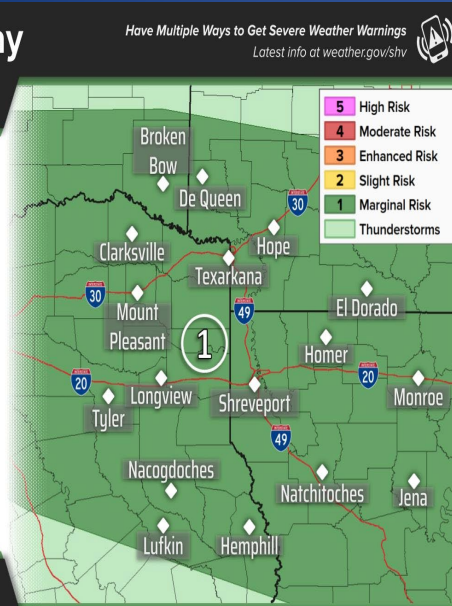

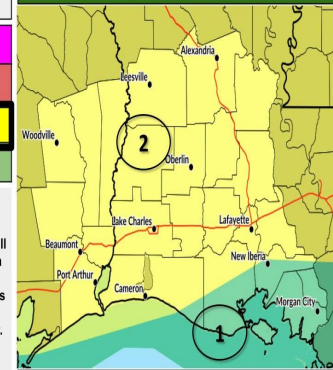

A weak upper level disturbance will interact with a stalling front and a very moist air mass to produce showers and storms, first later this afternoon/tonight and again through the first half of tomorrow. Torrential downpours will be possible with the showers and thunderstorms that develop. There will be the potential for high rainfall rates in a short period of time bringing about a risk for localized excessive rainfall and flash flooding.

There is a Slight Risk (Level 2 of 4) of excessive rainfall nearly area-wide today, as a stalling front and upper level disturbance will work together to produce more showers and storms this afternoon into tonight. Tomorrow, there is a Slight Risk (level 2 of 4) across roughly the northern half of the region, with a Marginal Risk (level 1 of 4) everywhere else.

In addition to the heat expected today we do have a risk for excessive rainfall today into this evening. Considerable uncertainty exists with on how this scenario unfolds but we could see multiple storm clusters develop and move into our area. Stay weather aware.



Edwards Plateau + Hill Country
Beginning in the **Early Morning** and continuing through the **Evening**

I-35 Corridor + Coastal Plains
Beginning in the early afternoon and continuing through the **Evening**. Isolated to scattered storms could return mainly during the daytime hours Saturday.



Locally heavy rainfall of 1 to 3 inches with higher amounts possible mainly in the Edwards Plateau and Hill Country may cause some flooding.

