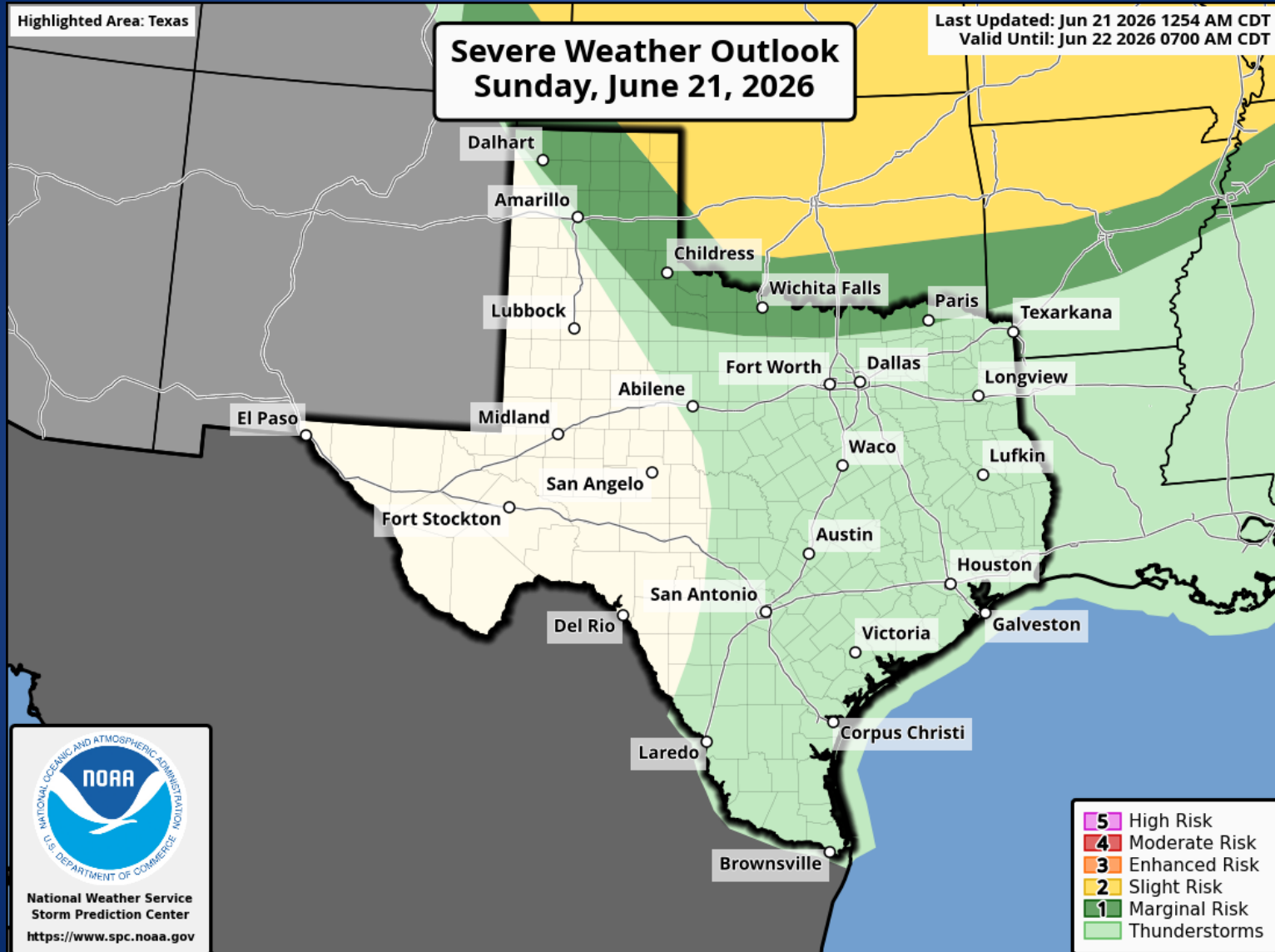

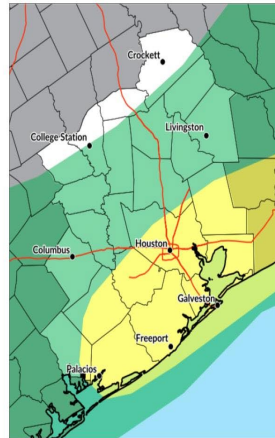

Frequent lightning and gusty winds. **Actions:** Have multiple ways to receive warnings! Remain weather-aware and check the forecast for updates!