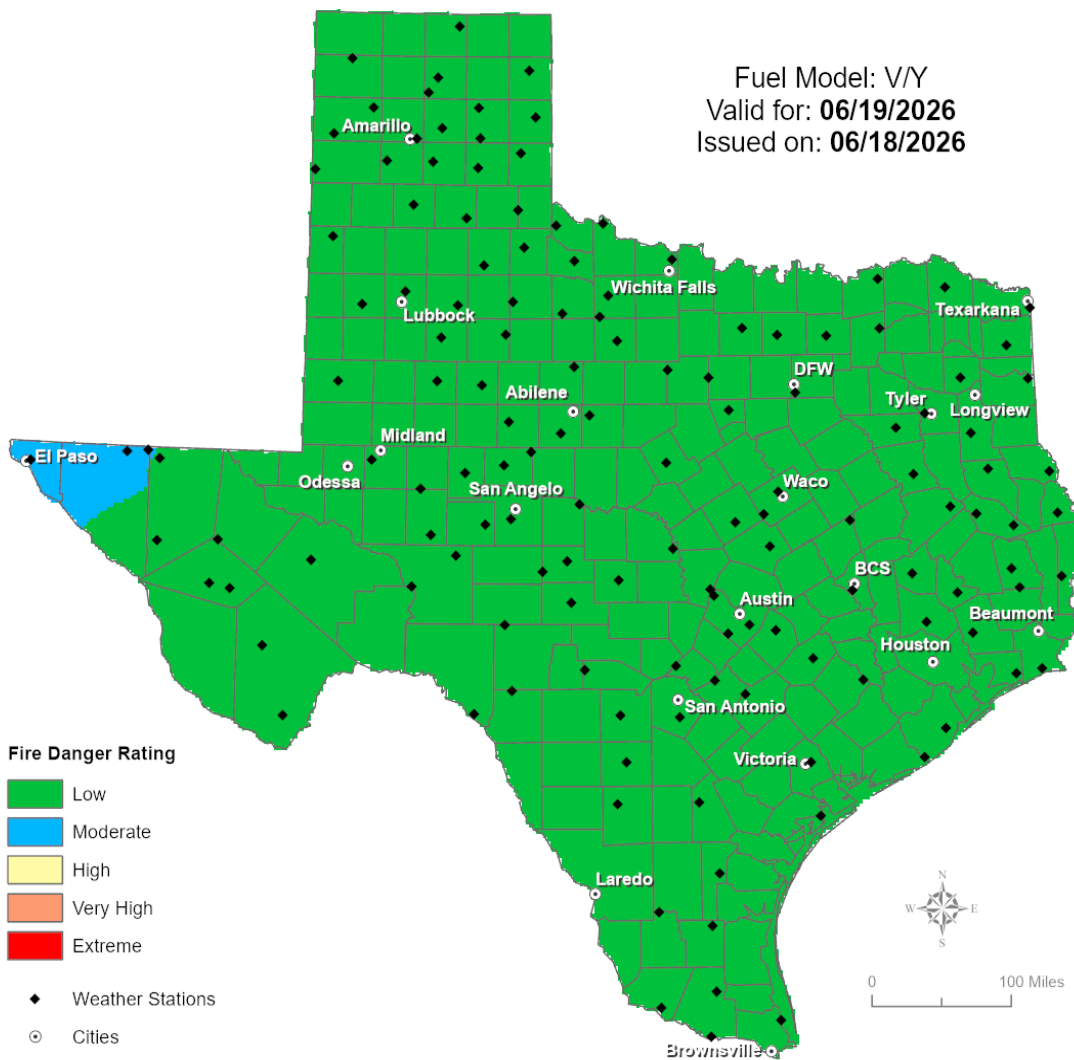

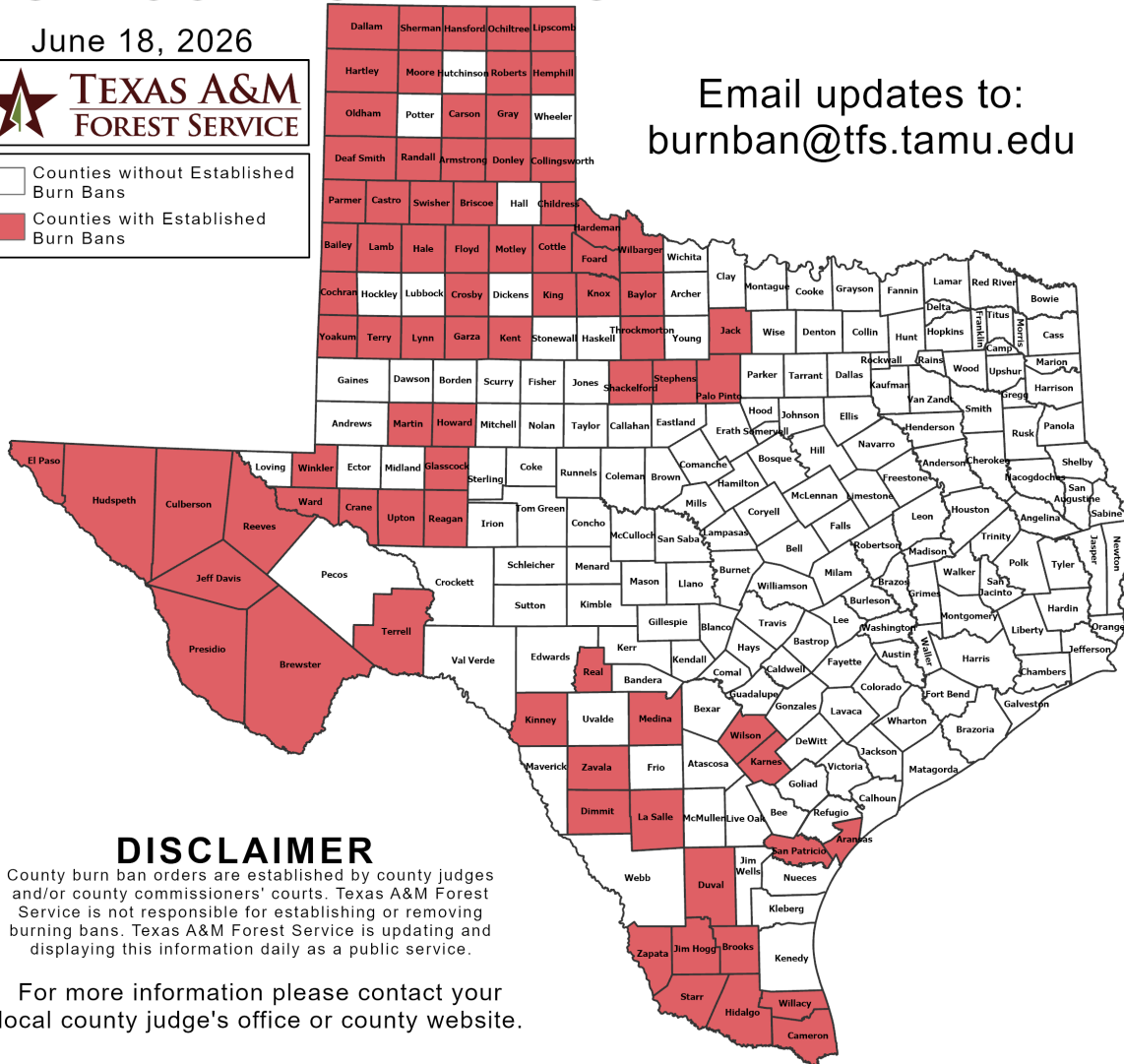

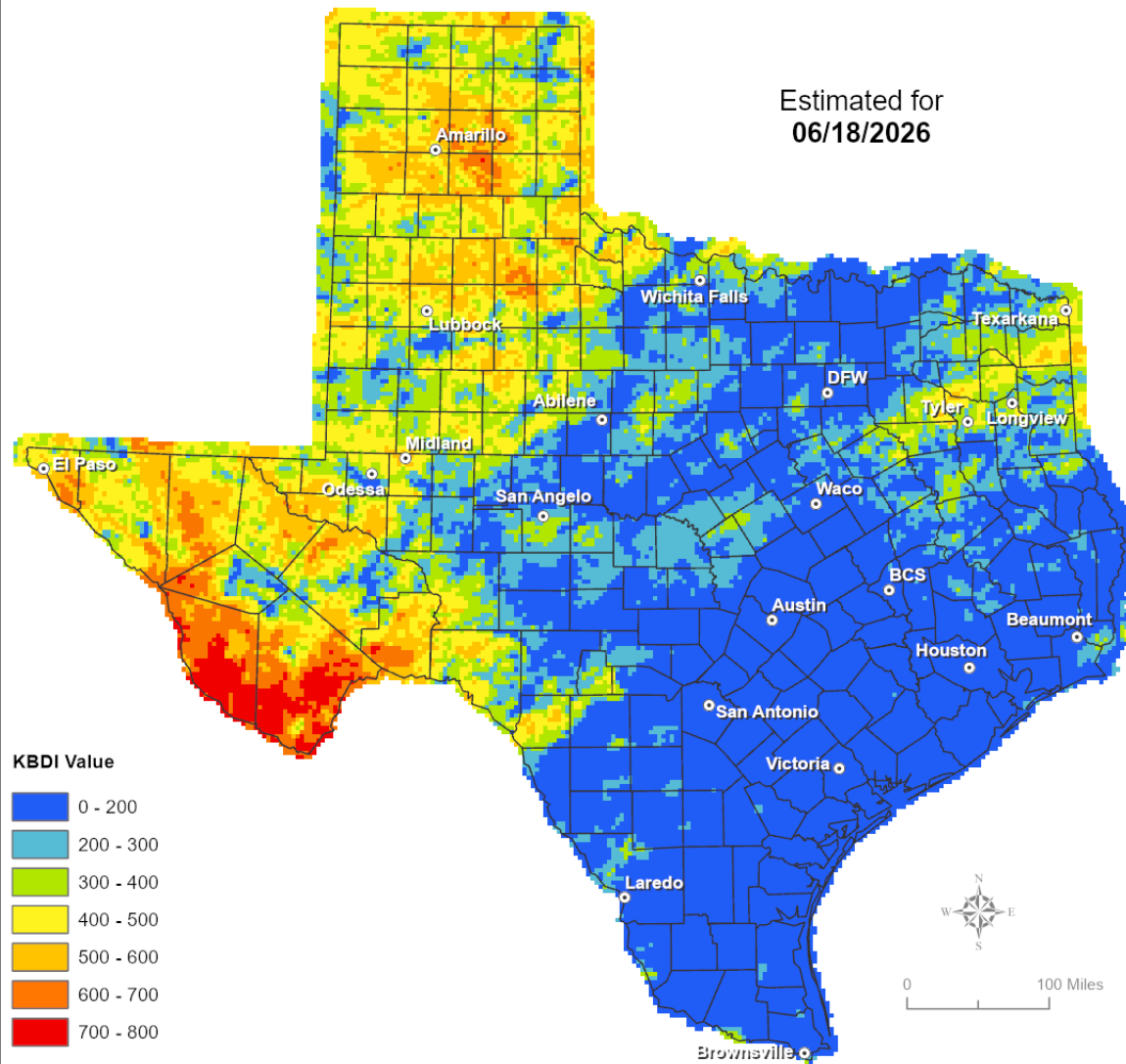

Keetch-Byram Drought Index