A Marginal Risk for severe thunderstorms exists late tonight for Southeast Oklahoma and the northern sections of Southwest Arkansas, as a complex of showers and thunderstorms shifts south and weakens as it approaches the northern sections of the region. Gusty winds and brief heavy rainfall will be the main threats.

We will have a lingering threat for excessive rainfall today. A lot of rain has fallen overnight in the northern Coastal Plains and any additional isolated showers and storms that occur today could lead to additional flooding.

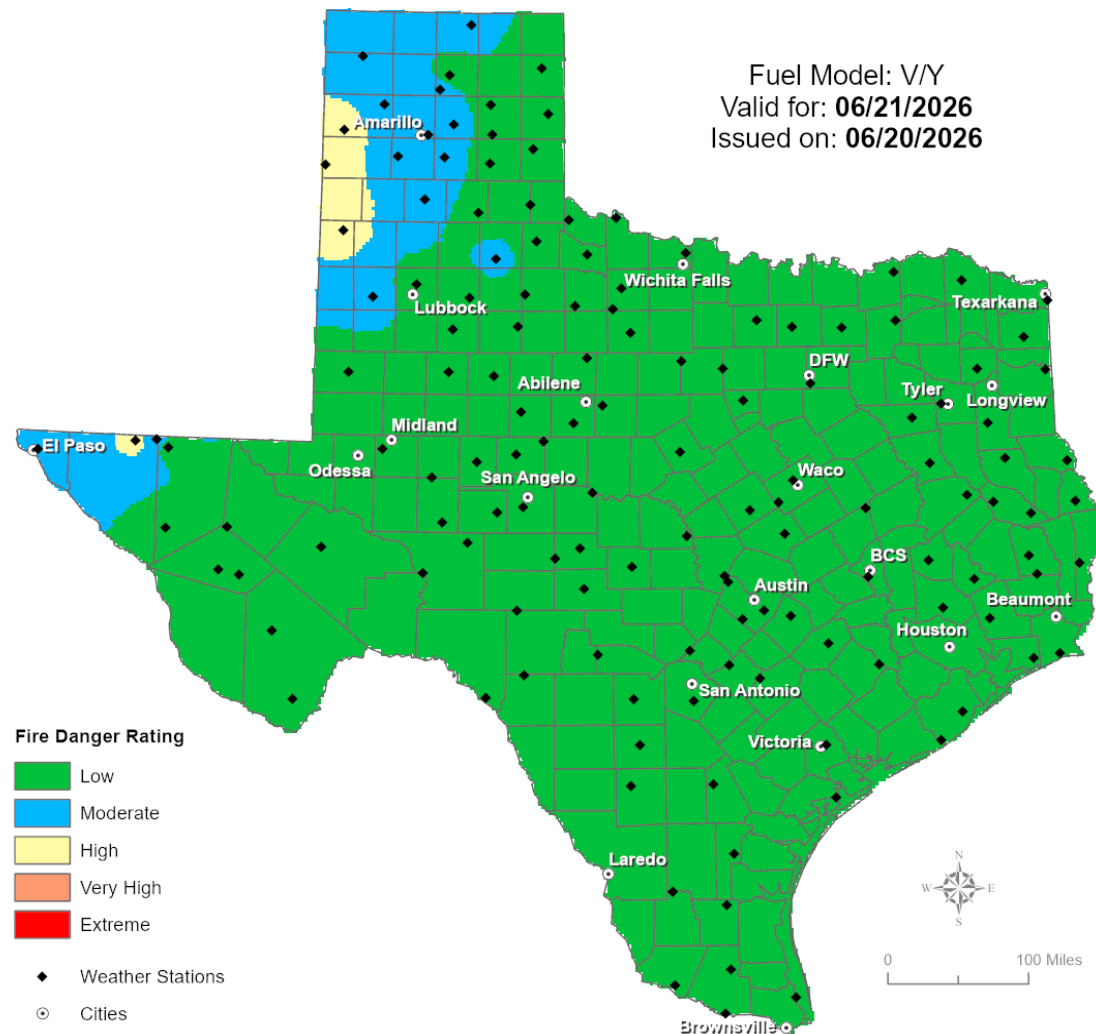

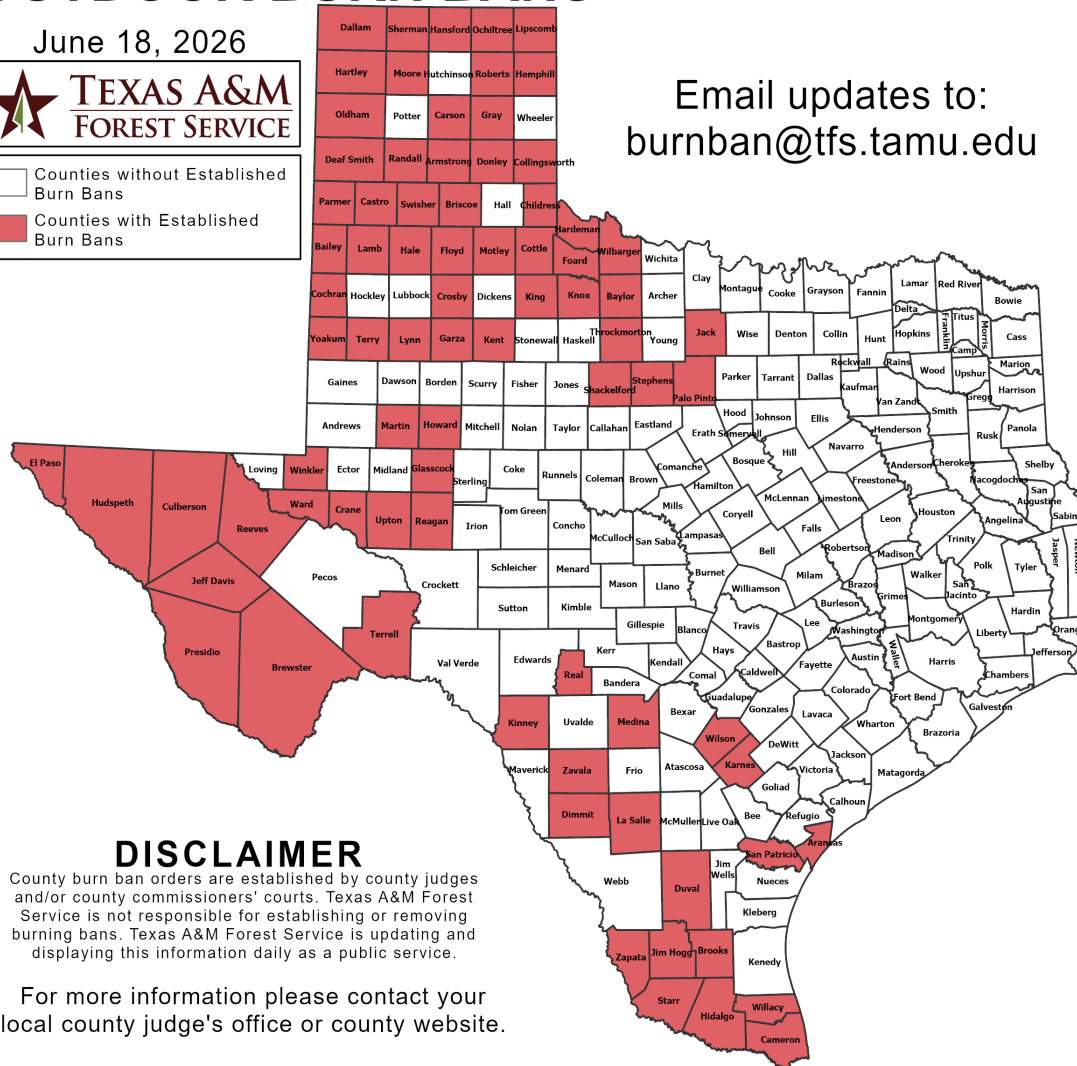

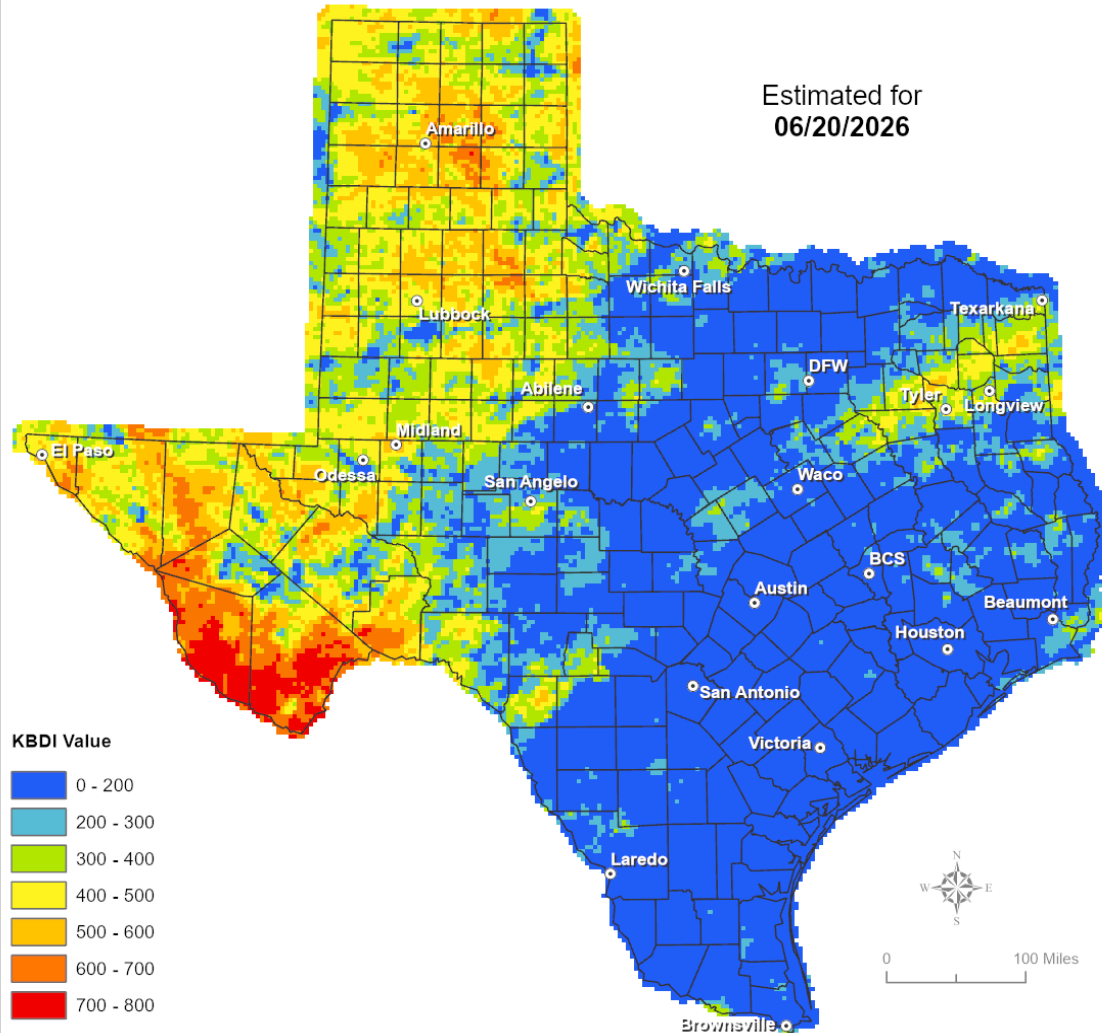

Keetch-Byram Drought Index

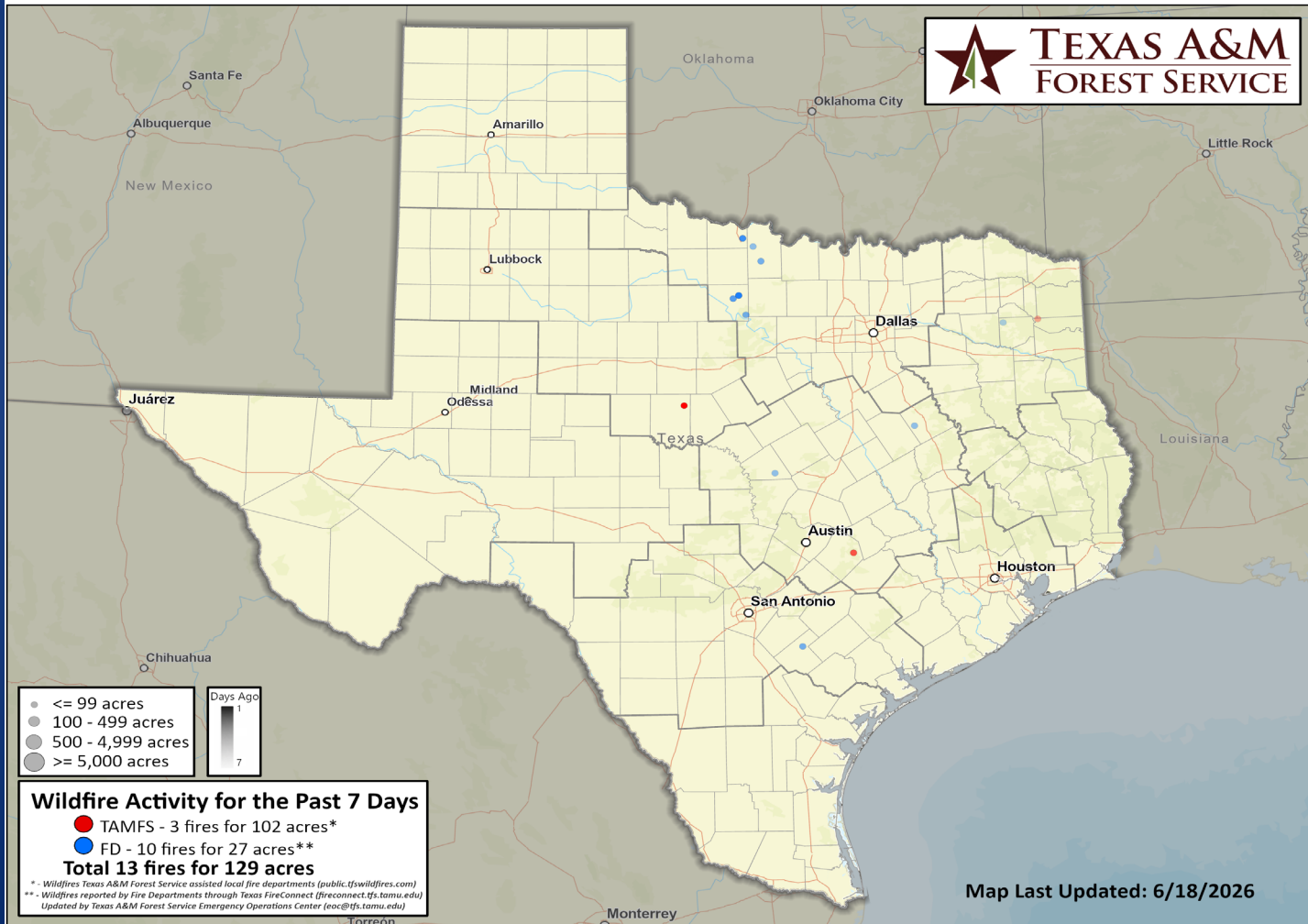