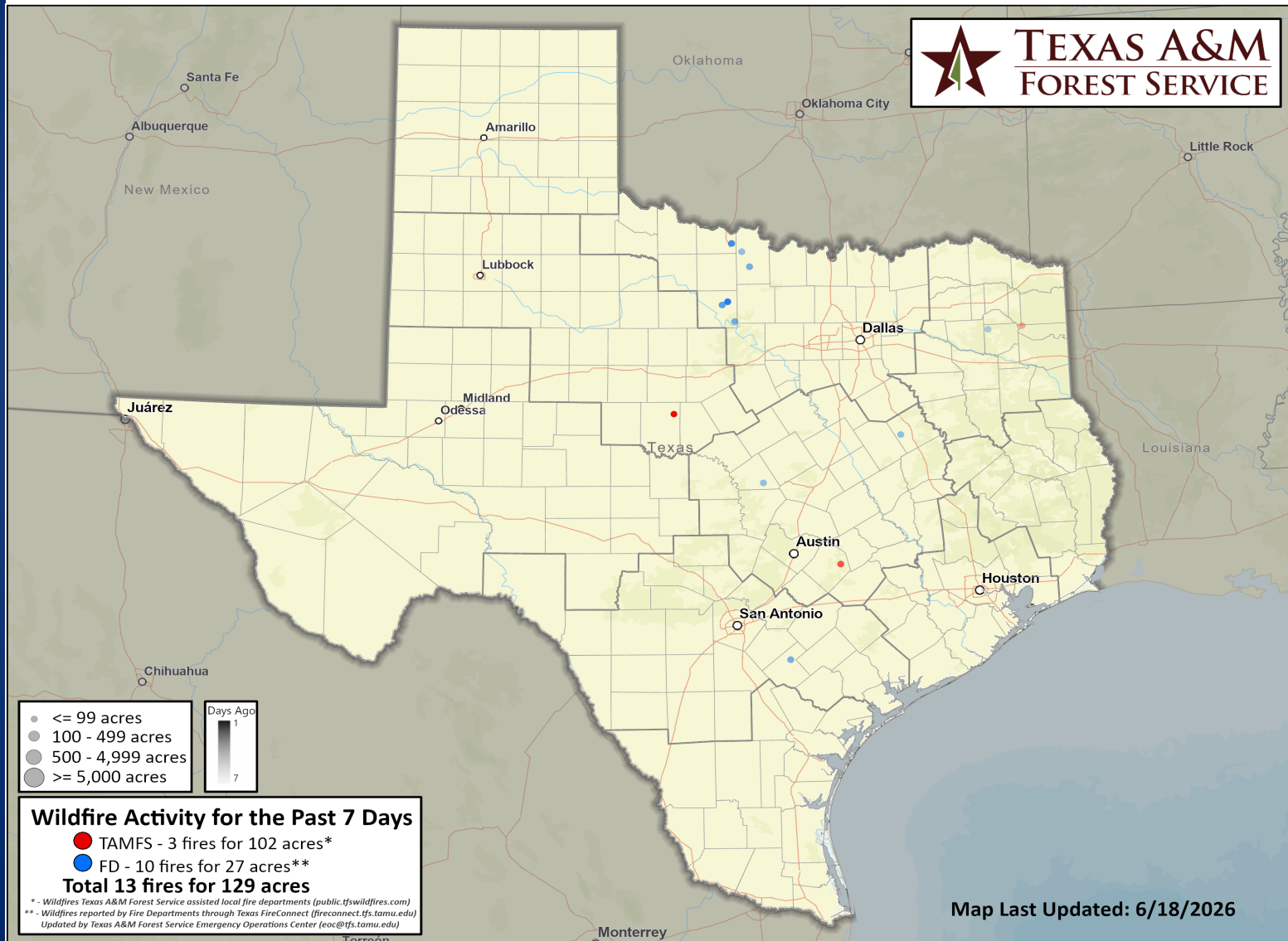
Keetch-Byram Drought Index
